The committee must be able to remove the egg after the drop.
- Your container must have a space for judges to write a number.
- Contestants must clean up their materials after the drop.
- **A total of \$1,500 in prize money will be awarded.***

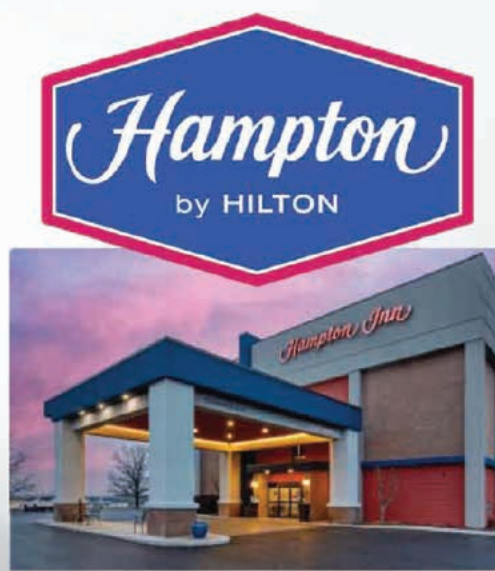

WELCOME TO THE 2026 World Chicken Festival

The World Chicken Festival is egg-cited to welcome you, your family and friends to beautiful downtown London, KY September 24th-27th. We invite you to celebrate our chicken heritage and legacy. All the "egg-citement" and entertainment of four fun filled days makes this one of Kentucky's largest festivals. The festival is home to the World's Largest Stainless-Steel Skillet with over three decades of family fun including crazy contests, free music entertainment, vendors from across the country, carnival rides, and delicious food from non-profit organizations. The festival benefits over 50+ local nonprofits and is one of their biggest fundraisers each year.

Colonel Harland Sanders, founder of Kentucky Fried Chicken, is one of the most highly recognized figures in the world. Located in the heart of the beautiful Daniel Boone National Forest, Laurel County is proud to honor the legacy of the Sanders Café and Museum. The Colonel's first and original restaurant is located in Corbin, Kentucky located in southern Laurel County. Lee Cummings, co-founder of Lee's Famous Recipe Chicken, also began his career in 1952 with his uncle, Colonel Sanders. The annual World Chicken Festival is a tribute to this chicken heritage.

The World Chicken Festival was established in 1990 as a tribute to this heritage and honoring what would have been been Colonel

Harland Sander's 100th birthday. Sanders Café and Museum recently completed in April 2022 a multi-million-dollar expansion of this landmark, which is on the National Register of Historical Places. Experience the new extensive, preservation focused exterior and interior refresh restoration project.

The Stage of Stars, located at Town Center Park, is presented by the City of London and The London Tourisms and Parks. This stage hosts national musical artists. The festival's second music stage is called Sanders Stage, presented by SAM103.9 and Wildcat-Harley Davidson, located on Broad and 6th Street. It is home to local and regional music artists and crazy family fun contests.

The World Chicken Festival is home of the World's Largest Stainless-Steel Skillet established in 1992. It is located behind the Laurel County Courthouse 4th Street and Long Street. The dining tent for the skillet, will be in the parking lot next to the Laurel County Sheriff's Department. Delicious fried chicken snacks and dinners are served on Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and now Sunday from this benchmark feature of the festival the World's Largest Stainless-Steel Skillet.

The skillet is operated by World Chicken Festival volunteers are from the Laurel County African American Heritage Center. The skillet has served more than 120,000 fried chicken dinners since the skillet's in-

auguration in 1992. The skillet is 10 feet, 6inches in diameter, and weighs 700 pounds. It takes three days to assemble the skillet construction of 11 gauges, hot rolled stainless steel divided into four cooking sections; mounted on a steel frame. It requires 300 gallons of cooking oil and can cook 600 quarters of chicken at one time. The skillet can cook 7,000 pieces, requires 375 pounds of flour, 75 pounds of salt, 30 pounds of pepper, 30 pounds of paprika and of course the World Chicken Festival's special ingredients.

The founders of the World Chicken Festival had three goals in mind for the community when creating the mission and vision for this annual fall event. The first goal was to create an opportunity for local and regional entertainment to be highlighted. The second goal was to provide citizens and out-of-town guests access to enjoy the festival without a high cost. The third goal was to give nonprofit organizations opportunities to raise money for their charitable organization.

