PLATTSBURGH — David James Anderson MD, 64, of Cumberland Head, passed away peacefully on Sunday, April 24, 2022, at his home under the loving care of his family and Hospice of the North Country, after an eight-month course of pancreatic cancer.

He was born in Malone on April 6, 1958, the son of Donald and Ann Anderson.

David fondly recalled his childhood amongst loving sisters Beth, Sarah, and Dora. He fostered life-long interests in basketball and music, becoming a skilled trumpet player and guitarist, and later applying his basketball prowess to coaching alongside his youngest daughter. College summers were spent as a counselor at Camp Colby, which resulted in many wonderful memories (e.g. the advent of Captain Conservation) and important friendships.

Though unconventional, David's education in philosophy and religion from Rochester University served him well as he obtained a medical degree and opened his family practice. It was during his medical education at SUNY Upstate that he met Pam, and after realizing on a trip to Santorini that she was his life partner, asked her to marry him on graduation day. They completed their medical and surgical residencies at Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia before moving back to the North Country to grow their family and practices in 1989.

David was both brilliant and unassuming, quietly serving his community as the "president of everything," as his kids fondly referred to him. He was a devoted and loving father of four, and partner to Pam. The life they built together, and innumerable lives he touched through his medicine, are his legacy. He did not only care for his patients, he cared for their families, and they sing his praises. These are the only accolades he ever desired.

Left to cherish his memory is his "Big Fam;" his wife of 37 years, Pamela Reinhardt, as well as his children; Ian and his wife Taylor and daughter Audrey, with another daughter expected in June; Eliza and her husband Colin, with a son expected in June; Devon and his partner Rebekah; and Emily and her husband Joseph.

Honoring his wishes there will be no public calling hours or services.

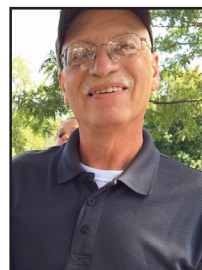

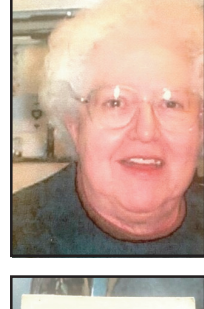

Jim joined the Press-Republican as a general-assignment reporter in 1971 after graduating from Plattsburgh State. He had also spent three years in the Navy during the Vietnam War, based at Coronado Naval Base in San Diego 1967 through 1969.

He grew up in Albany, and nearby Delmar, the son of Daniel and Juanita Dynko. He graduated from Bethlehem Central High School, though not the stellar student you'd think he'd have to be to become the editor of a daily newspaper. Yet he developed alternative talents and skills, such as imagination, creativity and a magnetic personality that would outshine a report card.

Jim attended Utica College and graduated from Hudson Valley Community College before transferring to SUNY Plattsburgh. He played baseball and was even lead singer in a band - or so he tells us! He

also developed a love of racing and was able to compete in local speedways. Jim was thrilled when the owners of Airborne Speedway gave him the opportunity to race one more time in his later years.

At the Press-Republican, he covered all levels of government and regularly produced feature stories, but his heart belonged on the police beat, where he reported on numerous crimes, fires, and trials. It was during those engagements that he became well known in the law-enforcement community. Eventually he completed training and served as a volunteer firefighter for Rescue Hose No. 5 and an emergency medical technician for the Keeseville Volunteer Fire Department.

In 1979, following a series of newsroom promotions, he succeeded Norbert Walter as editor of the P-R. He navigated the nationwide emerging newsroom transition from typewriters to computers successfully. Under his leadership, not only did the paper graduate into 21st Century technology, but circulation swelled from approximately 14,000 to 26,000. During his tenure the paper won numerous reporting awards from United Press International, The Associated Press, and the New York Newspaper Publishers Association. He had overseen the newspaper's expansion to a seven-day-a-week operation. The Sunday pa-

per, which he created, had become the flagship edition. As far as can be determined Jim spent more time as editor of the Press-Republican than anyone.

Jim was also known as "Ted" in several articles written by his best friend and colleague Bob "Bahb" Grady. The articles revolved around funny (and not so funny to him) adventures that happened to Jim and occasionally to family members as well. He was a great source for Grady's truly witty commentaries. Julie (Dynko) would hear belly laughs from her colleagues at Peru School as they recounted the trials and tribulations of poor Jim! Not many people knew who Ted was but...the secret is out!

Jim had a great interest in politics and loved to debate issues with family and friends especially his father-in-law, Nick, who was very opinionated.

In his spare time, he fought fires, saved lives, and coached youth sports. He became perhaps better known in his home community of Peru for coaching and umpiring than he was as editor of the paper. He was also known for helping his children's preschool and elementary school teachers by volunteering in the classroom, cafeteria, and running occasional errands such as bringing last minute supplies needed for projects.

