Safety first at the beach

When the sun is shining and the temperature is warm, a day at the beach can be the perfect balm for whatever ails you. Is it any wonder that so many vacations or day-long excursions revolve around spending time at the shore? Although a beach excursion can be the ideal way to rest and recharge, individuals should be mindful that there is the potential for some danger. Safety is essential when visiting coastal locations. The following are some safety hazards to keep in mind and how to navigate them.

Rip currents
Rip currents are powerful, channeled currents of water that flow away from the shore. The National Oceanic Atmospheric Administration notes rip currents can occur at any beach. Lifeguards call rip currents “drowning machines” since they are implicated in most water rescues. They are very dangerous for weak or non-swimmers because they can pull people away from the shore rapidly. If a person gets caught in a rip

current, it is important to swim parallel to the shore until escaping the current. Only then can the person try to get back to the beach.

Hookworms
There is a reason why companion animals may not be allowed on the beach during the swimming season. The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention says hookworm is a parasitic infection contracted when larvae in sand or soil contaminated by animal feces burrow into exposed skin. It is common in moist, warm climates. Keeping cats and dogs away from the beach, wearing sandals, and using beach mats or towels when on the sand can help prevent hookworm contraction.

Jellyfish
Jellyfish can be a wonder to behold, but crossing paths with a jellyfish can be a painful experience. The National History Museum says jellyfish have survived for more than 500 million years. These invertebrates are gelatinous and jelly-like, with a curved,



bell-shaped body with tentacles hanging down. The tentacles can be covered in stinging cells called cnidocytes. Beach-goers should heed warnings about jellyfish in the water, but also be mindful of ones washed

up as they can still sting if the tentacles are wet.

Sand fleas
Despite the word “flea” in the moniker, sand fleas are not insects or parasites. Terminix says they

are small, shrimp-like crustaceans. While sand fleas do not seek out people to bite them, certain species can leave itchy, red welts if they come into prolonged contact with the skin. This may be more pronounced for women or girls when sand fleas become trapped between swimsuits and the skin. Sand fleas are more active during cooler, low-light periods like early morning or evening.

shards becoming left behind. Cuts from broken bottles can lead to infection. Beach-goers also need to be mindful of other debris that can wash up on the beach, particularly after strong storms. Unfortunately, medical waste, trash, and drug paraphernalia can wash up on the shore. Wearing sandals or water-safe shoes can protect feet.

A carefree day at the beach is a staple of summertime. However, people must be mindful of potential hazards when enjoying a day at the beach.

Popular backyard games and activities



Backyards are experiencing a resurgence in recent years. Driven largely by a collective desire to reduce screen time, which has surged among many age

groups, particularly children, families are investing in physical play and recreational options at home. Indeed, All About Play notes the global outdoor toy market is a growing industry valued at around \$23 billion in 2026. Fortune Business Insights says outdoor play has an expected steady growth of 4.65 percent annually through 2034.

Modern outdoor spaces feature far more grass and a swing set. Such areas have evolved into activity hubs for everyone who wants to spend time in the yard. Whether a home-

owner has a small patio or sprawling acreage, these games can make outdoor entertaining spaces more fun.

- Cornhole: A reigning champion of “toss” games, cornhole has legions of fans. Hard core players may want to invest in regulation-sized solid wood seats and weather-resistant professional bags.
- Pickleball: Portable pickleball nets allow for quick pop-up courts on grass or driveways.
- Supersized games: Large versions of popular indoor games like Connect 4® and Jenga® enable play

to be more hands-on and physical.

- Active play: The rise of digital active play systems has moved outdoors. Systems like Nex, for example, employ motion sensors to turn a backyard into a live-action video game. This bridges the gap for tech-savvy kids and adults who want to spend more time outdoors.
- Virtual reality: In a similar vein, players can take VR gear outdoors and enjoy the same rush of virtual play while outside in the fresh air.
- Modular playgrounds: All About Play says recent

industry reports indicate the North American outdoor play structure market is expected to reach \$850 million by 2033. Families are prioritizing one-stop play environments that include modular set-ups. Instead of single-use equipment, families are looking for systems that combine trampolines, adjustable basketball hoops and climbing frames, among other options.

Moving outdoors into the yard for recreation can be good for physical and mental health. Trends indicate certain backyard activities are particularly popular.

Green tomatoes not just for the frying pan

Perhaps in part due to the popular 1991 film “Fried Green Tomatoes,” many people are familiar with the Southern United States side dish of the same name. But as proven by the following recipe for “Grilled Green Tomato ‘Sandwiches’ with Herbed Cream Cheese” from Karen Adler and Judith Fertig’s “The Gardener & The Grill” (Running Press), green tomatoes can be even more delicious when grilled than they are when fried.

Grilled Green Tomato “Sandwiches” with Herbed Cream Cheese
Serves 6

Herbed Cream Cheese
1 8-ounce package cream cheese at room temperature
1 garlic clove, minced
2 tablespoons

chopped fresh basil
1 tablespoon
snipped fresh chives

Tomatoes
4 large green tomatoes (about 1 1/2 pounds), sliced 3/4-inch thick (to make 12 slices)
Olive oil, for brushing
2 teaspoons Seasoning Salt (see below) or kosher salt
Ground black pepper

Prepare a medium-hot fire in your grill. Place a well-oiled perforated grill rack over direct heat. In a bowl, blend the cream cheese, garlic, basil, and chives together until smooth. Set aside. Brush the tomato slices with olive oil on both sides and season with seasoning salt and pepper. Place the slices on a baking sheet

and bring out to the grill with the bowl of Herbed Cream Cheese and a knife for spreading.

Grill all of the tomatoes on one side for about 3 minutes with the lid open, then flip and grill on the other side for 3 minutes more, or until the tomatoes have good grill marks.

Remove the tomato slices from the grill and allow to cool slightly on the baking sheet. Spread Herbed Cream Cheese on half of the slices, top with a second slice and set the sandwiches on a platter. Serve the sandwiches hot, with oozing cream cheese filling.

Variation: Grill all of the tomato slices as above and top each grilled tomato with a dollop of the cream cheese and serve open-faced.

Seasoning Salt

Makes 1 1/4 cups

1 cup sea salt
2 tablespoons paprika
1 teaspoon parsley flakes
1 teaspoon dried chives
1 teaspoon black pepper
1/2 teaspoon dried marjoram leaves
1/2 teaspoon celery seed
1/2 teaspoon curry powder
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder
1/4 teaspoon red pepper

Combine all of the ingredients in a glass jar and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Shake to blend. This keeps for several months in the pantry.
