OPEN DIVISIONS GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

Please Note: Absolutely NO Late Entries will be Accepted

- 1. No article previously entered in the Ravalli County Fair will be accepted.
- Entries are open to all except 4-H.4-H entries must be 4-H Entrants belonging to an active club within Ravalli County. Entries must be made on official entry blank provided in this book. Additional copies may be secured by contacting the Fairgrounds Office. You may make photocopies. DO NOT make your own entry blank!
- 3. ONE entry per class per Exhibitor, except where otherwise noted under individual Department rules*
- 4. Exhibitors are not permitted to set up commercial booths in the exhibit area. Fundraising/Raffle is not allowed without permission prior to the start of Fair.
- 5. Exhibits must be made by the Exhibitor. No unfinished articles will be accepted except where otherwise noted under individual Department rules.
- 6. Where there is but one exhibit in a Division, the award shall be on merit alone and any premium or no premiums may be awarded.
- 7. No premium will be paid unless the classification is in the premium list.
- 8. AMATEURS ONLY means those who engage in the work as a hobby or for the love of the work, whose returns from sales, if any, do not exceed the cost of the materials used and have had no other remunerations except Premium awards.
- 9. Each Exhibitor will be responsible for placing entries in the proper Division and Class number with their OWN entry form.
- 10. All exhibits, when assigned space, become subject to the control of the Department Superintendent until release day.
- 11. The Management reserves the right to reject any exhibit offered.
- 12. All Open Division Still Exhibit judging is closed to the public.
- 13. The Fairgrounds will use every precaution in its power for the safe preservation of all articles on exhibit, but will NOT be responsible for loss or damage.
- 14. Premium payouts are available 12pm 6pm on Saturday and 12pm 4pm on Sunday at the Premium Office. Then it becomes available in the Premium Office until September 10, after which it will be forfeited and closed.
- 15. Roving vendors or solicitors, acting whether for profit or nonprofit organizations, or on his own behalf, shall NOT be permitted on the Fairgrounds.
- 16. All Exhibits due to the Fairgrounds 11 a.m. 6 p.m. Sunday before Fair. EXCEPTION: Floral Departments (Monday 3 p.m. 7 p.m.)
- 17. Exhibits will be released from 12 p.m. 4 p.m. Sunday after the Fair. After 30 days the items will become the property of Ravalli County Fairgrounds and/or disposed of.
- 18. Judges' book only will be used as evidence for payment of premiums. Ribbons and tags are not accepted.
- 19. Dogs will not be permitted on the grounds during Fair, except Service dogs and 4-H project dogs.
- 20. All exhibits must be recorded in the Fairgrounds Office. Names of open Division Exhibitors will not appear on the exhibit until after judging has been completed. Entry tags must be attached to all entries except livestock.