The festival is a 501 (c) (4) nonprofit organization, taking pride in giving local nonprofit opportunities to raise funds. All food vendors at the festival are reserved only for local nonprofit opportunities to raise funds. All food vendors at the festival are reserved only for local nonprofit organizations. Nonprofit(s) testimonies declare that the festival produces the largest fundraising event of the year for them.

Delicious fried chicken dinners are served from the benchmark feature of the festival The World's Largest Stainless-Steel Skillet. The skillet is operated by World Chicken Festival volunteers and has served more than 120,000 fried chicken dinners since its inauguration in 1992. The world's largest known frying skillet was manufactured by London Bucket Co., Inc. in September 1991, and donated to the World Chicken Festival. The burners and firing system were manufactured by Bakery Machinery, Inc., operated by Rockwell Industries, "Rocky." In 1999, a new skillet was constructed, manufactured by Logan Steel and Jeff Williams Welding.

FUN FACTS ABOUT THE SKILLET



Size: 10ft, 6in in diameter; 8in deep; 8ft handle (on the original skillet, the current skillet doesn't have a handle); and weighs 700 lbs. total.

Construction: 11 gauges, hot rolled stainless steel; divided into four cooking sections; mounted on a steel frame.

Capacity: Requires 300 gallons of cooking oil to fill. Can cook 600 chicken breasts at one time.

Supplies: Cooking 7,000 pieces required about 375 lbs. of flour, 75 lbs of salt, 30 lbs. of pepper, 30 lbs. of paprika, and the World Chicken Festival's special ingredients.

Fuel: About 60 gallons of Natural gas

(more than an average family would use in a year) is required to cook 7,000 pieces of chicken at temperatures between 325 and 350 degrees.

THAT’S A FACT, JACK Blame it on the shutdown. When the Kentucky Headhunters watched their 2020 dates go up in smoke, they knew with or without live dates, they’re a band... and bands have to play. After a half century of coming together at Mama Effie’s Practice House, first as Itchy Brother, then the Kentucky Headhunters, as well as watching next generation hard rockers Black Stone Cherry come into their own sound, the idea of not making music wasn’t something they could stomach.

“We’re a band,” says guitarist/vocalist Richard Young. “We play. When all our shows got cancelled, we decided we were gonna go up to the Practice House and play. Then we figured we might as well go into the studio, but instead of having an agenda or some idea of ‘what’ was this supposed to be, we all looked at each other and went, ‘Well, what do you do?’” “No discussions, no trying to be something. Just ‘What do you want to play?’”

Indeed, That’s A Fact, Jack may be the Kentucky Headhunters most coherent, yet eclectic album ever. Whether the creeping blues-burner “Gonna Be Alright,” the sinewy, sensuous “Susannah,” the slow turn reckoning “We Belong Together” or the dynamic minimalist reflection “Watercolors In the Rain,” the Heads continue sowing the good vibes, the better guitar sounds and enough groove to keep the room rocking.

From the first drum crack and building pound of “That’s A Fact, Jack,” there’s a plea to come to our senses, drill down and find ways to come together. That notion of coming together informs the hip-checking shuffle of “How Could I,” a more personally beseeching song of apology and fixing it with some searing guitar and a tumbling backbeat.

Blame it on England. When the Kentucky Headhunters were growing up, the rock & roll coming across “the pond” - hard rock bands Led Zeppelin, CREAM, Cactus and the Rolling Stones, as well as the Beatles, Kinks and Faces made its way to Edmonton, Kentucky where Richard and Fred Young and their cousin Greg Martin were raised. It also permeated the Missouri bootheel, where Doug Phelps, who was born in Leachville, Arkansas, grew up.

“Susannah” was first inspired from the passing of one of Doug’s long time musical influences and eventual friend, Levon Helm, drummer and vocalist for The Band. “He and I were both born in Arkansas and I always felt a connection to him because of that,” he says. “It hit me pretty hard when I heard of Levon’s passing and I just kept hearing him sing ‘Ophelia’ in my head. That led me to singing ‘Susannah’ in its place and once that started, the story fell into place for me and I couldn’t write the lyrics down fast enough! It became a song about the special women that love and support their ‘music man’ and how they understand what it is that drives us.”

