## CITY OF SHOREVIEW

ORDINANCE 980 AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SHOREVIEW, MINNESOTA, AMENDING SECTION 709, PEDDLERS

The Shoreview City Council ordains that Section 709 of the Shoreview Municipal Code is amended to read as follows: 709 <u>Peddlers</u>

709.010 <u>Definition</u>. As used in this Chapter, the following terms shall mean:

(A) "Peddler" shall mean an individual traveling from place to place within the City, by whatever means of transportation, for the purpose of selling, offering for sale or taking orders for the sale of goods or services, of whatever kind, for present or future delivery including any person who utilizes or occupies any permanent or temporary building, structure or portions thereof, within the City, for the purpose of sales, exhibiting samples or taking orders for future deliverv.

(B) "Solicitor" shall mean an individual traveling from place to place within the City, by whatever means of transportation, for the purpose of approaching another in their home to make a request for a donation of money or services.

**709.020** <u>Permit Exemptions</u>. The permit provisions of this Chapter shall not apply to the following individuals but such individuals shall register with the City Manager as hereinafter provided:

 (A) Sales made to dealer or permanent merchants by commercial travelers selling in the usual course of business;

(B) Sheriffs, constables, bona fide assignees, receivers or trustees in bankruptcy or other public officers selling goods, wares and merchandise according to law;

(C) Bona fide residents of the State selling fruits, vegetables, dressed meats, fowl or other farm products which were produced on land within the State under the ownership or control of the vendor provided that such sales occur only in areas permitted by the City's Development Regulations and only if such sales can be conducted without creating traffic hazards; (D) Sales made by bona fide non-profit organizations registered within the State of Minnesota, or solicitations made by individuals or organiza-

tions. **709.030 Registration Required**. Any peddler or solicitor who is exempt from the permit requirements shall register with the City Manager. Registration shall be made on forms provided by the City Manager and no registration fee shall be required. Upon completion of the registration form, the City Manager shall issue a Certificate of Registration to the applicant. Certificates of Registration shall be non-transferable.

**709.040** <u>**Permit Required.**</u> It shall be unlawful for any person to engage in business as a peddler/solicitor without first obtaining a permit from the City Manager.

(A) <u>Application</u>. Applications shall be verified and shall be submitted on forms provided by the City Manager which shall include the following:

 The name of the applicant:

(2) The permanent home address and full local address of the applicant;

(3) A brief description of the nature of the business and the goods to be sold;

(4) If employed, the name and address of the employer, together with credentials establishing the exact relationship;
 (5) The place where the goods proposed to be sold are manu-

factured, stored, and the manner in which such goods shall be delivered to the

(6) A statement as to whether the applicant has been charged with a misdemeanor, gross misdemeanor, or felony violation of a municipal ordinance, state statute, or federal law; the nature of the offense; the date of the offense; and the status of the proceeding;

(7) A description of any vehicle which applicant will use while engaged in the business of a peddler within the City;

(8) When application is filed, the applicant shall provide photographic proof of an application in the form of a Minnesota Driver's License or other photo identification acceptable to the City Manager.
 (9) Such other relevant information as may be required by the

City Manager. (B) <u>Procedure</u>. Upon receipt of the completed application form, the receipt of the permit fee, and a completed background check of the applicant,

the City Manager shall act on the approval or denial of the permit within five (5) business days and shall notify the applicant of such decision. If the application is approved, a permit shall be issued. The application may be denied for the following reasons: (1) The failure of the applicant to truthfully provide any of the in-

formation requested by the City as part of the application, or the failure to sign the application, or the failure to pay the required fee at the time of application.

(2) The conviction of the applicant within the past five (5) years from the date of application, for any violation of any federal or state statute or regulation, or of any local ordinance, which adversely reflects on the person's ability to conduct the business for which a permit is being sought in an honest and legal manner or that will not adversely affect the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City. Such violations shall include but not be limited to: burglary, theft, larceny, swindling, fraud, unlawful business practices, and any form of actual or threatened physical harm against another person.

(3) The revocation within the past five (5) years of any permit or license issued to the applicant for the purpose of conducting business as a peddler.

(4) The applicant is determined to have a bad business reputation, evidence of a bad business reputation shall include but not be limited to the existence of more than two (2) complaints against the applicant with the Better Business Bureau, the Attorney General's Office or other similar business consumer rights office or agency, within the preceding twelve (12) months, or five (5) such complaints against the applicant within the preceding five (5) years.

(C) <u>Permit Fee</u>. A fee, in an amount to be determined from time to time by City Council resolution, shall be paid when the application is submitted.

(D) <u>Record</u>. The City Manager shall keep records of all permits issued under this Chapter.

