

County Administrator

Tobi Lake is the county administrator and is appointed by the board of commissioners. The primary responsibilities of the administrator include supervising the daily operations of the county, offering insight and recommendations to the board of commissioners, carrying out directives of the board of commissioners, serving as a liaison between the board of commissioner and county offices, and providing risk management, contract, personnel, financial, and property/facilities oversight.

Additionally, the county administrator is responsible for providing operational and professional support to the board of commissioners, and county committees and departments.

In addition to administration staff, the following departments directly report to the county administrator: building and grounds, building inspection, emergency services, equalization/tax mapping, information technology, medical examiner, and central dispatch.

Trial Court

The trial court combines the district court, probate court and circuit court. In Michigan, the circuit court has the broadest powers of the trial courts. It handles all civil cases with claims of more than \$25,000 and all felony criminal cases when the accused, if found guilty, could be sent to prison.

The family division of circuit court handles divorce, paternity, adoptions, personal protection actions, emancipation of minors, treatment and testing of infectious disease, safe delivery of newborns, name changes, juvenile offenses and delinquency, juvenile guardianship,



and child abuse and neglect. The circuit court also hears cases appealed from the other trial courts or from administrative agencies.

The friend of the court office — part of the family division of the circuit court — handles domestic relations cases when minor children are involved. District courts handle most traffic violations, civil cases with claims of up to \$25,000, landlord-tenant matters, most traffic tickets and misdemeanor criminal cases.

Probate court's duties include managing wills, administering estates and trusts and appointing guardians and conservators, as well as ordering treatment for the mentally ill and developmentally disabled.

Animal Control

Lake County runs an animal shelter to house lost and surrendered pets, with two officers operating the facility and caring for the animals. In addition, the officers respond to calls for help, including lost animals, nuisance complaints, animal bites, injured animals and ani-



mal cruelty. Officers attempt to bring lost animals back to their families by keeping a list of missing animals and those that are found in hopes of making a match. Animal Control encourages Lake County residents to have pets' current identification tags and licenses attached to the collar so they can be identified and returned promptly. Animal Control officers are also responsible for enforcing animal regulation laws and/or ordinances and capturing biting, vicious, diseased, loose or stray animals.







U.S. Forest Service

Lying between the shores of Lake Michigan and Lake Huron in the northern half of the Lower Peninsula of Michigan, the Huron-Manistee National Forests are 976,043 acres of public lands.

With many recreation opportunities for visitors, habitat for fish and wildlife and resources for local industry, there is something here for everyone.

Each year the forest receives approximately 4 million recreation visits.

The Baldwin/White Cloud District is the southern most district on the Manistee portion of the Huron-Manistee National Forests. Camping, hiking, fishing, hunting, firewood collection and many other recreation activities are available. Firewood permits, Christmas tree permits and information about popular recreation sites and opportunities are available at the U.S. Forest Service Office in Baldwin, Michigan. Watercraft permits for the Pine and Pere Marquette rivers are available online at www.recreation.gov or by calling (877) 444-6777. The permit season is from the Friday before Memorial Day to the Monday of Labor Day.

Reservations can be made for the permit season starting Jan. 2 at 12: 01 a.m. When calling the call center at Recreation.gov, select option 2 to reach the desk for the watercraft permits.

You can save a copy of the permit to a PDF and keep it on your phone or print it on paper. If you choose to keep the PDF on your phone, you will need to have your phone on you during your trip so you can show you have your permit if you are asked. You have to print the permit on paper as a PDF for the permit to be considered issued. The confirmation email will not be accepted as proof of a permit.

Lake County Historical Museum

Said to be the "Jewel of Lake County," the Lake County Historical Museum has become the place for people to meet, experience firsthand the history of the area and learn about heritage. The historical complex consists of a new structure, the Boat House, which connects two renovated 1938 United State Forest Service district ranger residences serving as the Museum and Community House.

