63rd annual Salem News Student-Athlete Award to be awarded tonight

In so many ways, they are no different than the majority of their class-mates, typical teenagers in the year 2025.

The 15 seniors that make up the nominees for this year's Salem News Student-Athlete Award love their music, everything from Taylor Swift and Drake to SZA and Noah Kahn. They love classic movies such as "Happy Gilmore", "Mission Impossible", "Forrest Gump" and especially "Good Will Hunting". Whatever spare time they have is spent online: TikTok, Instagram, Spotify, YouTube and the like.

But there's a reason these Select 15 have separated themselves from the pack, too. They're exceptional in everything that they do, be it academically, athletically or in their communities.

Tonight, The Salem News will award its Student-Athlete award, celebrating the very best of the best in our region, to a deserving male or female for the 63rd time in a gala ceremony at Danversport Yacht Club.

The event will be sponsored by our long-time partners in the Student-Athlete program, Salem Five.

Awarded each year but one since 1962, our Student-Athlete Award honors those student-athletes who combine brilliance in the classroom, excellence and sportsmanship in athletics, the ability to be a positive influence in their community, and showing a partiality towards helping others.

One student-athlete from Beverly, Salem, Danvers, Peabody, Gloucester, Marblehead, Masconomet, Swampscott, St. John's Prep, Bishop Fenwick, Pingree, Essex Tech, Hamilton-Wenham, Ipswich and Manchester Essex have been chosen by their principals and athletic directors to best represent their school for this year's event.

Each of the 15 candidates will be interviewed in 15-minute segments Wednesday afternoon by our panel of judges, who will have the transcripts, recommendations and list of accomplishments of each nominee. When that is completed, the judges will whittle down the candidates to ultimately pick this year's winner. Last year's Student-Athlete recipient was Jake Vana of St. John's Prep.

Our traditional celebration dinner for our student-athlete candidates and their families will be held at Danversport Yacht Club. As part of the night's festivities, there will be a slideshow of the student-athletes, gifts, a guest speaker, and the announcement of the Student-Athlete winner.

We will also present the Nelson Benton Memorial Scholarship to this year's Student-Athlete winner. It is named in honor of the late and longtime Salem News reporter and editorial page editor, who retired in 2013.

The winner will also be given a commemorative bowl signifying their win. In addition, their name will be engraved on the Student-Athlete trophy, which will reside in the winner's school until next year's ceremony. The Paul Revere-style bowl made of sterling silver has the names of all 62 previous winners engraved on its base.

This year's Student-Athlete judges are Erin Truex, Executive Director for Beverly Main Streets and a former football player for the Boston Renegades women's team; Shelley Murray, a Senior Vice President, Regional Manager at Salem Five; Brad Hunt, Vice President at Salem Five; Matt Williams, the assistant sports editor at The Salem News; and Phil Stacey, Executive Sports Editor of The Salem News.

Danny Rowan's array of activities in the Bishop Fenwick High School community are quite diverse. Yet the common thread though anything he participates in is that he becomes a leader.

Whether as team captain of the Crusader boys soccer team in addition to the Crusaders' indoor and outdoor track squads, a leader in Catholic ministry on campus, or as President of both the Science and Engineering Club as well as Fenwick's chapter of the National Honor Society, leadership comes naturally to Rowan not because he demands it, but because is naturally inclined to help others.

"Danny's faith is paramount to his personality," Fenwick Associate Director School and College Counseling Mary Lou McLaughlin said. "He has stated he is most joyful when giving his time and sharing his skills with others."

A Catholic Central League all-star in both soccer and track, Rowan helped his teams qualify for the state tournament as a freshman on the pitch and has competed in state and invitational meets on the track. At the state's recent DECA competition in Boston, Conklin helped Danvers earn a first place finish. Additionally, he is a member of his school's Captains Courses and has been an engaged and active member of a number of other school events.

"As a three-sport captain. Will sets the bar for himself and his teammates very high," Danvers High athletic director Drew Betts stated. "He's an incredibly humble and hard working young man ... a leader in the building who is constantly looking to support both the school and his peers."



Her team went a combined 74-5-5 in her four years on the varsity. Her most meaningful honor was Masco's Jen Daly Award, named for one of the program's late legends.