OPEN DIVISION LIVESTOCK GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

- 1. Livestock must be entered on their own Entry Blank and brought to the Fairgrounds Office or entered online.
- 2. An entry fee per class (listed on the Livestock Entry Form) will be paid for all animals entered in OPEN DIVISION. This fee must be paid when the Livestock Entry Form is submitted to the Fairgrounds Office or online. Small Animal exhibits must be in place by 8 p.m. Tuesday of Fair week.
- 3. All Animals must be fed & watered on a daily basis by Exhibitor.
- 4. All grain feed must be in closed containers. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping cages and the area under the cages clean throughout the Fair. Animals shall be watered and fed responsibly from first day entering the Fair until the Fair is over. Exhibitors will provide waterers and feeders.
- 5. Exhibitors are not permitted to sell their exhibits during Fair. Exhibitors can leave your contact information for the public.
- 6. Exhibitors will cooperate at all times to conduct the best possible Fair. <u>Unsportsmanlike conduct will not be tolerated</u> and the offending Exhibitor will forfeit all fees paid or premiums due and may be immediately dismissed from the Ravalli County Fairgrounds. Also, at the discretion of the Ravalli County Fairgrounds, the Exhibitor could lose the right to enter exhibits in future Ravalli County Fairs.
- 7. Every animal must be owned by the Exhibitor 60 days prior to exhibiting and registered in name of bona fide owner. No papers pending. Open Breeding Sheep, see Department for rules regarding ownership.
- 8. The Management reserves the right to reject, accept conditionally or to cancel any entries and awards of prizes, without claim for damages. They also reserve the right to reject entries after available pens and space in building have been taken.
- 9. All animals to be shown in lots of pairs and pens must have been shown individually.
- 10. Animals must be shown in such a manner as the Judge may require, and if the Exhibitors refuses to submit to the proper requirements of the Judge, their animals will be disqualified.
- 11. Exhibitors refusing to exhibit their animals for competition when their class number is called by the Superintendent, or are not available at the time their class number is called, shall be disqualified from that particular Division. Exhibitor numbers must be worn in show ring and can be obtained in the Premium Office.
- 12. No person other than those holding or assisting in the showing of the animals being exhibited will be allowed in the show ring during the time of judging except the Superintendent, the Judge, Clerks, and other authorized persons.
- 13. Exhibitors talking to Judges is prohibited, except when answering a question of the Judge. Those who wish to explain in regard to their exhibit must do so through the Superintendent or Clerk and must not interfere with the Judge, or the Exhibitor will be disqualified.
- 14. 1st and 2nd place animals of each Class will return to compete for Champion and Reserve Champion of each breed.
- 15. At the discretion of the Judge, where there is no competition in an age group, but an animal shown is of Grand Champion quality, the Judge may designate it as an animal qualified for Grand Champion competition.
- 16. All animals occupying exhibit pens must be kept thoroughly groomed, cleaned, and in show condition at all times. Stalls and pens must be neatly kept and supplied with necessary bedding. Pathways and approaches must be kept clean for the spectators. Manure and waste must be deposited in designated areas.
- 17. The decision of the Judge shall be final. Upon request of the Exhibitor, the Judges will be required to give reasons for the decision rendered.
- 18. Judges' books only will be used as evidence for payment of premiums.
- 19. All registered animals must be properly tagged or tattooed.
- 20. Livestock Exhibitors MUST purchase exhibitor passes before or at the time of making entry. **No livestock passes sold after opening day.**

Superintendents will assign all stalls and/or pens before animals may be penned. **Call the Superintendents.** All stalls and/or pens must be cleaned to the dirt, wood and/or cement and inspected by the Superintendent of each barn before leaving the Fairgrounds.

Bread should be so completely baked that when pressed upon it will spring out immediately upon release of pressure. An excellent loaf of bread should be uniform golden brown in color. The flavor should be nutty, agreeable to taste, and with no suggestion of sourness, except for sourdough category. The crumb should be slightly moist, tender, yet not crumbling when compressed; light in weight in proportion to size, even grain, slightly creamy white in color. The crust of the loaf should be tender and of medium thickness.



Judging**

a. Youth and Cloverbuds who have exhibits in Departments 50-60 must make an appointment to be Interview Judged. See 4-H Still Exhibits Interview Judging Section for more

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS. ALL ANIMAL PROJECTS MUST BE **ENTERED ON A SEPARATE LIVESTOCK** ENTRY FORM.

1. For Complete Rules and guidelines, please review "Project Rules & Regulations in addition to the Exhibitor's Handbook. 2. 4-H and FFA livestock and small animal

projects will be exhibited together. 4-H Livestock General Rules and Department Rules will apply to all exhibits. Special premiums, photos, and awards will be available to 4-H and FFA equally.