(E)  $\underline{\text{Display.}}$  Every peddler shall display the City-issued permit upon the request of any person.

(F) <u>Duration</u>. Every permit issued under the provisions of this Chapter shall be valid for the period of time stated therein but in no event shall any such permit be issued for a period of time in excess of sixty (60) days.

(G) <u>Revocation</u>. Any permit issued under this section may be revoked at the discretion of the City Manager for violation of any of the following:

 (1) Fraud, misrepresentation or incorrect statements on the application form.

(2) Fraud, misrepresentation or false statement made during the course of the permitted activity.

(3) Conviction of any offense for which granting a permit could

have been denied.

(4) Violation of any provision of this Chapter.
 709.050 <u>Prohibited Activities</u>. No peddler shall conduct business in

any of the following manners: (A) <u>Entrance to Premises Restricted</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to enter upon any private premises when such premises are posted with a sign stated "No Peddlers Allowed" or "No Solicitation Allowed" or other words to such effect.

(B) <u>Refusing to Leave</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to enter upon premises owned, leased or rented by another and refuse to leave such premises after having been notified by such owner or occupant to leave.

(C) <u>Misrepresentation</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to make false or fraudulent statements concerning the quality of the goods or services which are being offered for sale.

(D) Hours of Operation. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to engage in the business of peddling or soliciting within the City between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 9:00 a.m. the following morning, or at any time on Sundays, except by specific appointment with or invitation from the prospective customer.

(E) <u>Use of Audio Devices</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to call attention to their activity by means of blowing a horn or whistle, by ringing any bell, by crying out, or by making any other noise in an unreasonable manner.
(F) <u>Obstructing Traffic</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or so-

licitor to obstruct the free flow of either vehicular or pedestrian traffic on any street, alley, sidewalk, or other public right-of-way.

(G) <u>Safety Hazard</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to conduct business in such a way as to create a threat to the health, safety and welfare of any individual or general public.

(H) Proof of Permit. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to fail to provide proof of permit or registration and identification when requested; or to use the permit or registration of another person.

(I) <u>False Statements</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to make false or misleading statements about the product or services being sold, including untrue statements of endorsement. No peddler or solicitor shall claim to have the endorsement of any City solely based on the City having issued a permit or Certificate of Registration to that person.

(J) <u>Harassment</u>. It shall be unlawful for any peddler or solicitor to remain on property of another when requested to leave, or to otherwise conduct business in a manner a reasonable person would find obscene, threatening, intimidating or abusive.

709.055 <u>Candidates for Public Office</u>. Candidates for public office are exempt from the provisions of this Chapter.

**709.060** Severability. If any part or provision of this Chapter or the application thereof to any person, entity, or circumstances shall be adjudged unconstitutional or invalid by any Court of competent jurisdiction, such judgment shall be confined in its operation to the part of the provision or application which is directly involved in the controversy in which such judgment shall have been rendered, and shall not affect or impair the validity of the remainder of this Chapter or the application thereof to the other persons, entities or circumstances.

**709.070** <u>Misdemeanor</u>. Any violation of this Chapter shall be a misdemeanor. Each day on which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense.

MOUNDS VIEW PUBLIC SCHOOLS MOUNDS VIEW SCHOOL BOARD MEETING SUMMARY, MAY 12, 2020

Meetings take place at the District Center in Shoreview (4570 Victoria Street N).

Termination of probationary staff Due to decreases/changes in enrollment, elimination of positions, uncertainty of funding, lack of funds, performance or return from leave of senior teachers, the Board voted to terminate one probationary teacher. Final placement of certified staff on unrequested leave

At the April 14 meeting, the Board approved a proposal to place a number of certified staff on unrequested leave of absence for the 2020-21 school year. Since that meeting, one of the teachers or learning resource teachers who were included in the proposal requested a hearing. Failure to request a hearing is deemed acquiescence to the proposed action; therefore three learning resource teachers were placed on unrequested leave of absence.

Approval of transportation service agreements

Executive director of administrative services Carole Nielsen reported that the District has established transportation service agreements with multiple service providers. The Board voted to approve the student transportation type III service agreements with R and D Transportation, Twin City Transportation, Safe-Tree Transportation and United Transportation Services, LLC for two contract years commencing on August 1, 2020, and ending July 31, 2022, with an option to extend for an additional two one-year contract years. **2019-20 District Operational Plan update** 

Superintendent Lennox provided Board members with an update on the 2019-20 District Operational Plan (DOP). Lennox noted that with the COVID-19 pandemic, the DOP had been updated to remove three goals that were unable to be met due to the pandemic and that one goal had been added as the District had to move to distance learning. The Board voted to approve the 2019-20 District Operational Plan as amended. **Updates**
