managed. However, the nodules they found in his lungs shortly after did pose a problem.

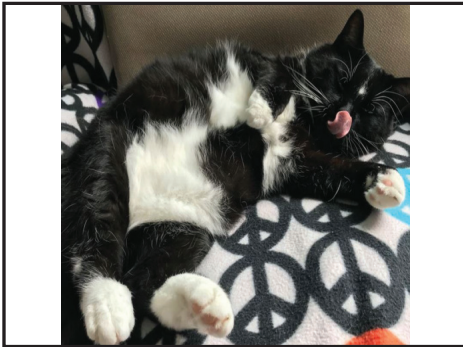
He passed at home on March 21, 2021.