Something about the mods, the rockers, the twist of the classic American blues of Howling Wolf and Muddy Waters got under those boys’ skins. Even during their multi-platinum dominance of country music, winning Country Music Association, Academy of Country Music and American Music Awards, the Headhunters were always more a rock band with rural roots than a country band with big amps.

“I didn’t fly. I was scared,” laughs Richard Young. “So even when things were rocking, we didn’t go to England, or Europe, and anywhere that needed a plane. We had the music, and that was

what England was to us. “But when Black Stone Cherry took off over there, John Fred (his son) set it all up for us to go. We went over to Scandinavia and played SwedenRock first, opening for Queen... It was like we, the Kentucky Headhunters, had made it. Decades later, there we were on this rock festival two bands down the bill from Queen.

“Then we got to England, loaded into Sprinter vans - and when we pulled up at the Borderline, there was a line of people around the block!

“We’d never made it to England, the place we pulled so much influence from, but our music had.”

Blame it on Carnaby Street. When London was swinging and Itchy Brother was playing their heavy rock/blues around the American South and almost getting signed to Zeppelin’s Swan Song Records, the future Grammy-winners were sopping up the long-legged birds, hip-hugger fashions and sense of a psychedelic grooviness that is more present on That’s A Fact, Jack than at any time in one of the most far-ranging and eclectic careers in American music.

“When we got to England, people were holdin’ up cards that said, ‘Stumblin’,” Young marvels. “They even knew the Johnnie Johnson records we’ve made together. They knew all the blues stuff, the rock & roll stuff. It was magical... And since we’d never been there when it was all happening, Fred wrote ‘Cup of Tea,’ which is all about what that era was all about. It’s 1968 and Carnaby Street and all those girls and bands and innocence.” The Merseybeat-steeped “Cup” draws on a time long gone, but somehow feels fresh and sparkling in the innocence of drummer Fred Young’s raw- boned vocal delivery. The drummer brother also contributes a full-frontal take on Rick

Derringer’s “Cheap Tequila,” equally redolent of a time when rock was wild, untamed and elegantly squalid.

Blame it on nostalgia. But only the most frisky, vital sense. When the Heads converged on Barrick Record Studio in Glasgow, Kentucky, they were amazed at how fluid and fun these sessions were. Young admits, “To be honest, this band plays everything... and we just decided to play everything we loved. T.J. Lyle from the (Georgia) Thunderbolts was up visiting. We got to writing lyrics to some of these songs.

“Like ‘How Could I,’ it’s about the generations and how life goes. I was this old cat up at the Practice House writing with Black Stone Cherry, remembering Itchy Brother and the girls coming around - and how some of those girls became our wives. It all goes ‘round, don’t it?”

“And when we decided to just play what we loved, Fred wanted Greg to sing ‘Cheap Tequila,’ because he has that Rick Derringer kinda voice. But Greg wanted to do something else. ‘Cheap Tequila’ was one of those songs we all just loved, so Fred did it. But Greg said, ‘If we’re doing this, then I want to sing ‘Shotgun Effie.’ I wrote those lyrics and we did it in ‘73 and I wanna do it again now.’”

“Shot Gun Effie,” with its seek-and-destroy guitar riff and hammer down drumming, was Itchy Brothers very first single. Still in high school, it was the first record the boys put out, and nearly fifty years later, this raging ode to a silver-haired leadfoot, Grandmother Effie, is every bit as raucous and fun.

Blame it on semantics. Heck, blame it on a world that’s slightly off its kilter. Wildly apolitical, the Headhunters have always been about spreading the love, the joy, the come together. Whether it was a heavy take on Bill Monroe’s “Walk Softly On This Heart of Mine,” a torqued up read on Cargill Henson’s “Skip-A-Rope,” or a psyche-blues spin on Norman Greenbaum’s “Spirit In The Sky,” the Headhunters continue to lift folks up, lighten their load and bring people together.

