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Vacating Building at 401 W. 4th Street

The City of Davenport initiates clearance of residents from apartment structure.

DAVENPORT, IOWA (MARCH 26, 2024) – As a result of the findings provided to the City of Davenport by structural engineers retained from Shive-Hattery, the City has initiated immediate vacating of the apartment structure located at 401 W. 4th Street.

At this time, the Development and Neighborhood Services Department is notifying tenants and has secured available resources to assist in displacement. Per the building owner, the current expected number of units that will be vacated is approximately 18; City staff is verifying the number of units. As more information becomes available, this will be shared with the public.