3. All animals shown in 4-H and FFA must

- be carried as project animals with records kept on the animals, whether shown in a regular division or showmanship. Horses may be leased but members must be involved in care. Some goats may be leased, refer to goat rules for specific guidelines.
- 4. Disqualification and the removal of livestock exhibits from the Fairgrounds will be at the discretion of the Livestock Sale Committee or the Small Animal Committee.
- 5. At spring weigh-in and during Fair, a Barn Superintendent may consult a DVM or DVM designee to confirm criteria and eligibility for market animals. Barn Superintendent(s) and Extension Agent have the right to make the final call on a case-by-case basis. Those decisions will be conveyed in a conversation between the Barn Superintendent(s), Extension Agent, and the Exhibitor with a Parent/Guardian or a Club Leader/Representative or
- Chapter Advisor/Representative present. 6. Age for market animals is determined by each specific species. See species specific rules for said market age. Date of birth is mandatory for all market animals.
- 7. All market animals will be weighed in for the Ravalli County Fair right off the truck/trailer. Animals must be uncovered refer to species specific rules for fitting requirements. Members and parents can watch the weigh-in and are allowed to challenge the weight only once. Market animals are not allowed to leave the scale area and will be immediately reweighed. The second weight will be the final weight. Any concerns need to be discussed with the Extension Agent and Barn Superintendent(s)
- 8. All breeding project animals must be owned by May 1, with the exception of the bred dairy heifers for sale and they must be owned by March 15.
- 9. All market animals must be owned by

each species tag-in or weigh-in date.

10. Exhibitors must furnish their own feed.

11. The youth livestock exhibitor is responsible for the feeding, watering, and cleanliness of his or her animal(s) and for the appearance, condition, and cleanliness of the stalls, pens, cages, and alleyways. If an exhibitor needs help to accomplish this, they can and should reach out to fellow 4-H and FFA members or Junior Leaders. Parents and other adults are not <u>allowed to do these things for them without</u> explicit permission from the Barn Superintendent(s)

12. All Animals must be fed and pens cleaned

by 10 a.m.

13. All livestock animals must stay inside the North gate, on the West side of the "Breeze Way" gate leading to the rodeo area, and North of the First Aid Station.

14. An Exhibitor who is both a 4-H member and an FFA member with separate projects for each program may exhibit two projects in the same class, one under 4-H and one under FFA, except Horse. Please indicate on the entry form which project is for 4-H and which is for FFA.

15. Exhibitors in livestock can enter one (1) or two (2) animals per class. If more than one (1) animal is entered, another 4-H or FFA Member, will have to show it for the Exhibitor, but must obtain the proper Exhibitor number from the livestock owner or no premium will be paid. The Premium Office will provide the numbers.

16. The Judge will make the decision to award a champion or not, depending on the quality of the animal(s) in the class. All ribbon placings are at the discretion of the Judge.

17. Animals with obvious health problems or external parasites can be refused entry by Barn Superintendents.

18. Fair Management, including Department Superintendents or Judges, has the right to call a veterinarian should a situation arise. The Exhibitor will be responsible for the veterinarian fees.

19. Exhibitors may not sleep overnight in the

livestock barns or sheds.

20. All animals at the Fair MUST be entered in a division/class, excluding the young of a nursing animal.

21. All grain/pellets must be in a closed container.

22. No sale advertisements of any kind for any animals. This includes but is not limited to signs and marking or writing on animals. Report all infractions to the Superintendent(s). If member does not comply with these rules, they will not be allowed to show or sell their animal(s)

23. All Exhibitors will follow the Montana 4-H Livestock Code of Ethics & be Montana State Quality Assurance Certified.

ALL ANIMAL EXHIBITOR'S DRESS

CODE Applies to all species, divisions, and the livestock sale:

1. Clean, collared, long sleeved, long tailed shirt with collar, buttoned up and tucked into black/dark pants or jeans, and dark boots or leather footwear (no tennis shows, rubber boots, or sandals) must be worn by livestock exhibitors during livestock events. Official dress is mandatory for FFA members. Western style or cowboy hats will be allowed. See Showmanship rule #4 for requirements specific to showmanship.

2. Animals presented in the show ring will not be decorated with artificial markings, ribbons, glitter, or other foreign items. This includes during judging events and livestock sale.

3. If a member does not comply with these rules, they will not be allowed to show or sell their animals.

SPORTSMANSHIPAll Exhibitors and their families are expected to conduct themselves in a positive, honest sportsmanlike manner during shows. Losing gracefully is just as important as winning

The following practices are prohibited: a. Inappropriate behavior by Exhibitors. b. Misrepresenting the age of the animal for the class and lot in which it is shown.

c. Criticizing or interfering with the Judge, other Exhibitors, or Show Officials while at the show or Fair.