Jim's children were a source of joy. He never missed an opportunity to attend any of their activities. He was their biggest cheerleader. It wasn't unusual to find him eating lunch with them in the elementary school cafeteria. Later Jim enjoyed telling stories and teaching life lessons to both his children and their friends. He maintained frequent contact with them as they grew up which included lengthy phone calls - he wasn't the best texter. He was a very proud dad!

Jim was loved by his community. He truly cared about everyone he met. People smile when talking about their encounters and visits with him. He helped anyone that needed it. He would mow lawns, run errands, and even went out during a winter storm for dog food for an elderly friend.

Jim was also very appreciative of those that helped him in any way. He thanked the doctors and nurses in the hospital, even when he wasn't feeling his best. He'd ask them how their day was going and how they felt! He never wanted anyone to go out of their way for him, but he was very grateful whenever they did. He will be missed by many, especially his children and very dear friend Bob.

PLATTSBURGH — In the early morning hours on April 21, 2022, expecting to put in his usual full day of work at the North Country Center for Independence, our father, John Joseph Farley, woke up to the smiles of our mother, Viola, and our sister, Stacy, in Heaven.

Our dad was born Sept. 19, 1943, to our great-grandparents John and Dorothy (Shipley) Farley in Brooklyn, N.Y. He graduated from John F. Kennedy High School and Vorhees Technical College. In

November of 1963, our dad met our mom. Dashing Johnny married the beautiful Viola Byers on April 24, 1965.

In December of 1966, family planning went wrong and on Aug. 14, 1967, Lauren Beth was born. In 1969, the little Brooklyn family moved to King Salmon, Alaska, where John took a job as a heating engineer for the Federal Government. Google Brooklyn and then Google King Salmon. We are confident our 24-year-old city mom, with toddler in tow and flying for the first time ever, did not expect THAT! Johnny had the ideas and Viola had enough love and confidence in him to ride the ride. On June 24, 1971, our sister, Stacy Beth, was born in a Dillingham, Alaska. Later the same year, our father took another federal position, Airport Operations Facilities Manager, in Cold Bay, Alaska. On Oct. 9, 1975, our brother, John Ryan was born in Anchorage, Alaska, and our family was complete. We think Cold Bay was our parent's favorite time. In 1978, wanting to move back to the Lower '48 to be closer to family, a transfer to Connecticut for an FAA job. We are confident this was our parent's least favorite place. Cold Bay to suburbia did not go over well with our mother.

In 1979, Johnny had another idea and Vi got on the ride again. This time to Wilmington, N.Y., to own and operate the North Country Inn. Financially, it was a constant struggle but experience-wise, it couldn't be beat. It was a family business. Our hilarious experiences there are too numerous to mention. Our mother cooked, the sisters waited tables, our dad did a little of everything and five-year-old Ryan directed customers to parking spots for money whether they wanted to or not.

In the mid 80's, Stacy was diagnosed with cancer. Our dad accepted an offer from Pan Am Airlines to direct Facilities and Operations at JFK and our sister received the best care possible from Sloan Kettering. Our sister passed away on June 7, 1992. She was 20 years old. Our family went on but we were never the same. After spending years going through the anguish of chemo, radiation, remission, recurrence and experimental drug trials with our sister, left our mother a shell of her former self. Johnny to the rescue!

Throughout the rest of 90's and early 00's Johnny saw opportunity and dollar signs AND Viola got back on the ride. Our dad, under contract with the US Department of Defense, served in a variety of capacities including overseeing the rebuilding of the Turkish infrastructure following a devastating earthquake and designing strategic air bases in Saudi Arabia. They built lives in several countries and visited many more. Ireland, Egypt and Italy were top three. Egypt beat Italy because Johnny wore shorts to the Vatican and was refused entry by the Swiss Guard. Our father's last overseas stint could not include our mother because the opportunity was in Iraq as part of Operation Enduring Freedom. We have no idea what he did there. We do know it was the only contract he didn't finish. He surprised our mother by returning to her in Plattsburgh, N.Y., weeks before his contract ended. It was only after the death of our mother on Nov. 14, 2016, our father told us of his experiences in Iraq. We will be asking Harrison Ford to play our dad when the movie comes out.

Not ones to stay in one place for too long, Johnny and Viola traveled the US visiting beautiful beaches. Our father loved beaches and our mother loved beachfront suites with balconies

and room service. As grandchildren and then great-grandchildren arrived, traveling stopped and visiting Nana and Gramps' house became the place to be. Johnny, now Gramps, began to get on Nana's nerves so he became, once again, employed full-time. His time and talents were now utilized by a disability rights advocacy organization as an Architectural Barrier Consultant. He will be missed by many there.

As his surviving children, although it was an incredibly painful time for all of us, we appreciate the five years we got to spend with him following our mother's passing. Right now, this moment is painful, too, but the peace we have knowing our parents are together again will prevail.

Along with our mother and sister, our father was predeceased by his parents, his older brother Martin Farley, and nephew Sean Farley.
