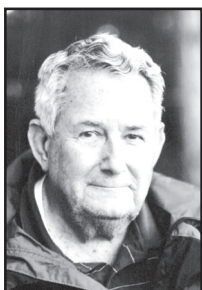

Preceding him in death were his parents and many friends in-

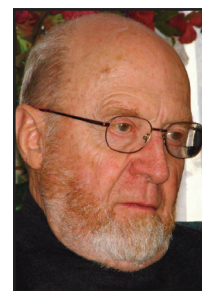

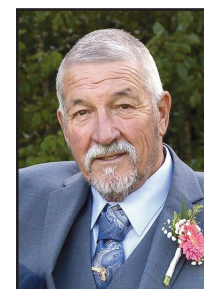

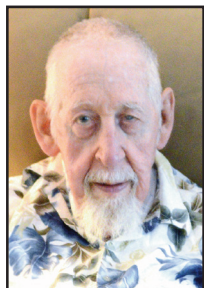

John was well known as one the area's top antique car collectors. His passion was the Ford Model A. His collection included most of the different models available.

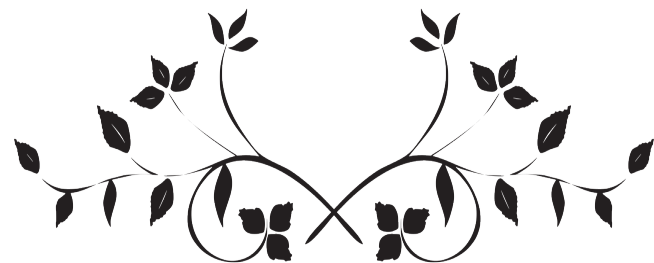

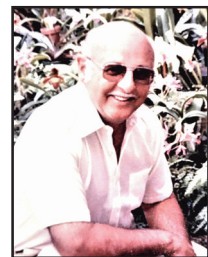