ANY OF THESE INFRACTIONS will result in an individual or group being expelled, placed on probation or declared ineligible to exhibit at the show by the Barn Superintendent(s) and/or Extension Agents.

TREATMENT OF ANIMALS
All animals are to be treated in a humane manner. Adequate feed, water, and shelter are to be provided at all times. Physically abusing an animal is **unacceptable** at all times and the maltreatment of animals will not be tolerated. Exhibitors who abuse their animals, for whatever reasons, will be disqualified from the show. Striking an animal to cause swelling is absolutely prohibited and will result in removal from the Fairgrounds.

ADMINISTRATION OF DRUGS AND UNAPPROVED FOREIGN SUBSTANCES IS FORBIDDEN.

All treatment, feeding, or drug administration must follow in accordance to USDA regulations. Any violations will require application for readmission for future participation at the Ravalli County Fair.

VIOLATIONS:
Any violation of the rules and regulation may result in forfeiture of all premiums and awards, as well as disqualification expulsion, or probation of the Exhibitor or organized groups the Exhibitor represents and the exhibit or livestock involved in the violation. Probation, disqualification, expulsion or other disciplinary actions of the Livestock Sale Committee will be final.

HERDSMANSHIP CONTEST

The purpose of this contest is to promote better care of livestock, pens, and equipment and to keep animal's clean and attractive at all

- 1. Every 4-H club and FFA chapter exhibiting livestock is automatically entered in this contest and is for clubs rather than individuals
- 2. The Barn Superintendent(s) will check barns periodically throughout the Fair scoring the following:
- a. Neatness of stalls and alleus in all barns.
- b. Care and grooming of animals.
- c. Care and storage of equipment.
- d. Courtesy and helpfulness to visitors. e. Stall card - completed and easy to read.
- f. Clear and easy to read Club sign.

- 3. The winning club or chapter in each barn will be given a traveling sign to display indicating they have done a superior job that
- day.
 4. There are special premiums awarded for Livestock Herdsmanship. Daily winners receive 4-H Corner Café tickets, and the overall winning club in each species will be announced during the awards program on Saturday evening of Fair week and their name placed on a plaque displayed in the Extension Office.

4-H & FFA LIVESTOCK SALE

Sale 8:00 a.m. Saturday, of the Fair, Hornung Sale Arena Sale Order: Market Goat, Beef, Dairy, Sheep, & Swine.

- 1. Each Exhibitor of a market animal will be permitted to sell only one animal in the Livestock Sale.
- 2. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion livestock market animals must sell in the Ravalli County 4-H Livestock Sale unless you sell in the Western Montana Fair in Missoula. In the event that an Exhibitor wins more than 1 Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion, they must choose which one to sell.
- 3. If a Ravalli County 4-H or FFA member has sold an animal at the Western Montana Fair this year, they are ineligible to sell at the Ravalli County Fair.

 4. The animal must have been shown in the
- current Fair year and be present at the fair on sale day to be eligible for the livestock sale.
- 5. White ribbon animals will not be sold in the Livestock Sale.
- 6. All market animals will sell in order of placement or by random draw for sale order. 7. Exhibitor or other 4-H or FFA member must be present at the sale time to sell their animal. Any exceptions must be discussed with the Barn Superintendent(s) prior to the Livestock Sale.
- 8. Livestock weight groups and corresponding support prices at the sale can be set or changed by the Livestock Fair Superintendents and 4-H Livestock Sale Committee at Fair time. The 4-H Livestock Sale Committee consists of the Executive Committee of the 4-H Livestock Committee, 4-H Livestock Sale Administrator(s), 4-H Livestock Barn Superintendents, and the Extension Agent.
- 9. Market beef, market lambs, and market goats release times will be announced at the MandatoryBarn Meetings. Swine will be released on Monday (Labor Day). All other livestock to be released Sunday of Fair Week. All animal release times will be at the discretion of the Barn Superintendent(s) and Extension Agent. Enter and Exit through North Gate only.
- 10. Costs of administering the sale will be deducted

from Exhibitors' sale proceeds.

