

The City has received a letter from Angi Whitrock of Electric Innovations for a permit to install underground cable commencing at the Jones Street entrance driveway of 623 Jennings Street, then west across Jones Street, then north for approximately 200 feet to the northwest corner of 7th Street and Jones Street, where a hand hole will be placed, then west for 360 feet to the south side of 701 Jackson Street, were a hand hole will be placed before crossing onto private property at 701 Jackson Street.

The fiber optic is being installed to serve the address of 701 Jackson Street.

This fiber permit approval is recommended by staff to continue to provide optical telecommunications services to the area.

Pursuant to municipal ordinance, permits are granted by the City Council to install underground cable to those companies not holding a franchise with the City. In the past, the Council has been concerned about exclusivity with respect to the granting of these permits. The City is prohibited from granting any type of exclusive rights to a cable company, a telecommunications company, a gas company or an electric company under the laws of the State of Iowa. Therefore, we cannot require anybody to use the facilities of Electric Innovations or any other telephone company.

The attached route has been reviewed by several City Departments.



RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests the City Council approve the Resolution granting a permit to FiberComm of Sioux City, Iowa, to perform underground construction in the City's right-of-way for the installation of fiber optic network services commencing at the northwest corner of the intersection of Indiana Avenue and Morningside Avenue, then west along Indiana Avenue, then north along South Rustin Street, then west along Marshall Avenue, then south along South Fairmount Street, then east along Macomb Avenue, then south along South Helen Street, then east along Stone Avenue, to the southwest corner of South Paxton Street and Stone Avenue.

DISCUSSION:

The City has received a letter from Jeff Zyzda of FiberComm for a permit to install underground cable commencing at the northwest corner of the intersection of Indiana Avenue and Morningside Avenue, then west 770 feet, along Indiana Avenue, where a new hand hole will be placed at the northwest corner of the intersection of South Rustin Street and Indiana Avenue, and then continue west along Indiana Avenue 705 feet where a new hand hole will be placed on the northwest corner of South Rustin Street and Indiana Avenue, then north for 500 feet, along South Rustin Street, where a new hand hole will be placed at the southeast corner of the intersection of Marshall Avenue and South Rustin Street, then west for 840 feet, along Marshall Avenue, where a new hand hole will be placed at the southwest corner of the intersection of South Fairmount Street and Marshall Avenue, then south for 220 feet, along South Fairmount Street, then east for 40 feet, crossing South Fairmount Street, where a new hand hole will be placed, then south for 75 feet before extending west crossing South Fairmount Street, then south for 700 feet, where a new hand hole will be placed at the northwest corner of the intersection of Macomb Avenue and South Fairmount Street, then east for 1,150 feet along Macomb Avenue, where a new hand hole will be placed at the northeast corner of the intersection of South Helen Street and Macomb Avenue, then south for 500 feet along South Helen Street, where a hand hole will be placed at the southeast corner of the intersection of Stone Avenue and South Helen Street.

then east for 1,100 feet along Stone Avenue, to an existing hand hole, ending construction at South Paxton Street.

The fiber optic is being installed to serve the address of 914 South Fairmount St.

This fiber permit approval is recommended by staff to continue to provide optical telecommunications services to the area.

Pursuant to municipal ordinance, permits are granted by the City Council to install underground cable to those companies not holding a franchise with the City. In the past, the Council has been concerned about exclusivity with respect to the granting of these permits. The City is prohibited from granting any type of exclusive rights to a cable company, a telecommunications company, a gas company or an electric company under the laws of the State of Iowa. Therefore, we cannot require anybody to use the facilities of FiberComm or any other telephone company.

The attached route has been reviewed by several City Departments.

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

Resolution granting a permit to FiberComm to own, operate and maintain underground cable commencing at the northeast corner of the alley intersection of 8th Street between Douglas Street and Pierce Street, along 8th Street where it exits the right-of-way at 605 8th Street, then resume in public right-of-way on Nebraska Street north of 8th Street, then cross west on Nebraska Street, then west along the alley, between 8th Street and 9th Street to the southwest corner of the alley intersection between Pierce Street and Nebraska Street.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests the City Council approve the Resolution granting a permit to FiberComm of Sioux City, Iowa, to perform underground construction in the City's right-of-way for the installation of fiber optic network services commencing at the northeast corner of the alley intersection of 8th Street between Douglas Street and Pierce Street, along 8th Street where it exits the right-of-way at 605 8th Street, then resume in public right-of-way on Nebraska Street north of 8th Street, then cross west on Nebraska Street, then west along the alley, between 8th Street and 9th Street to the southwest corner of the alley intersection between Pierce Street and Nebraska Street, where this project will end.