“Growing up in a hippie nation, growing up with all that British music, it was a great time to be learning all this stuff. We’ve always been positive musicians who were influenced by the hippie coalition of the ‘60s. ‘Gonna Be Alright’ is a keep your chin up and care about each other track, ‘That’s a Fact, Jack’ is something your Dad’d say about getting on with it, because that’s a part of getting through where we are now. In the ‘60s and ‘70s, people were people and politics didn’t define you, what was in your heart did. That’s what it’s really about.

“So, this album, beyond all the fun of just getting in there and playing, is a statement for our society in these times, and an offering of what we think people need right now. You know, in Europe, we’re played on Planet Rock and classic rock stations. They don’t even think about what we might be labeled here, they take us on the music. There’s a lot for all of us to take from that.

“Don’t worry about the labels, man. How’s it make you feel? If you ask me, this is modern society Southern rock & roll. It’s for the times and the people. It’s all the influences and all the things we love, all the things with no borders or worrying about what doesn’t fit.”

Now That’s A Fact, Jack.

J.D. SHELBURNE has gone from a tobacco farm in Taylorsville, Kentucky, to the upper reaches of country music. The Nashville-based singer/songwriter found a guitar after returning home at 19 for his grandmother's funeral, learned how to play, and began writing and singing his own songs. By his sophomore year of college, J.D. was playing gigs at local bars in Louisville and Lexington, building a fan base that is still expanding. His debut single and video, "One Less Girl," made its world premiere on CMT in 2018 and went on to the Music Row chart's Top 30 with more than thirty adds at country radio. CMT again provided the world premiere of his second song and video, "She Keeps Me Up Nights" in April of 2019. Considered one of the hardest-working artists in show business, J.D. has played over 3000 shows, and the accolades and accomplishments that followed have been the stuff of dreams.

J.D.'s album *Straight From Kentucky*, released in June of 2021, took him to the iTunes Top Ten for the first time in his career, with the title track becoming a modern-day state anthem featured in Texas Roadhouse Restaurants nationwide. "Church Pew Bar Stool" reached #1 on the CMT 12-Pack in its first week of release. The follow-up, "Hometown In My Headlights," premiered by Newsmax and People and landed at #2 on CMT 12-Pack and in the Top 40 on the Music Row chart in 2021. "Fine by Me" premiered on "Sounds Like Nashville" and most recently "The Road I Grew Up On" premiered on Heartland Network and CMT.com. J.D.'s current album, *Neon Hallelujah*, was released in July 2023. Its title track premiered on "The Boot" in February and the official video reached #2 on the CMT 12-Pack, with the follow-up, "Cars & Trucks," hitting #1 on CMT and the American Country Network in 2024/25 — marking eight straight music videos on CMT! Country Music Hall of Fame Members The Oak Ridge Boys collaborated with Shelburne on "Amazing Grace" for the same album. The year 2024 was a record-breaker for J.D., as he wrapped up a tour of 110 dates, and 2025 has kicked off with a bang, as he'll release his seventh album "Raised on the Good Stuff" in addition to another 150 -plus tour dates including his recent Grand Ole Opry Debut in July and his new Kentucky Straight Bourbon Whiskey on shelves all over Kentucky. "The dream keeps getting bigger," says J.D., "and I'm grateful for every day and every fan."

