Police respond to abduction outcry

No arrest made; law enforcement unable to determine criminal intent

After two days of investigating the reported failed abduction of two local children, police

were not able to identify criminal intent in the incident.

On Thursday, it was reported that two girls, 7 and 8, were walking home from school on Wednesday afternoon when they

were approached by a woman in a vehicle, who offered them something to eat and tried to get them into her car, Seguin Police Crime Prevention Officer Carlos Contreras said.

“One of the juveniles took it upon herself to act appropriately, and attempted to walk away from the suspect, grabbing the other juvenile’s hand as she

walked away going northbound on North Heideke,” he said. “The suspect followed them and circled around within the intersection off north Heideke and east Seidemann Streets. While she was circling around, the aunt of the girls saw that the vehicle was acting suspicious, and after that, approached the vehicle, which ultimately spooked the suspect

away from the incident area.”

During the investigation police identified a suspect and interviewed her, but no arrests were made, Seguin Police Deputy Chief Bruce Ure said in an update on Facebook Friday afternoon.
