In other words, the Township should do their job. Mr. Crider has an absolute protected right to bring these matters to light, and he will continue to do so for as long as the Township refuses to do even the simplest of things to address the needs of the residents on Pineville Road. The planning & zoning board and township supervisors are in fact public servants, and rather than hiring an attorney to write Mr. Crider a letter, I would suggest they get on a backhoe and actually address the concerns of all the residents on Pineville Road, not just himself.