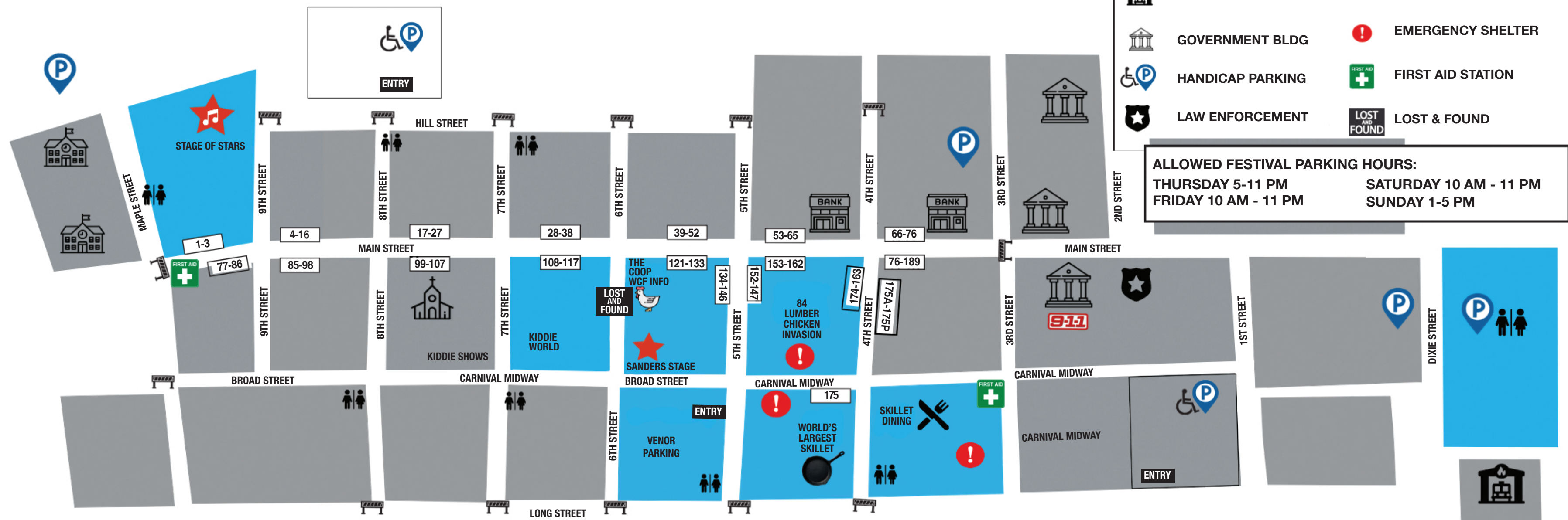

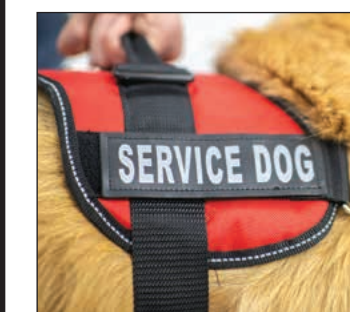

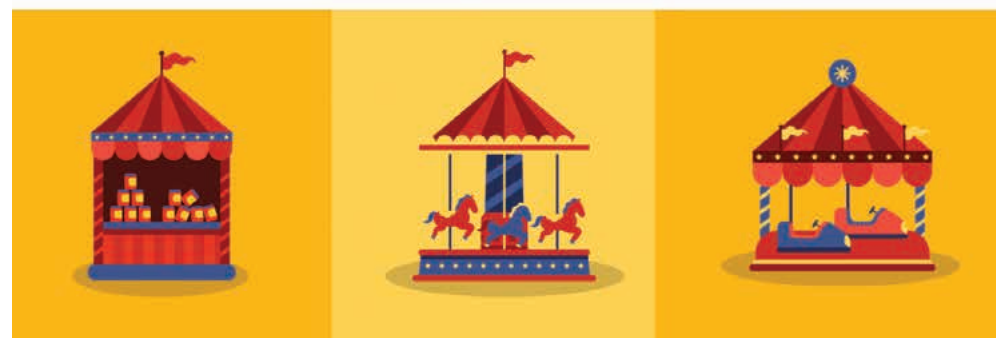

FireHouse has been rockin' for over three decades. Their music has taken them all over the world and has produced gold, platinum, and multi-platinum records in the United States and abroad. Their career began in 1990 with the release of their self-titled debut album FireHouse on Epic Records.

The band's first single release to metal radio, Shake & Tumble, enjoyed impressive success, selling over 100,000 copies instantaneously. The band then released Don't Treat Me Bad, which became their first Top Ten hit. This was followed by Love of a Lifetime, which also entered the Top Ten, reaching the #3 spot on the United States charts and was awarded Bridal Magazine's "Wedding Song of the Year".

This string of hits vaulted FireHouse's self-titled debut album to double platinum status in the United States, and it also went gold in Canada and several countries in Asia. At the 1992 American Music Awards, FireHouse found themselves accepting the award for Best New Hard Rock/Metal Band in 1991, chosen over Nirvana and Alice in Chains.

