including edibles and beverages infused with delta-9, delta-8, or other tetrahy-drocannabinol isomers derived from delta-9 tetrahydrocannabinol with a con-centration of not more than 0.3 percent on a dry weight is hereby prohibited in the City of Vadnais Heights until such time as this interim ordinance expires or is terminated by action of the City Council.