- 11. Resale/Support Animal Purchase Bid Price Agreements for:
- a. Market beef, sheep, swine, and market goats must be filled out, mailed or turned in as per the Resale / Support Bid Price Agreement.
- b. Bred Dairy and Beef Heifers Resale Support Bid sheets will be posted in their respective barns and turned in to the 4-H Fair Livestock Administrator just prior to the beginning of the livestock sale at 8 a.m. Saturday..

SMALL ANIMAL AUCTION

Small Animal Auction is Saturday of Fair at 3 p.m. in Hornung Arena. Order of sale is by random draw.

- 1. Exhibitors are responsible for getting Auction Sale Forms to the Small Animal Auction Administrator(s) no later than noon on Thursday. No late forms will be accepted.
- 2. Each Exhibitor is allowed to sell (5) Classes. Example of a class is: Individual bird or

Pairs of birds or rabbits, Trios of birds or rabbits or Meat Pen. Poultry pairs may be a young laying pair (6 months-1 year), an old laying pair (1-2 years), or a breeding pair (one hen/pullet and one cock/cockerel).

Poultry Trio can be 2 hens & 1 cock, 2 pullets & 1 cockerel, 3 hens or 3 pullets.

Rabbit trios may be two does and one buck, or

- A meat pen will consist of 3 birds/rabbits.
- 3. Exhibitors are responsible to get their animals to the arena by 2:30 p.m. day of auction. Cages will be set up for your use. If animals are not in the arena by sale time they will be scratched and not sold.
- Each Exhibitor is required to <u>thank</u> your Buyer with a poster or card to be displayed on cages or pens. It is very important to acknowledge them for their support.
- 5. The animals sold at the Small Animal Auction must have been shown in the current fair year and be present at the fair on sale day to be eligible for the Small Animal Auction.

SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

- 1. Exhibitors must personally own the animal that they show in the Showmanship contest. Horses and some goats can be leased but members must be involved in animal care.
- 2. Judges are looking for Exhibitors who demonstrate superior skill in fitting, training, and showing their animals.
- 3. Animals entered in Showmanship must be project animals trained and fitted by the 4-H or FFA member and records must have been kept
- 4. MANDATORY DRESS for all Showmanship classes including Round Robin: White long sleeved, long-tailed shirts with collar, buttoned up and tucked into black/dark pants or jeans; dark footwear (no tennis shoes, rubber boots, or sandals). FFA official dress is mandatory. Hats are not allowed in dairy, sheep, swine, goats, and dogs. Western hats, English helmets/hats or SEI helmets are required in Horse Showmanship Classes.
- 5. Novice showmanship is for first year members in livestock projects having a novice showmanship division, regardless of age. Novice showman will not be eligible to compete in the Round Robin.
- 6. Senior, Intermediate and Junior age categories are based on the member's age as of October 1, the beginning of the 4-H year. 7. Champion and Reserve Champion for the

Senior, Intermediate, and Junior age classes will be selected.

- 8. The Champion Showman from the Senior, Intermediate, and Junior Division will be eligible to compete in the Round Robin Overall Showmanship Contest held of Friday of Fair
- 9. Past winners are eligible to compete.

ROUND ROBIN SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

1. All Champion Showmen from each of the following species are expected to compete: Large animal – beef, dairy, dairy goat, horse, market goat, sheep, and swine; Small animal dog, poultry, and rabbit.

2. Contestants must be the Senior, Intermediate, or Junior Champion in a

department.

- 3. In the situation where a Grand Champion showman cannot be at the Round Robin the Superintendent must be notified in advance and only the Reserve Showman can show in each division.
- 4. Large Animal & Small Animal Round Robin Participants will not have a scheduled practice. However, participants can meet with other Participants prior to the show on their own accord.
- 5. Several reasons for practice Round Robin: a. Learn to handle other species.
 - b. Have your animal become familiar with species.
- c. Learn basic safety showing other animals. 6. Past winners are eligible to compete.
- 7. No hats or helmets are allowed during Round Robin competition.