The band's second album, released in 1992, Hold Your Fire, produced hits such as Reach for the Sky, Sleeping with You, and When I Look into Your Eyes, which peaked at #5 on the US charts. This album earned the band two more gold albums and sold over 2 million copies worldwide.

In 1995, FireHouse released their third album on Epic Records, simply titled 3. Once again, FireHouse

produced another Top Twenty hit in the United States with I Live My Life For You and reached the #1 spot in several markets around the country. Their fourth album, Good Acoustics, was released in 1996 and quickly went gold in six countries. Good Acoustics contains unplugged versions of the group's greatest hits, as well as four new songs. This album produced foreign hits such as In Your Perfect World, Love Don't Care, and You Are My Religion. It also includes a cover of The Eagles' Seven Bridges Road and has received massive critical acclaim.

To date, FireHouse has released 9 albums, selling over 7 million records worldwide. They have been a part of countless compilations like Monster Ballads, which sold over a million

copies in the US. They have shared the stage with some of the biggest names in music, and several FireHouse songs have been featured in TV shows and movies. In 2008, Don't Walk Away was featured in the movie The Wrestler, and in 2022, Don't Treat Me Bad was featured in the HBO hit series Peacemaker.

After CJ Snare's untimely passing, Nate Peck was announced as the band's new lead singer in May 2024. With CJ's blessing, he had been filling in since October 2023 while CJ was recovering from surgery. Nate is a vocal phenom who captured America's attention after receiving his "Golden Ticket" on American Idol in March 2023. He has garnered unwavering support and approval from FireHouse's entire fanbase.

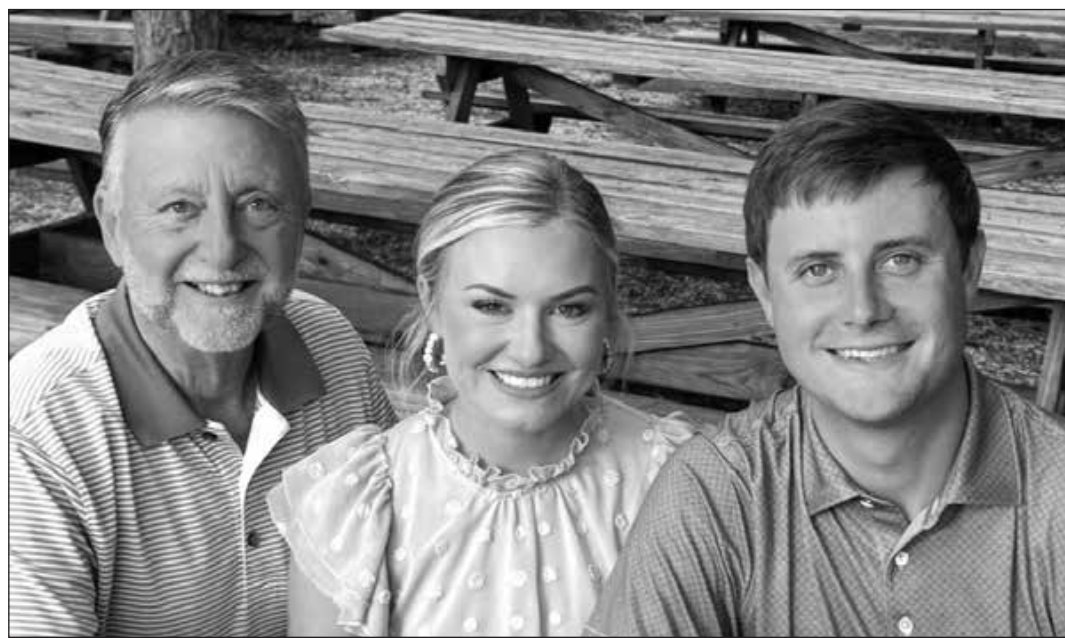

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IN MEMORY

LONDON — There are few areas of Laurel County's history that London native Tom Handy didn't touch during his 82 years.

His impact stretches from nearly 40 years in law — 28 as 27th Circuit Commonwealth's Attorney for Knox and Laurel counties — to being a founder of the World Chicken Festival through the London-Laurel County Tourist Commission, still being a board member at the time of his passing.

