



Ring in the New Year with 24th annual celebration

The new year is about to arrive, and Beverly is ready to celebrate.

Beverly's New Year 2018, a special event for the whole family, will be held this year on Sunday, Dec. 31 from 3:30 to 7 p.m. in downtown Beverly.

This is the 24th time that Beverly's New Year has been held, and the number and variety of activities being offered should keep everyone fully entertained until the final countdown arrives.

The fun begins with games and prizes, a New Year's Resolution board and more at Ellis Square, which was renovated this year into a landscaped park, complete with a garden and new seating.

"One of the games will be a ball toss game, and the prizes are stickers." said Heather Wolsey of Beverly Main Streets, which organizes Beverly's New Year. "The committee is still finalizing the other games. There is also free cookie decorating with cookies and frosting donated by Henry's Market. The New Year's Resolution Board will be up again so kids can share their resolutions by

writing them on a Post-it note."

Some of the entertainers who are returning this year include magician Stephanie Beach, who last appeared at Beverly's New Year two years ago, and this year will be at First Baptist Church from 3:45 to 4:30 p.m. A button is required for admission to this performance.

Beach has been working at magic since she was 7, when she watched her father make a coin disappear up his sleeve.

"When he did it, it was like, oh my God," Beach recalled.

She said she is emphasizing magic for kids right now, although she also does parlor shows for adults and stage shows.

"When I do stage shows

I'm going to be getting all the kids involved," Beach said. "My specialty is to make sure that the audience is involved. I want to get the kids up and participating and the families, too."

There will also be a Mad Science show at the First Baptist Church, from 5 to 5:45 p.m., which also requires a button. This event will combine science education with lots of exciting effects for children to enjoy.

But all the fun at Beverly's New Year leads to the Grand Parade, which gets organized at 5:45 p.m. behind 248 Cabot St., at Montserrat College of Art, before heading down Cabot Street at 6 p.m. Participants traditionally wear costumes in the parade,

and may select from those created by former Beverly art teacher Margo Jones, which will be available indoors at Montserrat. Revelers are also encouraged to devise costumes of their own.

"Students from Beverly High School will play musical instruments in the parade, and dancers from Mitchell's Dance Studio

will do a dance routine." Wolsey said. "Weather" permitting, we'll be having a golf cart lead the parade — the Lynch Park utility vehicle."

The parade will start behind Montserrat, then make a left onto Federal Street, a right onto Cabot, go all the way to A&B Burgers, do a U-turn on Cabot Street, head back down to or before St. Mary's Church, do a U-turn, then head back to Federal Street, according to Heather Wolsey of Beverly Main Streets.

The parade will eventually return to the spot where it started for the countdown at 7 p.m., when beach balls will be dropped from on high. Unlike in previous years, the parade will not turn around in the parking lot behind Atomic Cafe. Instead, it will take advantage of extra space being created by the fact


that two blocks of Cabot Street will be closed to traffic this year, instead of only one.

The parade always features a Grand Marshall, who this year will be Jason Andree from Beverly Hospital. As a coordinator of regulatory compliance and patient safety for the past three years, he has worked to ensure that the best possible care is provided, not only at Beverly Hospital, but also at Addison Gilbert Hospital, Lahey Outpatient Center Danvers and Bay-Ridge Hospital.





Choo-choo! Train returns to Cabot Street celebration

All aboard! A train is traveling back to Beverly's New Year 2018 so it can offer rides up and down Cabot Street to New Year's revelers.

Anyone with a Beverly's New Year 2018 button can take a ride on this electric, trackless train, which is operated by Busy Bee Jumpers, a company from East Bridgewater.

several cars, and it does a loop on Cabot, almost a figure eight," said Heather Wol- was disappointed." sey of Beverly Main Streets, which organizes Beverly's New Year.

This is not the first time that train rides have been a big part of Beverly's New Year, but earlier trains - which came from a different company — ran into difficulties.

"We have had a train, maybe four years ago," Wolsey said. "The other train

had a flat tire one year and had trouble, and everyone

At another time, like any commuter in Greater Boston, the train got stuck on the highway.

"One year the Mass Pike was closed, and it never arrived," Wolsey said.

So Beverly Main Streets stopped hiring the train for a while, but that left folks disappointed, because the train rides are popular.

"It was everyone's

favorite," Wolsey said.

The train that will be at Beverly's New Year is called The Royal Express, and while it doesn't run on a track, it keeps to a schedule, just like a real train.

"It runs from 3:45 to 5:45 p.m., so that we can then have the street for the parade," Wolsey said.

The train's specifications were spelled out in a letter from Busy Bee Jumpers.

"The Royal Express is able to transport 16 people at one

time without putting any stress on the battery-powered engine," they said. "The train is whisper quiet and extremely comfortable. The Royal Express features three passenger cars in addition to an engine."

Those cars each have a roof, for protection from the weather, and the train comes prepared with a spare tire. While The Royal Express will not don a costume to join Beverly's New Year Grand Procession, it

doesn't really need one, because it already sports an attractive color scheme.

"The train is beautifully decorated with red, white and blue colors," Busy Bee Jumpers said.

And perhaps best of all, especially during a New Year's Eve celebration, The Royal Express sounds like a real train.

"Our train is equipped with a one-of-a-kind horn to give all of the guests an unforgettable experience," they said.

Video games on wheels visit Beverly's New Year

There are trucks for every kind of purpose: towing cars, hauling packages, delivering heating oil and serving food. Now, there are also 32-foot video game trucks, one of which will be visiting Beverly's New Year 2018.

This luxurious video arcade on wheels is operated by Ultimate Mobile Gaming and features five large, widescreen, high-definition TVs, along with surround sound and plenty of creative lighting.

"They send an attendant, and we'll have a volunteer to make sure everyone is having a fun time playing the game," said Heather Wolsey of Beverly Main Streets.

She said the attendants will also make sure that a time limit is observed, so

everyone can get a chance to play.

"We're going to choose one game for everyone to play that's safe for all ages, and appropriate for everybody," Wolsey said. "That makes it easy for the operator to make sure everyone is having a good time. It's definitely safe and fun for all ages."

Four of the TV screens are on one side of the trailer's interior, while comfortable bench seating is on the other side, with room for between 18 and 20 children to operate game controllers. A fifth screen occupies the nose of the trailer, and is usually played by two kids together, said Matt Elder, who owns Ultimate Mobile Gaming.

Elder started the business in 2013 with one gaming truck, after running a sports youth league in Framingham, and said he now owns three trailers that visit 100

parties a month.

People of all ages enjoy video games, and Elder often takes trailers to postprom parties and college events. He said birthday par- in Tempe, Arizona, in 2006, ties for 7- to 13-year-olds are the core of his business, and that's the age range Wolsey hopes to attract at Beverly's New Year.

"We're always looking to add something new, especially for middle school

students," she said. "Video games are always popular for middle school students."