DISCUSSION:

The City has received a letter from Jeff Zyzda of FiberComm for a permit to install underground cable Commencing at an existing hand hole at the northeast corner of the alley intersection of 8th Street between Douglas Street and Pierce Street extending east for 735 feet along 8th Street, where a new hand hole will be placed, then north onto private property at 605 8th Street, then through private property, resuming in public right-of-way on Nebraska Street approximately 120 feet north of 8th Street, then west 250 feet crossing Nebraska Street, then west along the alley between 8th Street and 9th Street to an existing hand hole located at the southwest corner of the alley intersection between Pierce Street and Nebraska Street.

The fiber optic is being installed to serve the address of 605 8th Street.

This fiber permit approval is recommended by staff to continue to provide optical telecommunications services to the area.

Pursuant to municipal ordinance, permits are granted by the City Council to install underground cable to those companies not holding a franchise with the City. In the past, the Council has been concerned about exclusivity with respect to the granting of these permits. The City is prohibited from granting any type of exclusive rights to a cable company, a telecommunications company, a gas company or an electric company under the laws of the State of Iowa. Therefore, we cannot require anybody to use the facilities of FiberComm or any other telephone company.

The attached route has been reviewed by several City Departments.

The applicant agrees that if granted a permit for obstruction/excavation in the public right-of-way as described in the permit application, the following stipulations shall govern in addition to those included in Chapter 12.05 of the Sioux City Municipal Code.

- No public right-of-way shall be closed without notice and consent of the Public Works Department. Notice shall be at least ten (10) days in advance of any closing. Applicant is responsible for notifying the proporties adjacent to the closure via door hangers. Street Closures shall be at no expense to the City.
- The contractor must schedule a preconstruction meeting with City Engineering staff prior to construction to provide
 information concerning the construction methods, traffic control plan, construction schedule, and impacts to the City's

Construction work shall conform to the current edition of SUDAS and the City of Sioux City Supplement to SUDAS, See Section 7040 regarding pavement patching requirements. All afreet patching shall use lows DOT Class Miconcrete mix.
- The applicant shall notify lowa One Call (IOC) at 1-800-292-8989 or <u>www.inwagnecall.com</u> for utility locates prior to excavation, IOC requires 48 hour notification.
- No excavation in the traveled portion of the public right-of-way shall be left opened and with no work in progress for more than live (5) days. No excavation in the parkway shall be left opened and with no progress for more than ten (10) days.
- When an emergency excavation is necessary, a permit application shall be submitted at the earliest opportunity after the work has started, no later than the next business day.
- Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain the necessary traffic controts such as signs, barricades, flaggers, etc. as required by the City. Traffic controls provided shall be in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD) as adopted by the lower Department of Transportation.
- A complete set of "as built" construction plans in paper and electronic format shall be filed with the City's Engineering Division within fourteen (14) days after completion of the project.
- Applicant shall maintain with the City's Engineering Division a telephone number or numbers to call to locate buried cable and to receive emergoncy messages at any time.



DISCUSSION:

On October 25, 2004, pursuant to Resolution No. 2004-0918, the City Council authorized and approved a 30 year lease agreement with Woodbury County and Sioux City Community School District for use of the property located in the vicinity of 3430 West 23rd Street for the use of the land for the Starcomm Communications Tower. Motorola Solutions, Inc. desires to sublease a portion of said communication tower for the installation, operation and maintenance of a communication system. This sublease would allow the City to lease tower space to Motorola Solutions, Inc. for their communications equipment.

The action on Monday's agenda sets a public hearing for April 17, 2017. - 2. Committee Reports:

FACILITIES

Discussed part-time labor issues and how we can attract more workers. Due to overnight change overs and off hours, it's a struggle to get part-time workers. Any ideas, contact Erika Newton. Internships vs. paid internships were discussed. We don't have an issue in obtaining non-paid interns through our office.

Tim Seaman inquired about the CIP approval and chunk of money allotted towards LED lighting. He asked if we could use part of that money to do some other improvements. Councilperson Pete Groetken said the items were prioritized as identified. Tom Padgett told Newton to let the Board know if she wants back up with the budget presentation. Irving Jensen noted that we possibly have a large expenditure coming up at the Orpheum Theatre – the heating system is to be fairly expensive.

MARKETING

Dave Madsen noted there was a good discussion on relationships & synergy between the Tyson Events Center & Hard Rock. Madsen noted that Adrian Kolbo mentioned in committee that cooperation of all businesses ought to be important...maybe think of marketing the whole area as an entertainment district. Todd Moyer spoke of a marketing campaign in Sioux Falls and Omaha to make Sioux City a destination. He also spoke of the multitude of entertainment throughout the year in Sioux City. Erika Newton said after the Roger Brooks assessment, we talked about a brand for Sioux City & branding it as an entertainment destination. A print piece of 'Top 10 Attractions in Sioux City' will be sent as a direct mail piece on May 1.