Handy was one of the founders of the World Chicken Festival as a board member of the London-Laurel County Tourist Commission and long-time chair of that board, a supporter of London's homeless shelter, as well as an advocate for victims rights — especially for children. He was instrumental in establishing a victims advocate in the judicial system as well as being on the committee for the design of the Laurel County Judicial Center. Watching the drug epidemic in southeastern Kentucky rise over the years, Handy became involved with Congressman Hal Rogers' Operation UNITE, where he served as a board member. His leadership also earned him a spot on the Kentucky Leadership committee and he was one of three founders of the Leadership Tri-County which was established in 1987 to develop leadership among Laurel, Knox and Whitley county leaders. He was also active with mission trips for First Christian Church of London, participating in ventures to build homes and share the ministry in foreign countries.

Handy also dabbled in film and politics. His parents operated Town Center Hotel on Main Street, when Hollywood classic Burt Lancaster starred in the 1955 film, "The Kentuckian." The crew filmed scenes in Levi Jackson State Park and stayed at Town Center during their filming. A young Handy and his brother Jim were "extras" in the movie. Town Center Park is so named in honor of the legacy of the Handy family business.

Handy's uncle, Fred Lucas, was a state senator and influenced Handy in the political field. His aunt, Opal Lucas, was the National Republican Chair, and she and Handy's mother Lou were instrumental in having the original plan of I-75 running between London and Somerset changed to run through London. Handy ran for Kentucky Attorney General in 1991 and threw his hat into the 1995 Governor's race as running mate for the Larry Forgy gubernatorial ticket. Although he was defeated in both races, Handy continued to advocate for victims as Commonwealth's Attorney until his retirement.

Tom and Jim Handy were also promoting tourism in the community long before tourism became an economic focus. They built the first high-scale hotel — Ramada Inn — off Exit 38 (now the site of Baymont Inn) and operated The Charcoal House, a popular meeting spot for many years. They then built a motel off Exit 41 with an attached restaurant, The Haymarket, the site of the new GoTime complex.

In later years, Handy was also instrumental in the development of the Sheppard Family Basketball Court at the London-Laurel Wellness Park, which recognizes former UK basketball standouts, Jeff Sheppard and wife Staci, as well as their daughter Madison and son, Reed Sheppard.

Reed Sheppard played for the University of Kentucky for one season before being a #3 draft pick currently playing for the Houston Rockets. The park sign recognizes all regional and state team members from Laurel County.

Danny Evans, who worked with Handy as a prosecutor for 25 years, described Handy as not only a co-worker but a mentor and close friend.

"Tom hired me as Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney in 1978 and I worked with him until his retirement in 2003. He was outstanding in the legal field, in jury trials, an excellent public speaker and a great friend," Evans said.

Handy's dedication to serving justice and serving victims was an impactful role as Commonwealth's Attorney. He prosecuted many high profile cases including murders.

"Tom would take on difficult tasks that he didn't have to, such as several capital murder cases," Evans continued. "He was a mentor to me. Every young attorney needs a Tom Handy in their life."

That sentiment was seconded by members of the London-Laurel Tourist Commission. Executive Director Kim Collier praised Handy's contributions to the commission and tourism in general.

"Tom was a great leader and mentor. He always made thoughtful decisions about the business of

the tourist commission. He was a wealth of knowledge about the tourism industry and after 47 years with the commission, I would call him an expert on the subject. Tom never backed down from a good debate and man, those debates could be long," she said. "I learned a lot working with Tom over the last 14 years and I am thankful to have had that opportunity. I know I can speak for the entire commission when I say we will all miss his guidance and

friendship. Our prayers are with his family at this time."

London-Laurel County Tourist Commission Chair Jamie Harrison also commended Handy for his dedication to the community.

"Tom Handy's passing is a profound loss for the community. He was deeply passionate about growing London and Laurel County into a true tourist destination. His leadership, insight and dedication left a lasting mark and his guidance and wisdom will be greatly missed by all knew him."

"Besides his volunteer work in tourism, Tom was someone who cared about people and the future of this community," Harrison continued. "His vision and commitment will continue to inspire those who carry his efforts forward. His legacy will live on in the progress he helped create and the lives he touched."

Commonwealth's Attorney Jackie Steele volunteered to work under Handy, coming on board in 2002, just prior to Handy's retirement.
