

INVITATION FOR BIDS

The City of Dayton, Tennessee is accepting separate sealed Bids for Power Line Right-of-Way Clearance and Tree Trimming until **2:00 P.M. EST, on May 21, 2026** at the office of City Manager, 399 First Avenue, Dayton, Tennessee 37321 at which time and place they will be publicly opened and read aloud.

Each Bidder shall be responsible for the delivery of their Bid by the above noted time. Bids received after the deadline will be unopened and discarded.

The work includes the furnishing of all materials, tools, equipment, labor, supervision, supplies, and transportation necessary to trim or remove trees, brush, and perform other utility forestry services including right-of-way clearing, and at such time and place as may be designated by the City of Dayton.

In compliance with T.C.A. §12-4-113, questions concerning the bid documents must be received no less than 96 hours before the bid opening date set forth above. Further, the City of Dayton will not issue addenda less than 48 hours before the bid opening date and time, excluding weekends and legal holidays designated in T.C.A. §15-1-101, unless the bid deadline is extended for a reasonable time as determined by the City of Dayton, which shall not be less than 48 hours, excluding weekends and legal holidays designated in T.C.A. §15-1-101, to allow for any necessary changes to the bid documents and to allow bidders to resubmit their bids accordingly.

Each Bidder must deposit with his/her bid, security in the amount, form and subject to the conditions provided in the Bid Specifications.

The City of Dayton reserves the right to reject any and all bids, to waive informalities, and to negotiate with the apparent qualified best bidder or bidders to such extent as may be necessary.