Brent Stockton noted declining attendance for regular client events (i.e. Women's Night Out). What can we offer them on how to enhance their events and make it fresh? The Convention Center is booked every weekend through May.

FINANCE

We are currently ahead of budget, which is much improved from over a year ago. Suites were billed out in December. The Tyson is over \$100,000 better than last year. The Convention Center is also up a bit.

Ticket sales were up about \$27,000 for the NAIA Volleyball tournament this year. This was the best volleyball tournament we've had in Sioux City. We hope it stays that way, as they changed eligibility. It has opened doors to additional teams that included more regional teams, which showed at the box office. This meant more hotel rooms & money spent in town.

EXECUTIVE

Respectfully submitted:

Erika Newton noted there's a Roger Brooks committee meeting today, where they will assign roles. She mentioned several different types of events we are working on, including the Midwest Food Trucks Festival. There will be three show announcements in the next two weeks.

Earl Miller asked how we can find out what's going on at the Convention Center. As you drive by, there is no marquee. It's on our wish list to have a marquee. Tim Seaman brought up the SCJournal article My Opinion written by Jim Wharton regarding the Iowa Basketball, which was followed by a letter written by Mayor Bob Scott to the Board of Regents. Newton noted she spoke to the athletic directors to find out what the process is & what time frames they have to accept bids, and what other details we might need to know about this process. 1. President Richard A. Moon called the meeting to order at 3:33 p.m.

2. Roll call was taken.

3. The Agenda had an addition of item # 6D, Preliminary Review of Phone System Upgrade.

McKenny approved Agenda Item # 6D be added to the agenda. Kempers seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

4. Approve the Minutes – February 15, 2017 [Action Item]

Halaas moved approval of the minutes. Schafer seconded. Motion approved unanimous-

Thompson handed out the event schedule for the One Book One Siouxland initiative. The Launch event is March 23rd at the Sioux City Public Museum. Moon asked Thompson about the Iowa Urban Public Libraries Association meeting. Thompson stated it is refreshing to hear that other libraries are dealing with the same struggles we do. Halaas asked if other urban libraries have similar vagrancy issues. Thompson stated they do. There were no real solutions, just to keep handling it. Thompson enjoyed hearing other libraries ideas for promotions and email newsletters as we work towards an e-newsletter. Thompson shared a heat map of the Library's web page that our Web Specialist was able to obtain, showing where people are clicking on our web page. The majority of the usage is catalog searches, an entrance to our primary product is exactly how we want our web page to be used. We also can see how patrons use our Online Branch—eResources page. Kempers asked if this is through Google Analytics and Thompson said we do use Google Analytics, and "heatmap.me" is a good visual representation. Schafer stated this data is good for future decisions. Kempers asked if we could track information about the Overdrive app. Thompson stated that Overdrive, as a vendor, does not let the home library see details about their patrons at this time. Kempers stated she loves Overdrive and uses it often and shares it with others. Thompson said she is excited about the fun productive things our new staff members are doing.

3:49 p.m. Plathe entered the meeting.

6. Financial Reports

- A. Expenditures: Approve Claims [Action Item]
 Halaas moved approval of claims as submitted. Plathe seconded. Motion approved unanimously.
- B. 2016-2017 Monthly Budget Summary Trustees reviewed the report.
- C. Integrated Library and Security Systems Annual Licenses [Action Item] Thompson recommends the Board approve payment of \$40,383.97 to SirsiDynix for the annual licensing and support of the Integrated Library System from May 1, 2017 through April 30, 2018. In April 2016, the Library moved from an in-house server to Software as a Service, eliminating the need to purchase and maintain physical servers on-site in our Library.

The annual licensing and maintenance agreement for the Library security and self-checkout system was to be renewed in January. Due to increasing maintenance costs, decreasing use of the self-checkout machines, and minimal maintenance issues, Thompson re-negotiated the maintenance agreement with Bibliotheca +3m, dropping maintenance on a smaller items and our maintenance was reduced to \$4,956.96. Discussion followed on self-checkout.

McKenny moved approval of payment for \$40,383.97 to SirsiDynix for annual licensing and support of the Integrated Library System. Plathe seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

D. Preliminary Review of Phone System Upgrade

Thompson made the Trustees aware we are moving closer to updating the telephone system at the Aalfs Downtown Library. The current system is 15 to 20 years old and is having trouble connecting with digital calls. Thompson provided an estimate of costs for the new phones and licensing to use the system that WCICC-IT supports, asking for any concerns or objections. Moon asked where they money will come from. Thompson stated from the current operating budget. Halaas asked who the vendor is. Thompson stated WCICC-IT will order direct from their Shoretel provider. There were no objections from trustees.

