ORDINANCE SUMMARY ORDINANCE NO. 981

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS 50, 90, 110, 111, 116 AND 118 OF THE MOUNDS VIEW MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING EXPIRATION DATES FOR CITY-ISSUED LICENSES

On November 8, 2021, the City Council adopted Ordinance 981, "An Ordinance Amending Chapters 50, 90, 110, 111, 116 and 118 of the Mounds View Municipal Code Regarding Expiration Dates for City-Issued Licenses", which amends the expiration date for city-issued business licenses from June 30 to December 31. The business licenses affected by the ordinance are hauling licenses, kennel licenses, liquor licenses, restaurant licenses, bowling alley licenses, adult establishment licenses, and tobacco licenses.

ORDINANCE SUMMARY ORDINANCE NO. 982

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TITLE III, CHAPTER 37, SECTION 37.060(B) AND TITLE IX, CHAPTER 92, SECTION 92.999 OF THE MOUNDS VIEW MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND PARKS AND RECREATION

On November 8, 2021, the City Council adopted Ordinance 982, An Ordinance Amending Title III, Chapter 37, Section 37.060(B) and Title IX, Chapter 92, Section 92.999 regarding Public Improvements and Parks and Recreation. The ordinance provides the City Council with flexibility when levying special assessments for public improvement projects by removing the rigid dollar amounts and percentages that were previously used to calculate assessments and replacing those with maximum percentages, subject to statutory limitations. The ordinance also removes verbiage stating that petty misdemeanor violations of Section 92.007(O) are subject to the city's fee schedule.

ON THE REISSUANCE OF THE HEALTHCARE AND HOUSING FACILITIES REVENUE REFUNDING NOTE (CATHOLIC ELDERCARE PROJECT), SERIES 2014C, ISSUED BY THE CITY OF MOUNDS VIEW FOR THE BENEFIT OF CATHOLIC ELDERCARE OR ITS AFFILIATES

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council (the "City Council") of the City of Mounds View, Minnesota (the "City") will hold a public hearing on Monday, December 6, 2021, at or after 6:00 p.m., at City Hall, located at 2401 Mounds View Boulevard in the City, to consider amendments to the City's Healthcare and Housing Facilities Revenue Refunding Note (Catholic ElderCare Project), Series 2014C (the "Series 2014C Note"), issued by the City on December 18, 2014, in the original aggregate principal amount of \$4,000,000, for the benefit of Catholic ElderCare, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation (the "Borrower"). The Series 2014C Note was issued in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 462C, as amended, and Sections 469.152 through

469.165, as amended.

The proceeds of the Series 2014C Note were loaned to the Borrower and used to refinance all or a portion of the following facilities located in the City of Minneapolis (collectively, the "2014 Project"): (i) a 71-unit assisted living facility located at 2919 Randolph Street NE (commonly known as RiverVillage East) owned by Catholic ElderCare Community Services Corporation II, a Minnesota nonprofit corporation and an affiliate of the Borrower; (ii) a 150-bed skilled nursing facility located at 817 Main Street NE (commonly known as Catholic ElderCare on Main) owned by the Borrower; and (iii) a 51-unit assisted living multifamily rental housing facility located at 909 Main Street NE (commonly known as MainStreet Lodge) owned by the Borrower.

The proposed amendments include but are not limited to adjustments to the interest rate calculation and the reamortization of the Series 2014C Note. Such amendments will cause a reissuance of the Series 2014C Note for tax purposes pursuant to Section 1.1001-3 of the Treasury Regulations promulgated under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended; therefore, for tax purposes, the Series 2014C Note will be treated as if it will be refunded on the effective date of the amendments to the Series 2014C Note. After the public hearing, the City Council will consider a resolution approving the amendments to the Series 2014C Note. The Series 2014C Note will continue to be a special, limited obligation of the City payable solely from the revenues expressly pledged to the payment thereof, will not constitute a general or moral obligation of the City, and will not be secured by the taxing power of the City or any assets or property of the City except interests in the 2014 Project that were granted to the City in conjunction with the original financing.

All interested persons may appear and be heard at the time and place set forth above. In addition, interested persons may direct any questions or file written comments respecting the pro-posed amendments with the City Administrator, at or prior to said public hearing.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the City Council of the City of Shoreview, Minnesota will meet on Monday, December 20, 2021, at 7:00pm at the City Council Chamber, 4600 Victoria Street North, in said City for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on (i) the intention to issue general obligation street reconstruction plan bonds in an amount not to exceed \$2,600,000 (the "Bonds") and (ii) the proposal to adopt a street reconstruction plan therefore (the "Plan"). A copy of the Plan is available for examination at the City offices.

All persons interested may appear and be heard at the time and place set forth above, or may file written comments with the Finance Director prior to the date of the hearing, which written comments will be considered at the hearing.

If a petition requesting a vote on the issuance of the Bonds is signed by voters equal to five percent of the votes cast in the City in the last general election and is filed with the City within thirty 30 after the public hearing, the City may issue the Bonds only after obtaining the approval of the majority of the voters voting on the question of issuing the Bonds..