CARCASS EVALUATION

Fair Superintendents and the MSU Extension Office will attempt to evaluate Beef, Swine, Sheep, and Market Goat carcasses on as many market animals as possible following the Fair. The guidelines for the carcass contests will be those suggested, by the Montana Extension Specialist for Beef, Swine, and Sheep. Some animals are shipped out of the area including most of the lambs, which make carcass evaluation nearly impossible. In the event that a satisfactory evaluation cannot be made, the contest will be dropped for that year and the special premium money held for the next Fair year. No regular Fair premiums will be paid for carcass placing.

Fairgrounds. 5. The Superintendents will screen all market beef and progress/feeder class exhibits, and

base classes by weight.

6. Market beef must be born January 1st or

later of the previous calendar year.

7. All beef animals are required to have a halter and neck rope on at all times.

8. Late or improperly castrated steers will not be allowed to show.

9. If a market beef does not meet the minimum weight requirement of 1,000 pounds that beef

cannot go through the sale and will be placed

in a progress/feeder class.

10. Market beef will be weighed only once right off the truck/trailer. Animals must be uncovered -refer to species specific rules for fitting requirements. Members and parents can watch the weigh-in and are allowed to challenge the weight only once. Market animals are not allowed to leave the scale area and will be immediately reweighed. The second weight will be the final weight. Any concerns need to be discussed with the Extension Agent and Barn Superintendent(s).

11. Market beef must be weighed, tattooed, and tagged at the beginning of the year by the 4-H Livestock Committee.

12. Exhibitors having shown a market beef and a bred beef heifer must tell the Beef Superintendent(s) immediately after the Market Beef Show which animal is to be placed in the sale order.

13. In order to exhibit breeding beef, the Exhibitor must be enrolled in the 4-H/FFA beef breeding project.

14. Cow Efficiency Contest is open to 4-H and FFA beef cow with calf. Exhibitors enter by weighing in the cow and calf on entry day and providing the Superintendent with the cow's age, breed of cow and calf, and calf birth date. Calves must be born between January 1 and April 30 of current year. The basis for placing in this contest is the calf, which is the highest percent of its dam weight, will be considered the winner of all the pairs of animals. The calf's weight will be adjusted to the 205-day adjusted weaning weight used by the Montana Beef Performance Association.

15. Bred Beef Heifers for sale: Exhibitors must follow all project guidelines and must provide the Superintendents with a health folder when the heifer first enters the barn on entry day. Project guidelines and information for health folders are listed in the Beef Rules & Regulations.

16. Bred Heifer must be entered in the appropriate class at the Ravalli County Fair. Heifer must receive a red or blue ribbon to be eligible to participate in the Livestock Sale.

17. MANDATORY Market Beef Interview and Companion Beef Interviews. All members enrolled in market division must provide current records, comparison sheets, and be properly dressed.

18. Market Beef release times will be relayed at the Mandatory Monday Night Meeting. Release time is subject to change due to Safety and processor availability. Enter and Exit through the North Gate only.

7. Market lambs must be born January 1st or later of current 4-H year and weighed in at the Spring Weigh-In to be entered in the Market

Lamb Show and Livestock Sale.

8. The weight obtained at the Spring Weigh-In will establish the initial weight for Average Daily Gain. There is a special premium for Average Daily Gain. Criteria for this award: lamb must weigh between 100-160 pounds and have gained the most weight per day.

9. Market lambs will be weighed in for the

Ravalli County Fair right off the truck/trailer. Animals must be uncovered – refer to species specific rules for fitting requirements. Members and parents can watch the weigh-in and are allowed to challenge the weight only once. Market animals are not allowed to leave the scale area and will be immediately reweighed. The second weight will be the final weight. Any concerns need to be discussed with the Extension Agent and the Barn Superintendent(s).