7. Unfinished Business

8. New Business

A. Non-Bargaining Personnel Handbook [Action Item]

Thompson is recommending that the Library Board of Trustees approve the same adjustment to the salary ranges for Library non-bargaining staff as the City approved for non-represented positions.

Halaas moved approval of 3.5% increase to salary ranges for Library non-bargaining staff for each of the next two years. Plathe seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

B. Enrich Iowa Agreement for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 [Action Item]
Thompson asks that the Library Board approve Sioux City Public Library's participation in State Library programs, again this year, and Thompson will sign and submit the Enrich Iowa Agreement – Public Library form by the April 30, 2017 deadline.

Halaas moved that the Sioux City Public Library should participate in Enrich Iowa Agreement. Plathe seconded. Motion approved unanimously.

9. Trustee Concerns

Halaas asked if the Morningside Branch Library Capital Improvement Project begins as soon as the budget is in place. Thompson said yes, we can begin the planning. Halaas commented that he visited the Library before the Board meeting and witnessed a very effective off-duty officer dealing with sleeping and eating in the Library. Halaas stated he has a greater appreciation of the Library staff who deal with these issues daily. He also was glad to see the 8th grade chemistry competition in the Gleeson Room. Halaas shared the idea that our corporate name could be Sioux City Public Libraries, the name itself describes more than one. McKenny said where the Library is located is just the building but the collection and services are the Library, and the collection goes back and forth between buildings.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests that after the public hearing is held, the Council approve the resolution instituting proceedings to take additional action for the authorization of the Loan and Disbursement Agreement and the issuance of Sewer Revenue Capital Loan Note.

DISCUSSION:

The purpose of this RCA is to facilitate the next step in the process for authorization of a Loan and Disbursement Agreement with the Iowa Finance Authority and issuance of a Sewer Revenue Capital Loan Note. Hearing has been set to determine whether or not to take additional action. The hearing and proceedings have been structured by the City's Bond Counsel to conform to Statute.

Approval of this resolution allows staff to continue with proceedings necessary to fund Phase II of the Ravine Park Water Restoration Project through the Clean Water SRF Sponsored Project program. If approved, staff will work with the Iowa Finance Authority and Bond Counsel to prepare the necessary final documents for Council approval.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Allows the City to proceed with funding the Ravine Park Water Restoration Project as approved in the Capital Improvement Program. This provides funding of project costs of approximately \$475,000, with no increase in costs to the City due to the corresponding interest rate reduction on the existing loan.

RELATIONSHIP TO STRATEGIC PLAN:

Proceeding with issuance of the Sewer Capital Loan Note shows the City's efforts to maintain our Operational Plans.

ALTERNATIVES:

To not proceed with authorization of the Loan and Disbursement Agreement and Sewer Capital Loan Note. This would require identifying a new funding source for the Ravine Park Project.

Staff respectfully requests the City Council conduct a public hearing and approve a resolution withdrawing the civil penalty against the following cigarette permit holder pursuant to Iowa Code Section 453A.22(3):

• Cigarette License #17-41113 under the name Kum & Go LC d.b.a. Kum & Go #228, 1925 South Lakeport Street, Sioux City, Iowa.

DISCUSSION:

On March 6, 2017, the City Council passed and approved resolutions setting a date, time and place for public hearings against the following businesses for violation of the lowa cigarette laws:

Proposed civil penalty of \$300.00 against the following cigarette permit holder for a first violation of State Cigarette Statute 453A.2(1):

- Cigarette License #17-41113 under the name Kum & Go LC d.b.a. Kum & Go #228, 1925 South Lakeport Street, Sioux City, Iowa.
- Cigarette License #17-00613 under the name Hy-Vee Food Store #2 d.b.a. Hy-Vee Food Store #2, 4500 Sergeant Road, Sioux City, Iowa.
- Cigarette License #17-23669 under the name Wal-Mart Stores, Incorporated d.b.a. Wal-Mart #1361, 3400 Singing Hills Boulevard, Sioux City, Iowa.

The aforementioned businesses had employees who plead guilty in Woodbury County District Court of violating Iowa Code §453A.2, selling cigarettes to minors.

In an attempt to settle these cases in lieu of public hearings, Acknowledgement/Settlement Agreements were sent to the businesses giving them the opportunity to pay the civil penalty. Hy-Vee Food Store #2 has returned their Acknowledgement/Settlement Agreement and paid their \$300.00 civil penalty. The Acknowledgement/Settlement Agreement for Wal-Mart #1361 was not returned and the \$300.00 civil penalty not paid.

Kum & Go #228 has exercised their right to avoid the penalty under the following Iowa Code Section 453A.22(3).

