Leeward was born into a dairy farm life and as he got older could not wait to get home from school to work his parents' farm. He used to sing as a boy while driving tractor and his mother could hear him

from the house—a definite sign he was in his happy place! Farm work was Leeward's favorite pastime.

Leeward graduated high school at St. Mary's Academy in Champlain, N.Y., and received an Associate degree at Cornell

Leeward was a loving husband, father, grandfather, greatgrandfather, and family member. He is survived by two sisters, Rita Rae (Walter, predeceased) Laurin, and Audrey Falcon

(Richard, predeceased). Leeward is also survived by his wife, Eunice Babbie and his four children, D. Lee Ledesma, David (Karen) Babbie, Sheila Babbie, and Todd Babbie. Leeward is likewise survived by his grandchildren Alexandria Ledesma Doiron (Chip), Eric Babbie, Jonathan Babbie (Erica), and Taylor Miner. From 1961 through 2001, Leeward owned and operated Hill-Lee Acres dairy farm in Peru where he started with 12 cows and 180 acres and sold it with 420 cows and 800 acres. During those same years, from 1962 through 1995, Leeward also drove school bus for the Peru Central School District.

Leeward was a member and leader in 4-H from 1948 through 1985 and also served as Chairman of the Clinton County 4-H Committee. He was a member and delegate for Dairylea and Eastern Milk Producers and Dairy Farmers of America. Leeward was a member and delegate of Agway Inc. and a member and chairman of the Peru Agway Store Committee. Leeward was similarly a member of the National Ayrshire committee and received an award for the highest producing Ayrshire herd in the

In 1972 Leeward was a Town of Peru Assessor for four years and after that was a member of the Town of Peru Assessment Review Board for eight years.

It was Leeward's dream of sharing North Country history, as well as his extensive collection of rural and farm equipment and antiques, which led him to decide to open a museum. In 2010, Leeward, along with his nephew, Rick Laurin, and many other family members and volunteers, opened the Babbie Rural and Farm Learning Museum, which is chartered by the New York State Board of Regents and showcases rural and farm life from the mid-1800s to the mid-1900s. The museum was a culmination of years collecting tractors, farm equipment and all types of rural and farm antiques. Leeward was always on hand at the Babbie Museum to highlight the indoor and outdoor exhibits linked to the family's rural and farming past and loved the idea of teaching school children how life was lived in the "olden days."

Dr. Robert Buran

June 30, 1927 - September 18, 2025



PLATTSBURGH —It is with deep sadness that we announce the death of Robert (Bob) T. Buran, MD, FARC, who passed away peacefully in his sleep in the morning of Sept. 18, 2025, at the age of 98. Bob died in his own bed, and in his own house - for which we are happy - with the love of his four sons, of the many persons who lovingly cared him, and of his many, many friends.

Bob was born and raised in Endicott, N.Y., where he graduated from Union Endicott High School in 1945. It was in high school where he

learned to play Clarinet (he never had private lessons), playing his favorite music - Swing! - as part of multiple combos that played paid gigs. It was at one of these gigs that he was introduced to Arlene, his beloved wife. They fell in love and were married in 1952 at St. Ambrose Church in Endicott, N.Y.

After graduating from high school, Bob served his country enlisting in the U.S. Navy as a Seaman First Class. He studied radar repair and had 1.5 years of electrical engineering training.

After being honorably discharged in 1946, Bob attended Syracuse University as an undergraduate for three years. In 1949, he entered medical school, also at Syracuse University, as part of a combined program for which the first year counted towards both his undergraduate degree as well as his first year in medical school. Bob graduated from medical school Magna Cum Laude in 1953.

After a rotating internship at St. Joseph Hospital in Syracuse, and a one-year Pathology residency as SUNY Health Science Center in Syracuse, Bob had a three-year residency (1955 -1958) at Strong Memorial Hospital in Rochester, N.Y.

In 1958, Bob became Board Certified in Radiology, and moved to Plattsburgh, N.Y., with his wife, Arlene. Bob established Associates in Radiology and worked as a Radiologist first at Champlain Valley Hospital, and thereafter at CVPH Medical Center, until his retirement in 1999.

Of Bob's professional achievements, there were two (2) of which he was most proud. First, in 1965, Bob founded the CVPH School of Radiologic Technology, which has since trained untold numbers of x-ray technologists. Bob's vision of providing training for x-ray technologists in the North Country (NY) became a legacy that continues to this day.

Second, in 1986, Bob was greatly honored to have received special recognition from his peers by being awarded a Fellowship in the American College or Radiology. Fellowships to the College are awarded for significant scientific or clinical research in the field of radiology, or significant contributions to its literature. Criteria for selection include performance of outstanding service to organized medicine and an outstanding reputation among colleagues and the local community as a result of long-term superior service.

Personally, Bob loved/pursued many interests with such passion it is difficult to know what to mention first. But, undoubtedly, a first among equal interests, Bob loved both fishing and hunting - especially fishing, and especially fishing on Lake Champlain for Walleye. He loved taking many of his friends, and his sons, fishing. And, in the 1960's, during a vacation in Jamaica with Arlene and their close friends, the Harrells, Bob caught his biggest fish ever, a 9 foot Blue Marlin.

Hunting for Whitetail deer was perhaps a close second, but not only for the hunting itself, but for the wonderful times in hunting camp with close friends and sometimes his sons, enjoying wild game meals and often singing Barbershop.

Bob also loved cooking. He loved cooking for friends and family, whether never-frozen Walleye, blackened Red-fish, venison stew, or any of his untold numerous other recipes. Perhaps Bob's proudest recipe was of his Michigan sauce, which rivaled if not surpassed the greatest Michigan sauces of the best Michigan restaurants in the North Country.

But, Bob's most important legacy was the love of his family. In the 1970's, Bob's son, James, told Bob that he wanted to participate in the local Soap Box Derby race. Bob helped James that first year with James - building of his racer, and thereafter each of his other sons to build their racers to race in subsequent years. The Soap Box Derby became a family affair for years, and each of Bob's sons had success in racing.

Finally, Bob and Arlene helped teach their sons to ski, taking them skiing first to Beartown, then Paleface (in Wilmington), then to Whiteface, and later, multiple times to Vail (Arlene's favorite) and to Steamboat, both in Colorado, as well as family skiing trips to various mountains in Canada.

Skiing was another family affair, and Bob, Arlene and the fam-

ily had great times skiing with many of their friends.

Bob was predeceased by his loving wife, Arlene (2020), as well has his brother, Joseph Buran, of Endwell, N.Y., his mother, Alice Buran (nee Ostrosky), and his father, Joseph Buran, both of Endicott, N.Y.

Ĉremation took place in Florida. A Celebration of Life will be held at her home on September 20th.


