Downtown merchants look ahead to holiday shopping

It's been a little tougher for some area businesses to stock up for the holidays this year, but there's still plenty to be had in downtown Ludington.

Some merchants pointed to shipping delays and material shortages, while others, through fortune or foresight, have found themselves in a better position.

At Mariellen's Hallmark, Christmas versions of popular Squishmallow plush toys are stuck somewhere in the supply chain, according to Lead Associate Jane Scott. But otherwise, she said Hallmark's stock is packed with "hot items" that you should snag sooner rather than later.

"If you see something in the store, buy it now," she said.

Slide-on slippers in particular have been a "big seller" this year, and lanterns decorated with snow have been "flying out the door," she said.

Lori Riemer, owner of Grateful Heart & Home, said she saw supply issues coming and got "fully stocked" ahead of time.

The shelves in Riemer's store are also well-stocked because many of her items, like candles, glass and jewelry, are locally sourced. Other items like pillows and watercolor paintings are sometimes even

made by store staff.

And as far as Christmas ornaments are concerned, Riemer said she's got them "up to here," raising her hand to the top of her head.

In the case of Everest Athleisure, its vendors aren't "getting the material to build the product," owner Carin Greiner said. And even if they do, shipping has been "a nightmare."

What once took three days to ship could take 10 or 15, if it arrives in the right place at all.

She said she's been pushing cus-

tomers to take advantage of special ordering. Customers can have Everest place an order for any of their brands on their wholesale website.

Nevertheless, Everest Athleisure has been "extremely busy," she said. She's heard in general that downtown merchants have had plenty of foot traffic, but not enough product.

"It sounds like in past years it was kind of reversed," Greiner said.

Greiner said her holiday sales

this year will likely consist of clothing in leftover sizes, up to 50 percent off select items and a gift card promotion.

Regardless of the exact circumstances at individual merchants, "everybody has their little hiccups," Greiner said.

Mary Murphy, who works at Snyder's Shoes, had a straightforward message for holiday shoppers this season.

"Just shop local," Murphy said. "Support your small businesses."

- Malbec and Carménère: Similar to Merlot, these grapes originated in France but then made their way to other regions of the world. Malbec is most popular in Argentina, while Carménère is grown in Chile.

- Zinfandel: Although mostly associated with the rosé wine White Zinfandel, Zinfandel is actually a medium-bodied red wine that originated in Croatia.

- Pinot Noir: Soft tannins and high acid give this light-bodied red wine its appeal. The grapes were first widely planted in France but can now be found elsewhere.

- Chianti: Chianti is the most famous Italian red wine in North America. It's a dry red that pairs very well with food. Chianti, which comes from the Chianti region in Tuscany, is made exclusively with Sangiovese grapes, or at least 80 percent of them and other blends.

- Chardonnay: This is a medium- to full-bodied dry white wine. The Chardonnay grape is a white grape from the Burgundy region of France.

- Sauvignon Blanc: Citrus-driven and often light-bodied, Sauvignon Blanc is another dry white grape

planted widely in France. It also is a parent grape to Cabernet Sauvignon.

- Pinot Gris/Pinot Grigio: Pinot Grigio is a zesty, dry white wine that is particularly associated with Italy even though it originated in France, where it is thought to be a mutation of the Pinot Noir grape. Pinot Grigio skins are not green like other white grapes, but have a gray hue, hence the name.

- Reisling: Those who prefer a sweet white wine can opt for Reisling, which can be traced to Germany. It can be a good match for those who appreciate other sweet white wines, such as Moscato or Gewürztraminer.

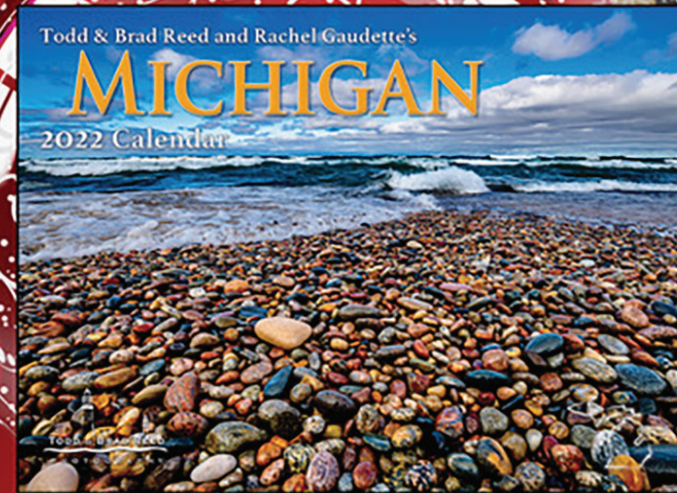
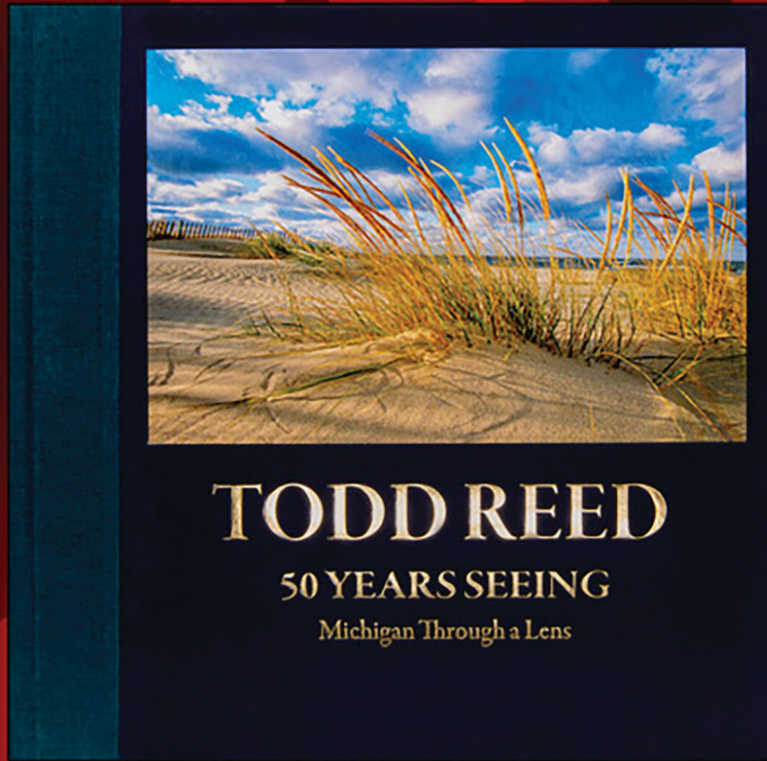