453A.22(3). If an employee of a retailer violates section 453A.2, subsection 1, the retailer shall not be assessed a penalty under subsection 2, and the violation shall be deemed not to be a violation of section 453A.2, subsection 1, for the purpose of determining the number of violations for which a penalty may be assessed pursuant to subsection 2, if the employee holds a valid certificate of completion of the tobacco compliance employee training program pursuant to section 453A.5 at the time of the violation. A retailer may assert only once in a four-year period the bar under this subsection against assessment of a penalty pursuant to subsection 2, for a violation of section 453A.2, that takes place at the same place of business location.

Therefore, the resolution will withdraw the civil penalty for Kum & Go #228 in recognition of their exercising this one (1) time in a four (4) year period penalty avoidance provision.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Collection of civil penalties to be placed in the City's General Fund.

DISCUSSION:

The Environmental Services Division was awarded a grant in the amount of \$80,000.00 by the lowa Department of Agriculture and Land Stewardship for funding of green infrastructure to be incorporated into the Promenade Improvement Project. The project includes removal of the existing pavers, regrading of the entire site to ensure proper drainage to the proposed green infrastructure practices, and the installation of concrete. Green infrastructure practices to be incorporated into the project include bioretention cells and expansion of the existing tree trenches. The reduction in impervious surface serves to reduce stormwater runoff and will enhance the aesthetic value of the downtown area by adding an urban green space.

Staff advertised the project on March 25, 2017 and April 1, 2017. Bids will be received on April 11, 2016. This project has a completion date of July 19, 2017.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This project is funded under CIP 549-021 Promenade Improvement Project. The Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost for the work is \$369,454.00. The project currently has an available balance of \$258,505 and with an additional \$231,658 in GO Bonds approved in FY 2018, for total available funding of \$490,163.

DISCUSSION:

Background

Clint Stencil, who owns a construction company based out of Sioux Falls, has spent the past several months performing due diligence on the former Bekins Van & Storage Co. building located at 316 Perry Street (on the corner of W. 4th Street and Wesley Parkway). This five-story building was constructed in 1907 as a warehouse and included a one story office building facing Wesley Parkway. Since then, a one-story addition was added to the front of the five-story building. Today, the one-story portion of this building houses a few retail operations, and the main five-story portion of the building is minimally used for file storage.

Clint Stencil has over 37 years of experience in the residential and commercial industries and is working with a group of investors, called Midnight, LLC, to redevelop the former Bekins building. Midnight, LLC was recently awarded Workforce Housing Tax Credits through the state's program.

Current Project

Midnight, LLC's plans for the building include complete renovation and re-purpose of the fivestory building into seventy-two market-rate residential apartments. This will include the removal of a majority of the one-story retail portion of the building in order to add an outdoor gathering area for the residents in front of the building. Parking for the residents will be constructed on the backside of the property. A workout facility, gaming room and other interior gathering areas will be included. Midnight, LLC plans to invest over \$6.5 million to renovate 65,000 SF of the former Bekins building and the project is expected to be completed by the end of 2017.

Proposal

City staff has worked with Clint Stencil on all aspects of the project, including the rezoning of the property, vacation of alleyways, and a development agreement for the sale of right-of-way and city-owned property.

As part of the proposed agreement Midnight, LLC will:

- Renovate and repurpose the five-story former Bekins building into seventy-two (72)
 market-rate residential units, construct an outdoor gathering area with green space,
 landscaping, and fencing, and resurface the parking area in conformance with all zoning, building, design and subdivision codes.
- Purchase the city-owned property and vacated right-of-way from the city for a price of \$1.00
- Invest at least \$6.5 million in improvements to the property.

As part of the proposed agreement the city will:

 Sell the city-owned property and vacated right-of-way to Midnight, LLC for a price of \$1.00 in exchange for the improvements made to the property.

The initial step to start the required 30-day notice period and set a date for final Council consideration of the development agreement and sale of vacated right-of-way was approved by Council on February 27, 2017.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The project will clean up the area at minimal cost to the city. The sale of city-owned property and vacated right-of-way will add taxable value to the adjacent property.



Midnight, LLC proposes to purchase the needed property from the City for \$1.00, and in exchange Midnight, LLC will invest over \$6.5 million to renovate 65,000 SF of the former Bekins building and adjacent land. The full project is expected to be completed by the end of 2017.

thereof. (Deferred from March 27, 2017.)

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests Council approve a Development Agreement with Clayton Creek L.L.C. (Jay and Nicole Layman) for a rural residential development at 701 and 801 South Roswell Street.

DISCUSSION:

During the City Council Meeting on Monday, March 27th City staff presented the agreement to the City Council for action on the \$77,000.00 grant and the Developer presented his request for a grant in the amount of \$93,500.00. On a 4-1 vote the City Council directed staff to bring forward a revised agreement in the amount of \$93,500.00 as requested by the Developer. The agreement has been revised to reflect the new amount.

