## Swimming Pool To Open May 25

Plans for a Grand Opening of the North Fremont Swimming Pool May 25 are being made this week, it was announced by Merrill Evans, chairman of the Swimming Pool Association.

Construction of the pool is approximately 90 percent done, and, if everything goes according to schedule, the pool will be filled with water during the week of May 20 and will be ready for the first swimmers that Saturday, he said.

John Passey has been retained as manager of the pool for the 1968 season. Applications are being accepted for other full and part time employees. Interested persons may pick up application blanks from Merrill Evans at the Ashton Building Center. An employee must be at least a high school sophomore next year, he noted.

Plans are being made for swimming classes to be held mornings before the pool is open for public swimming. Complete information on this matter will be released in the near future.

Mr Evans noted that any pledges that have been made toward the construction of the pool would be greatly appreciated at this time. Also, anyone who is interested in donating any services may do so by contacting any member of the pool committee.

Prices for admission to the pool: children under 14, 25 cents; students 14 to 18, 50 cents; and adult admission, 75 cents. Family season tickets are \$40, children under 14 season tickets, \$12, and students 14 to 18 season tickets, \$20.

# Commissioners Have Busy Day

Fremont County commissioners were busy from 8 a.m. to 7 p.m. at their monthly meeting Monday at the County Courthouse.

Their business included a petition proposed road to the Teton Dam site, a contract for surplus food, a petition on matters pertaining to the Fremont Golf Course, approval of a \$2,000 Fair fund and a request for funds for the St. Anthony airport.

Harry Worrell presented a petition commissioners signed by 32 county residents interested in the route of a road to the Teton Dam site by way of Hog Hollow.

The petition said this route was used "because it serves more people in that area of the county and contains Drummond and France and does not cross the dam site."

No action was taken on the petition. The commissioners indicated the matter be considered along with those already proposed.

Clayton Forsgren, county engineer, requested by the commissioners to confer with the County Assessor's office regarding acceptable plats for areas sub-divided in the Island Park area.

He also was asked to work with the program to determine the feasibility of a program for areas in the county of St. Anthony and Ashton.

Charles Earnst and Robert Crain of San Francisco, representing the County Market Services of the United States Department of Agriculture, met with the commissioners. They helped develop plans for Fremont County to receive surplus foods for Department of Public Health recipients and low income families.

Fremont County will furnish materials for the materials and will aid in reimbursement.

It is expected that this program will help more than 240 families in the area.

Representatives of the Fremont Golf Association, Marv Aslett, C. J. Baker, Richard Reinke, also met with the commissioners to discuss a beer license on green fees and a lease of property for a club house in relation to the Fremont Golf Course. Action is being taken on all 3 matters.

The commissioners approved the bond interest fund for this year's Fair. The request for financial aid was made by Joel Dustin, Eric Russell Hillman of the Fair Board.

Dr Ernest Pentz, representing the St. Anthony Chamber of Commerce, requested a county pledge of \$10,000 a year for 3 years to aid in securing funds from the federal government for the airport development.

It was decided to put the matter before the public for vote in the Aug. 2 election.

A tax equalization matter also was considered for Ernest Harrigfield's decision made on the matter.

No action was taken on the request of a temporary Civil Defense shelter. More study of the situation can be made.

Six Girls State delegates arrived from North Fremont High School for the board meeting for several days to observe the proceedings. The delegates were: Bainbridge, Deborah Harrigfield, Lora Wynn, Tamara Murdock, Leen Hendricksen, also visited the departments during the day.

## Dope Charges Made Against Ashton Men

Fremont County Probate Judge William H. Huskinson will announce his decision Thursday following the preliminary hearing Wednesday of Richard Hewitt.

Hewitt and companion David J. Beck were both charged with the illegal possession of narcotics after being bound over to the District Court on \$5,000 bond on another account.

They had been found guilty May 12 of breaking into a trailer house at Warm Rdver and stealing some items.

The narcotics charge was brought against them after a 17 year old Ashton girl was admitted to the Ashton Memorial Hospital last week and treated for an overdose of drugs which she had taken intravenous through her arms, Judge Huskinson stated.

The hospital notified Sheriff Jess Butts who made an investigation and obtained a search warrant to search the ranch house south of Ashton where the pair had been living. Approximately \$200 worth of drugs were found buried in the yard and 3 different drugs were found in the house.

The pair, who were formerly from California had entered a plea of not guilty at their arraignment before Judge Huskinson.

Hewitt's preliminary hearing was yesterday and Beck's will be later this week.

Judge Huskinson will decide only if there is enough evidence to warrant a trial.
