Laura Sanders is a Grand Rap-ids native who decided to make Ludington her home in 2016.




Laura and her husband, Corey, were recently married last fall and live in Hamlin Township.



Connexion Point one year later

Last year's winner of the Ludington Daily News Room Redo contest was Connexion Point at 309 N. Rowe St. in Ludington.

Connexion Point was looking for some work to be completed to its basement for a gathering space, and the Room Redo designers of the felt it was the right project at the right time.

The basement is a 18foot by 18-foot area that the board of the nonprofit organization planned to use for weekly or biweekly spiritual meetings for men and women in recovery wrote Connexion Point Board Member Beth Kirby in her application.

Following the several weeklong make-over a year ago, the basement was transformed into a gathering space.

"I am speechless right now," Dr. Michelle Kuster said after the unveiling. "It is so warm and welcoming. I can't wait for everybody to see it. This will be a perfect



gathering space for us." Beth Kirby was equally

thrilled with the space. "I was completely floored by the transformation of it," Kirby said. "It was dark and dirty before. It was a basement that was just used for storage, and now it is perfect for the gatherings."

"We have a brand new chandelier, and the recessed lighting was installed within the last year," she said in her application.





The Kelleys sought the help of the Room Redo design team and their space was selected as one of the Room Redo finalists.