City staff has been working with Jay Layman for over a year on an eleven lot rural residential development at 701 and 801 South Roswell Street. The property is shown on the attached General Area Map. The subject project consists of thirty two acres and was most recently occupied by a single residential structure and multiple outbuildings. The residential structure and several outbuildings have been demolished by the developer. The only access to the site is by South Roswell Street which is an existing public gravel street with only thirty foot of right-of-way. The east property line of the subject property is the current City limits line.

The developer is proposing to subdivide the site into eleven rural residential acreages. The site would continue to have only one access via South Roswell Street and the extension of the street will be gravel to match the existing surface. The extension of the street will be public right-of-way so all lots will have frontage on public right-of-way. The developer will also make improvements to the existing South Roswell Street to slightly widen the driven way and also complete drainage improvements to improve storm water runoff. The developer will also install an eight inch public water main to serve the new eleven acreages. There is no existing sanitary sewer in the area therefore all eleven acreages will have private septic systems.

It is not common that we would support new residential subdivisions using a gravel street but in this case we have thirty two acres currently undeveloped and a local developer wanting to meet the demand of providing rural acreages within the City limits. The topography of the site, limited access, and lack of City infrastructure to the site limits the development opportunities. The density of the proposed subdivision is very low considering the property contains thirty two acres and the additional traffic on South Roswell Street will be minimal with no thru traffic.

The following are the terms of the Developer as identified in the development agreement:

- A. Developer will submit a rezoning application to rezone the entire property from Agriculture (AG) to Rural Residential (RR). Developer will also submit a preliminary plat application showing eleven lots, and in generally the same form as the attached preliminary site plan (see Exhibit "B"). The rezoning and preliminary plat application must be reviewed and approved by both the Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council.
- B. Developer will apply for and receive all necessary building permits and permits to conduct infrastructure work within the public right-of-way.
- C. Developer will install an eight inch public water main, to be City owned, serving the new lots and will be placed within the existing South Roswell Street right-of-way, with a hydrant/flushing device to be drained overland, or in underground storage tanks, at the election of Developer. Developer will design and construct the water main. The water main design must be reviewed and approved by City staff. City will agree to minimum required fire hydrants for rural residential development areas.
- D. Developer will install a twenty four foot wide gravel or crushed asphalt public street extending off the existing graveled South Roswell Street right-of-way to access all lots in the approximate location set forth on Exhibit "B".
- E. Developer will install a concrete apron at the intersection of South Roswell Street and Stone Avenue. The apron design must be reviewed and approved by City staff.
- F. Developer will sign a limited services agreement limiting fire protection, no public sanitary sewer service, and limited street maintenance.
- G. Developer will construct or cause to be constructed eleven single family residential structures prior to December 31, 2023. The Developer may request an extension of the construction deadline in the event that unanticipated circumstances arise which prevent the Developer, or its successors and assigns, from meeting the construction deadline (i.e. such as economic factors which cause a significant decrease in new construction in the community, unanticipated weather delays, etc.).
- H. Developer will complete improvements on the existing South Roswell Street to widen the driven way and improve storm water runoff after the installation of the public water main.

I. Developer shall execute a promissory note in the amount of \$93,500.00 encumbering all platted parcels contained in the proposed development site. In the event that less than eleven residential structures have been completed by the construction deadline date of December 31, 2023 (or any extension of the deadline date), Developer shall be obligated on demand of the City to refund a prorated portion of the \$93,500.00 economic development grant. The prorate portion shall be based on a fraction, the numerator of which shall be the number of uncompleted residential structures as of the construction deadline date and the denominator of which shall be eleven. This fraction shall then be multiplied by \$93,500.00 to determine the amount to be refunded by the Developer to the City upon demand of the City.

The following are the terms of the City as identified in the development agreement:

- A. City will waive sidewalk requirements, and in return Developer will construct and maintain a nature walking trail through the subdivision in a yet-to-be-determined location.
- B. City will vacate the right-of-way located to the east and north of the proposed subdivision, shown in Exhibit "C" and transfer to Developer for \$1.00.
- C. City will approve Developer's use of rural residential street lighting due to the low density. The lighting plan must be reviewed and approved by City staff prior to installation.
- D. City will provide an economic development grant to support the rural residential development in an amount of \$93,500.00 to be paid following the completion of all public infrastructure.
- E. City will provide a partial release of the development agreement upon the closing of the sale by Developer of each lot.
- F. City will trim any existing trees in the South Roswell Street right-of-way that currently do not meet the fourteen foot height requirement over the street.

