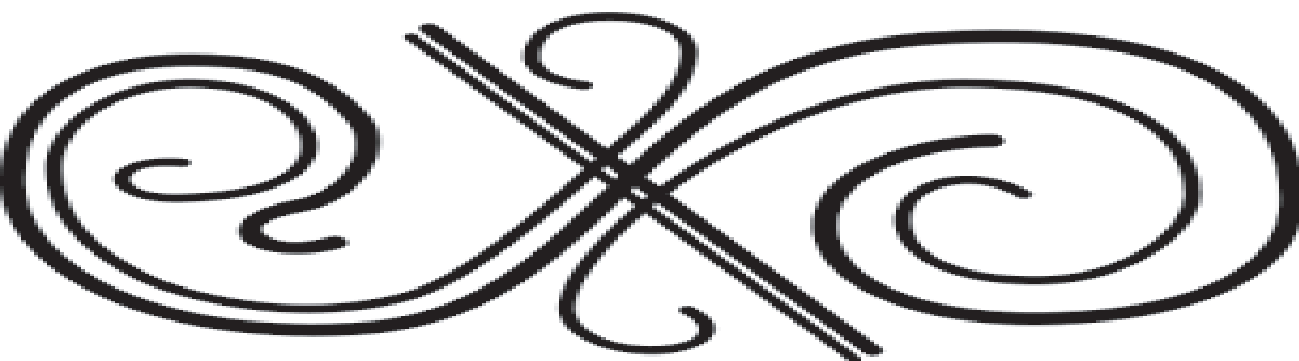
Sister Claire spent her last years of retirement at Victory Place Senior Community.