Monthly programs featuring a variety of topics from the Memories of Big Star Lake to the Stories of Idlewild are free and open to the public and held the second Wednesday of each month at the Community House. This space can be rented for private events by the public in addition to serving as program space for the museum.

Tours of the museum are given

Wednesday through Saturdays, noon to 4 p.m., from April through December. Exhibits rotate so there is always something new to see. Displays in 2019 feature 100 years of bridal fashions. Lake County youth camps, history of Marlborough and Idlewild, logging, Kurt Kahl's photo shop and later in the vear The Norwood Looms weaving shop. Kids can blow the Gabriel and call the loggers to dinner, make their own log mark and dress in vintage style clothing for a photo in Kahl's photo studio. The Boat House will highlight not only the 1949 Chris Craft Runabout, but a Pere Marquette fiberglass canoe, a Kalamazoo folding boat and a MacDougall guide boat. History of fishing the Pere Marquette River is told through stories of early fishing guides and the large mural of the 1935 river system. Special

focus in 2019 will be on Josephine Sedlecky-Borsum and Ed's Sport Shop with an exhibit depicting the shop and her famous fly-tying history.

For those interested in learning more about the area, a family or event, the Research Library is open Wednesdays from noon to 4 p.m. or by appointment.

The Martin Johnson Heritage Museum, Skinner Park, 10 1/2 Mile Road, Irons, is dedicated to Martin Gustave Johnson (1859-1931). Johnson was an artist, artisan, farmer and philanthropist who donated property for the YMCA of Chicago. The museum includes a restored artist college from around 1901 and an one-room school house from 1901 with artifacts including pantings, Camp Martin Johnson memorabilia, Big Bass Lake history and artifacts from Irons and Lake County.

Idlewild, a historic 'hot spot' in Lake County

Founded in 1912, Idlewild remains a historic and culturally significant community here and beyond. Idlewild is on the National Register of Historic Places. Idlewild represented freedom for many African-Americans, being one of more than 30 resorts in the country where African-Americans were permitted to vacation and purchase property before such discrimination became illegal in 1964 when the Civil Rights Act opened other resorts to African-Americans and marked the end of Idlewild's boom times. Commonly known as "Black Eden," Idlewild was an active, year-round community through the mid-1960s frequented by well-known entertainers and professionals from throughout the country. According to Michigan State University, at its peak, Idlewild was the most popular African-American resort in the Midwest and as many as 25,000 people would come to Idlewild in the height of the summer season to enjoy camping, swimming, boating, fishing, hunting, horseback riding, roller skating and night-time entertainment.

Today, Idlewild still draws lot of interest from those seeking history and African-American heritage. At about 3,000 acres, it is historically the largest land-based African -American resort ever assembled in the nation. There has been investment in Idlewild with the State of

Michigan DNR opening an Idlewild Lake access and picnic area (shown in top photo) in recent years. The Cultural and Heritage Center, 7025 Broadway Ave., is a multi-purpose facility that tells the story of the community in many ways. It is open in summer.

Williams Island is a site of summer music festivals, including the Idlewild Music Fest. Idlewild's lakes and public beach access offer boating, swimming and relaxation. Plus, the headwaters of the Pere Marquette River run through Idlewild, a community that says of itself, "Yesterday's jewel, tomorrow's treasure."

How Baldwin got its name



In 1872, the Village of Baldwin was incorporated and named in honor of Michigan Gov. Henry P. Baldwin. In appreciation, Gov. Baldwin sent an American flag that was 13 feet by 24 feet, which remains with the Lake County Historical Society today. Although the original county seat in 1871 was Chase, Michigan, Baldwin became the seat in 1875.

In April 1884, a train carrying German brown trout poured its cargo into the Baldwin River.

This was the first planting of German brown trout in the United States.

Baldwin remains an attractive town known for outdoor recreation such as fishing, hunting, camping, ORV and hiking trails and snowmobiling.






