INFORMATION Rapid City Area
School District and Meade County
wish to enter into an agreement
for the parties to conduct the
School District's annual election
and special election, to be held
on either Tuesday, June 2, 2026,
or Tuesday, November 3, 2026.
ADMINISTRATIVE CONSIDERATION:
RCAS agrees to provide specified
information, initiate two Notice
postings to the Rapid City Journal,
Faith Independent and Black
Hills Pioneer and repay shared
costs according to the deadlines
outlined in the Combined Election
Agreement. The County agrees to
run the election duties and provide
data back to RCAS by the deadlines
outlined. ADMINISTRATION'S
RECOMMENDATION: It is
recommended that the Board of
Education approve the agreement
between Rapid City Area School
District and Meade County to
combine for the election of Board
members on June 2, 2026, and for
the special election on November 3,
2026.
