

# Radio days

'Halloween Mystery Theatre' recreates vintage radio drama for aural spook-tacular

uring the "golden age of radio," Ralph Swain spent a considerable amount of his childhood trying to spook out his brother in the darkened basement of their family's New Jersey home.

After all, this was the heyday of such creepy series as "Lights Out," "Suspense" and "Inner Sanctum Mystery."

"Radio dramas was always scarier than the stuff you'd see in the movies," Swain, a longtime

educator, explained. "This was the theater of the mind where you had to imagine the things that went bump in the night.'

That is the premise behind "Halloween Mystery Theatre," which takes three chilling stories from the 1940s, presenting them as written with contemporary actors for a live audience.

What that means is Swain and members of his Great Plains Radio Theatre Project will perform the radio plays "Three Skeleton Keys,"

"Camera Obscura" and "Sorry, Wrong Number!" – complete with live sound effects, campy vintage commercials and, even, a few musical interludes – at 7 p.m. Oct. 28 and 2 p.m. Oct. 29 in the Rocklin Conference Center at Western Iowa Tech Community College (WITCC), 4647 Stone Ave.

Indeed, Swain bills the event as "the radio show that's not on the radio."

"Many radio shows were performed in front of a live audience, with actors in front of a microphone and a foley artist creating sound effects on the spot," he explained. "Our three plays will give current audiences an idea of what an actual radio broadcast would be like back then."

Long before television, radio was the medium in which most families turned to for entertainment. WHAT: Great Plains Radio

"While there were movies or vaudeville or, maybe, a ballgame, to offer diversion," Swain said, "mainly, it was the comedies, mysteries, westerns and adventure series on the radio that people listened to at home."

Such plays – often cranked out by scriptwriters under tight deadlines – transported listeners to an imaginary world of entertainment, excitement and adventure.

Eddie Dunn said he remembered the end of radio's golden age.

"Radio drama was being

produced up until the late 1950s," the veteran musician and WITCC director of distance and global education explained. "Even though TV was around, there was still an audience for radio plays."

Dunn, who also hosts Siouxland Public Media's "Saturday Night Jazz," has been an actor with Swain's Great Plains Radio Theatre Project production since its inception in 2007.

Longtime community theater actors John and Delaine Krager have also appeared in numerous Great Plains Radio Theatre performances in the past. The husband and wife duo will be in "Camera Obscura," a radio play that was originally performed as part of the anthology series "Ouiet Please" in 1947.

However, it was Joanne Fox, a former Sioux City Journal and Weekender staff writer, who will bring powerhouse histrionics to "Halloween Mystery Theatre."

This is because she will be taking on the starring role in "Sorry, Wrong Number," which Orson Welles had called "the greatest radio script ever written."

Agnes Moorehead – a regular member of Wells' legendary "Mercury Theatre of the Air" and, better known to contemporary audiences as Endora on TV's "Bewitched" – was the first actress to take on the role of "Sorry, Wrong Number"s Leona Stevenson, a bedridden woman who accidentally overhears a murder plot on the

"Legend has it that (Moorehead) fainted at the end of the play because the action was so intense," Swain said.

Fox, herself a frequent Great Plains Radio Theatre performer, said it will be challenging to tackle such an iconic role.

"I've done plenty of plays where I can use my voice, face and body language to convey emotion," she said. "In a radio play, an actor has only their voice to rely on."

That and the sound effects offered by foley artist Josh Gaul, who is a Great Plains Radio Theatre "Timing is everything because you calibrate your performance with what a sound effect person is doing," Fox said. "Whether it is footsteps or the clicking of a telephone receiver, we'll be creating drama in real time."

Which is why Swain recommended audiences to experience at least a portion of the three radio plays with their eyes closed.

"I know it sounds strange to come to a show with your eyes shut but that's the best way to experience radio drama," he explained.

Through closed eyes, a person can be transported into an entirely different world or an entirely different time period simply by using his imagination.

It certainly transports Swain to a simpler time where scares came through screams and shrieks and sound effects on one's radio consoles.

"I still think the it is more frightening to imagine scary stuff than it is to see it," he said.



# Upward bound!

Cirque de la Symphonie to swing with the Sioux City Symphony Orchestra for Halloween concert

You don't ordinarily associate aerial acrobats, contortionists and clowns with symphonic music yet Cirque de la Symphonie's Alexander Strelstov said the two art forms actually make for a unique pairing.

"Our aerial performers never overshadow the majesty of the music," the Russian-born Strelstov explained. "In fact, I think we complement everything the symphony is playing."

The world-famous Cirque de la Symphonie will be performing a Halloween Spooktacular with the Sioux City Symphony Orchestra (SCSO) at 7:30 p.m. Saturday at the Orpheum Theatre, 528 Pierce St.

This is the third collaboration between the Cirque and the SCSO, according to Strelstov, as well as the first pairing focusing on Halloween.

"While it won't be too frightful, audiences can expect to see witches flying through the air and a few skeletons performing death-defying feats," he said.

Despite that, Cirque de la Symphonie will remain a family friendly show where children are encouraged to dress in their favorite Halloween costumes while mom and dad can enjoy an evening of musical excitement.

Indeed, Strelstov – the founder of Cirque de la Symphonie – began his dance career when he was a child.

A circus veteran who has performed with the Bolshoi Ballet and a gold medal winner with Paris' Festival du Mondial, Strelstov came up with the idea of introducing circus performers to symphonic concerts after successful performances with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra.

"The conductor at the time would bring in a few aerial


