survived by 4 brothers, Baltazar, Salomon, Joe, and Louis Madrid. And 1 Sister Margaret Valdez.

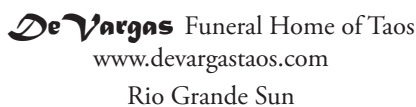
Julia lived her whole life in Chama NM. Many people will remember her by not only her personality and her faith but by her kindness and generosity towards others.
