RCAS LEGISLATIVE POSITIONS

Background Information: The Board of Education wishes to take official action on specific bills in the legislature as listed in the attached document. **Administrative Recommendation:** Administration recommends approval of RCAS Legislative Bills as listed. **LEGISLATIVE BILLS/POSITIONS HB 1051** Description: Provides no increase to state aid, amends property tax levies and updates special education disability levels. Recommended Position: Oppose. Rationale: Bill provides no inflationary increase to the Target Teacher Salary of the State Aid formula, as legally required. In addition, the bill lowers the levies on all tax classifications. **HB 1082** Description: Establishes the reimbursement of school districts that provide free or reduced-price meals to students. Recommended Position: Support. Rationale:

Provides relief to families who qualify for reduced meals and guarantees the District receives revenue for those meals. **SB 85** Description: Requires an election for

opt-outs and capital outlay opt-outs. Recommended Position: Oppose. Rationale: Would make school districts the only public entity that MUST have an election in order to opt-out, making the process more cumbersome and more difficult. **SB 96** Description: Authorize the imposition of a county option gross receipts tax (up to 1/2 cent) to reduce owner-occupied property taxes. This is the Governor's proposal to reduce property taxes on homes. Recommended Position: Neutral. Rationale: Targeted approach to property tax relief that allows a county to determine whether or not an additional sales tax should be levied to provide property tax relief. Sales tax revenue would then replace loss in revenue to taxing entities from tax relief. The most realistic and sustainable bill thus far in terms of property tax relief. However, a neutral stance allows the ability to support other bills that may place school districts in a better position.

Standing Position on Property Tax Relief Bills The Rapid City Area School District's Legislative Committee supports property tax relief legislation that identifies consistent, viable, and reliable ongoing sources of revenue to replace any lost property tax dollars. This position recognizes that property taxes are a primary source of local revenue for public schools in South Dakota, and that meaningful tax relief must be paired with stable funding mechanisms. The Year will be held on February 10th at 5:00 pm at the Rapid City Alternative Academy. **OTHER:** Area 4 and Area 5 board member spots will be open and on the June election. educational advocacy, any reduction or repeal of property tax should be accompanied by replacement revenue, a hold-harmless provision, or an increase in state support to fully offset the loss for school districts.