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DEVELOPMENT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT made on	, 2017, by and between the City of Sioux
City, Iowa, an Iowa municipal corporation,	(hereinafter referred to as "City") and Clayton
Creek, L.L.C. (hereinafter referred to as "Develo	oper").

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Developer owns real estate addressed as 701 South Roswell Street and 801 South Roswell Street, legally described in the attached Exhibit "A" (the "Property"); and

WHEREAS, Developer desires to construct a rural residential development on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the parties desire to establish between themselves their various obligations, duties and responsibilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the promises and mutual obligations of the parties hereto, each of them does hereby covenant and agree with the other as follows:

ARTICLE I RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE DEVELOPER

The Developer shall complete construction of a rural residential development as shown on the attached site plan <u>Exhibit "B"</u> in conformance with all zoning, building and subdivision codes adopted by the City of Sioux City and contingent on the following:

- A. Developer will submit a rezoning application to rezone the entire property from Agriculture (AG) to Rural Residential (RR). Developer will also submit a preliminary plat application showing eleven lots, and in generally the same form as the attached preliminary site plan (see Exhibit "B"). - C. ARTICLE III GENERAL PROVISIONS

A. This Agreement shall be binding on the parties and their successors and assigns.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests that City Council award Service Provider Agreements to West Plains Engineering, Inc. of Sioux Falls, South Dakota and Thompson Electric Company of Sioux City, Iowa for the City-Wide Arc Flash Study. If awarded, staff will bring back the Service Provider Agreements for approval at an upcoming City Council meeting.

DISCUSSION:

City staff has determined that certain City-owned facilities need to have an Arc Flash Study done in order to comply with Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requirements. An Arc Flash Study needs to be done at 310 locations. The locations are all Sioux Gateway Airport administration, hangars, and residential units; all WCICC towers; all Central Maintenance Garage locations; libraries, Tyson Events Center; Parks and Recreation locations; Field Services locations; Convention Center; Waste Water Treatment Buildings; Police Training Center; Fire Stations; Parking Facilities, Skywalks; Art Center; Museum locations; IBP Ice Center, and the traffic panels.

The request for quotes were sent to sixteen (16) firms thought to provide arc flash analysis. Vendors were given the option to bid each individual site or the sites in total. Each vendor proposed a discount by packaging all the sites together. There were two (2) responses. The two total bids were as follows:

Bidding out for each individual site versus all sites as one award will allow the City to save \$106,633.00.

When the bids were first received City staff believed that the West Plains Engineering bid was non-responsive because the vendor had noted on their bid that electrician costs were not included in the bid and that they had identified 100 points at the Tyson Events Center where as Thompson Electric identified 300 points at the Tyson Events Center. After the bids were due West Plains estimated the electrician costs at \$40,000 in an email sent to City staff. Based on electrician costs not being submitted and points being under stated, City staff determined the West Plains Engineering's bid may be non-responsive and prepared a resolution and RCA to award the contract to Thompson Electric Company for the March 27, 2017 meeting.

West Plains Engineering staff then contacted City staff to clarify their bid. West Plains Engineering said that their bid does include electrician costs and their bid includes all points at each site. West Plains Engineering has submitted written correspondence that their bid includes all electrician costs and all points at each site. City staff determined that West Plains Engineering was allowed to clarify their bid. Due to this clarification the item was deleted from the March 27, 2017 meeting.

Staff is proposing to enter into service provider agreements with West Plains Engineering, Inc. of Sioux Falls, South Dakota and Thompson Electric Company of Sioux City, Iowa to conduct the Arc Flash Study to ensure all City facilities meet OSHA requirements. If City Council so desires they can reject the bids and specifications can be rebid. Rebidding will allow for City staff to rewrite specifications to account for variances between the two bids.

Due to the nature of the work to be performed staff did not require a bid bond or a performance bond. Staff chose not to require bonds to minimize costs.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The project is funded under CIP 889-014, Arc Flash Improvements.

RELATIONSHIP TO STRATEGIC PLAN:

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests Council approve a Development Agreement with Black and Blue Development, L.L.C. (Rick Bertrand and Casey Fenton) for a residential development in the vicinity of 2809 Floyd Boulevard and 2901 Floyd Boulevard to be known as Chestnut Hill.

DISCUSSION:

SUBJECT:

City staff has been working with Rick Bertrand and Casey Fenton on an infill residential development in the vicinity of 2809 Floyd Boulevard and 2901 Floyd Boulevard to be known as Chestnut Hill. The property is shown on the attached General Area Map. Access to the site will be via Chestnut Avenue to the north and connecting to Floyd Boulevard on the east.

