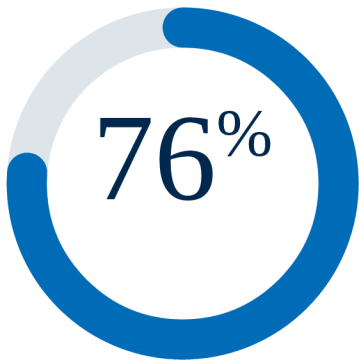
WHAT THE COUNT SHOWS

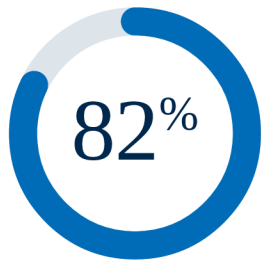

Long-time members of this community

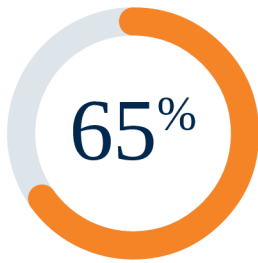
have lived in the Bitterroot Valley for more than a year.

49% have been here more than five years



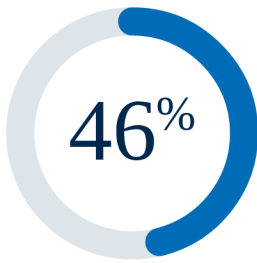
ACCESS TO INCOME

of homelessness.



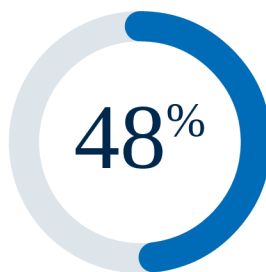
CHILDREN & SENIORS
