## Guest lists are shrinking

Summer weddings are getting smaller — but far more intentional.

**A**fter years of supersized celebrations, couples are scaling back guest lists and reallocating budgets toward meaningful experiences. Business Insider says wedding planners report that even couples who initially planned for 200-plus guests are trimming numbers significantly, creating more intimate gatherings.

Instead of impressing a crowd, couples are focusing on the people who matter most and designing celebrations around connection. Smaller weddings allow for curated details: personalized menus, thoughtful seating arrangements and more face-to-face time with each guest.

Planning experts say the key is to think like a host, not just a bride or groom. That means prioritizing comfort: shaded seating, hydration stations and a timeline that avoids peak heat hours. A well-timed and properly paced event ensures guests can enjoy the celebration without feeling rushed or overheated.

Couples are also embracing “dinner party” vibes. Think long tables, shared dishes and relaxed atmospheres that feel more like a gathering than a production, reports Baltimore-area wedding photographer Lisa Robin.

Another factor driving the shift is cost transparency. With rising prices across catering, rentals and venues, couples are becoming more strategic about where their money goes. Rather than stretching a budget to accommodate a large guest list, many are choosing to spend more per guest, elevating the overall experience. There is also an emotional component to the trend. Couples say smaller weddings reduce stress and allow them to stay present throughout the day and actually enjoy the celebration they've planned. In a season often defined by hectic schedules and high expectations, that sense of ease is becoming one of the most valued elements of all.

For many couples, the shift to smaller guest lists is proving not only more memorable, but also more personal, meaningful and ultimately reflective of their relationships and values.