The Developer is proposing to subdivide the site into forty (40) lots. On these forty (40) lots, the Developer plans to construct eighty (80) townhomes. Upon completion of each townhome, the lots will be split. Upon completion of all of the townhomes, there will be eighty (80) lots and eighty (80) new residential structures. The Developer will also be constructing a new street connecting Chestnut Avenue to Floyd Boulevard. Additionally, as shown on the attached preliminary plat, there will be a nine (9) foot wide trail along the new extension of Chestnut Avenue. Developer will also be installing new utilities to support the development. New water mains will connect to several existing mains resulting in much needed loops in the area.

The following are the terms of the Developer as identified in the Development Agreement:

- A. Submit a Preliminary Plat prepared by a state licensed engineer for City approval based on the City Subdivision Ordinance, Zoning and Sign Ordinance, Building Code, Fire Code, Storm Water Management Code and all other relevant aspects of the Sioux City Municipal Code.
- B. Submit a Final Plat for Planning and Zoning Commission and City Council approval to be titled Chestnut Hill Addition to Sioux City, Woodbury County, Iowa.

- C. Apply for and receive all other necessary building permits.
- D. Construct or cause to be constructed a public street to access the eighty (80) residential structures as shown on the Preliminary Site Plan. This shall include grading, paving and construction of any storm sewer, water main, and sanitary sewer to City standards required by the City Engineer. Said construction shall commence only after approval by the City Engineer of construction plans for the public improvements.
- E. Developer shall, on or before May 1, 2017 proceed with grading work in an effort to begin construction of the residential units before November 1, 2017 upon all necessary permitting and approval.
- F. Construct the eighty (80) residential structures as shown on the Preliminary Site Plan prior to December 31, 2022.
- G. Developer shall execute a promissory note in the amount of One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00). Each individually platted lot shall have a prorated promissory note attached and shall be released individually as construction of each unit is completed. For example, if the City's contribution is One Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$1,500,000.00) the prorated amount of the promissory note on each of the forty (40) platted lots would be Thirty Four Thousand Ninety Dollars (\$34,090.00).
- H. Developer agrees to comply with the Iowa Statewide Urban Design and Specifications (SUDAS) manual and the City's most recent supplement to SUDAS in connection with the Development. This includes obtaining all required permits and zoning approval which shall be the sole responsibility of Developer.
- Developer shall complete all roadways, storm water detention areas, sidewalks, lighting, utilities and amenities as shown on the approved Preliminary Plat prior to commencement of construction of any residential unit.
- J. Developer agrees to construct roadways, storm water detention areas, sidewalks, lighting, utilities and amenities as shown on the approved Preliminary Plat to support the Development. Once said roadways and supporting infrastructure are in place, Developer agrees to convey said roadways and infrastructure to the City at no cost.
- K. Developer agrees to provide a maintenance bond covering any defects in design, workmanship, or materials for all roadways, trails, sidewalks and supporting infrastructure for a period of 3 years after conveyance of said roadways, trails, sidewalks and infrastructure to the City. This bond shall provide for full repair and replacement for any defects in design, workmanship, or materials. This bond shall be executed and delivered at the time of conveyance to the City. Should the bond not be provided at that time, no further payments shall be made by City to Developer.

The following are the terms of the City as identified in the Development Agreement:

- A. City will perform, or reimburse Developer if performed by someone other than City, for actual costs incurred for all construction inspection and testing for all public improvements within the Development.
- B. City agrees to pay Developer Eight Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$800,000.00) in the

form of an economic development grant (and not part of any tax increment financing) towards the construction of Chestnut Avenue and any public infrastructure. These funds shall be dispersed as follows:

- 1) The first installment of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2017.
- 2) The second installment of Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00) shall be paid upon completion of twelve (12) residential units.
- C. City agrees to pay Developer the City's Share of New Residential Development (CIP 611-001) ("DIG") funds in the amount of Seven Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$700,000.00). These funds shall be dispersed as follows:
 - 1) The first installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2017.
 - 2) The second installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2018, or upon completion of twelve (12) residential units, whichever comes later.
 - 3) The third installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2018, or upon completion of twenty-four (24) residential units, whichever comes later.
 - 4) The fourth installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2019, or upon completion of thirty-six (36) residential units, whichever comes later.
 - 5) The fifth installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2020, or upon completion of forty-eight (48) residential units, whichever comes later.
 - 6) The sixth installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2021, or upon completion of sixty (60) residential units, whichever comes later.
 - 7) The seventh installment of One Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$100,000.00) shall be paid on July 1, 2022, or upon completion of seventy-two (72) residential units, whichever comes later.
- D. If the City receives any State or Federal funds to assist with funding any infrastructure necessary to support the development, the City agrees to apply the funds toward the development to reduce expenses that would have been incurred by the City and Developer.
- E. The City shall provide a Partial Release of Development Agreement for each residential structure upon completion and certification of an occupancy permit for that structure. No release shall be provided for any structure which is incomplete or has no occupancy permit.