10. The weight range for market lambs is 100-160 pounds. Lambs over 160 pounds can be sold at the 4-H/FFA sale, but owners will be paid for no more than 160 lbs.

11. A ewe lamb, if tagged as market, cannot be shown as a breeding project.

5. The Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion livestock market animals must sell in the Ravalli County 4-H Livestock Sale unless you sell in the Western Montana Fair in Missoula. In the event that an Exhibitor wins more than one Grand Champion or Reserve Grand Champion, they must choose which one to sell.

6. Non-heritage breed swine must be born January 1st or later of the current 4-H year, and heritage breed swine must be born December 1st or later of the current 4-H

year. 7. Market swine weight range is from 220 lbs. to 300 lbs., to better meet the SOE standards and market changes. Hogs will be weighed in 1-pound increments only.

8. Swine weighing less than 220 lbs. are eligible for the underweight class; this class is for those members who do not have a market swine at the Fair. Swine in this class are not eligible for the Livestock Sale.

9. All animals not entered in a division must be removed from the Fairgrounds

immediately after the weigh-in.

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THIS YEAR'S RAVALLI COUNTY FAIR FAMILY IS RAN & CHAR PIGMAN

Each year, The Fair Family is chosen from public nominations, based on their commitment and dedication to The Ravalli County Fair. This year's Fair Family honoree is RAN and Char Pigman.

RAN has been active with the Ravalli County Fair since he was a young boy. He and his siblings took animals and project to the



Fair throughout their school years. When Sally May was 4-H Leader, RAN showed goats the first year they were allowed at Fair as an exhibition. "Nobody wanted us. Sheep said no. Dairy said hell no, so we were put along the outside of the Rabbit Barn." The following year, goats were allowed as a new Department. For the past several years, Pigman Builders, where RAN continues as Senior Advisor, has purchased the Champion Market Goat, as well as other animals.

When in high school, RAN's summer job was working on Fairgrounds upkeep, alongside Manager Ned Applebury and Oliver Long, head of maintenance. During the years when the Fair had horse racing, RAN tended the gate, letting pedestrians cross the track safely between races.

Years later, RAN and Char became 4-H leader with the Woodside Workmen Club. While that Club did everything, their focus was on pigs

and model rocketry, the latter being displayed around a real rocket nose cone. The Pigmans had a hog breeding program on their farm and provided wiener pigs for 4-Hers. RAN has won many Fair ribbons through the years for animals, most categories in the Honey Department, and won Best of Show for Kombucha.

RAN became a member of the Fair Board (today's Fair Commission). He also served a number of years as the Chairman of the Building and Grounds Committee. Some of the projects he worked on include: upgrading the men's room; leveling the Tired Iron area and planting the lawn there; installing ADA access ramps into the barns north of the front lawn; design and installation of the bicycle rest area at the Main Entrance; expansion of the tractor pull area; design and coordination of the handicap viewing platform for the Rodeo Arena. When the new ticket booths were built at the Main Entrance, RAN refurbished the old one and made it into a coffee shop, placing it on Three Corners. Char sold espressos there while her Bitterroot Ballet dancers performed on the lawn beside it. Another huge project RAN tackled was the paving of the Event Center parking lot, which is an improvement enjoyed all year long for the many events held in the building and on the Fairgrounds.

Still considered acting Chairman of the Building and Grounds Committee, RAN is always willing to pitch in on projects. Whenever there is a question about a project, you are likely to hear the response, "Ask RAN. He knows where all the bodies are buried."

"This year will be 53 years in a row that I haven't missed a Ravalli County Fair," RAN proudly admits, "with the exception of the terrible fire year of 2000 when the Fairgrounds was housing so many animals of

farms threatened by the fires." Besides that and the Covid year, RAN continued, "Other than those, I made it a policy during the several years in my 20s when I was roaming the Earth to always return to Fair."

From their west side, permaculture home where RAN focuses on chickens, bees, and 14 varieties of fruit trees, RAN remains an active and vital part of the Ravalli County Fair. Speaking of the future of the Fair and factors in its continued success, RAN unequivocally stated, "It's on the backbone of the volunteers."




