Retired Quad Citian, Janell Sullivan, 70, is like many area seniors who enjoy the 100-plus miles of walking and bike paths.

“I usually walk two to three miles a day and bike as often as possible. Walking the Iowa State Fair fan is one of my favorite activities,” she says.

After two knee replacements in 2023, Janell’s right knee wasn’t healing like the first. “It just wasn’t coming back as smoothly. Even after both surgeries, I couldn’t walk or bike like I used to.”
