

Sarg's Philly Time to serve breakfast faves from iconic Sioux City eatery

In the kitchen of a Morningside restaurant, Dustin Carnes grills up a slice of ham, strips of bacon, a sausage link and an over-easy egg for the perfectly-named "Hungry Man" breakfast.

If that name and that meal sounds familiar to you, it is because the "Hungry Man" is a menu mainstay at Horizon Family Restaurant, which has been a popular 1220 Tri View Ave. eatery for more than 30 years.

In October, Muhammad "Sarg" Sajid purchased Horizon, which has always been known for its all-day breakfast plates as well as for

its stick-to-your-ribs All-American meals.

While Sajid plans on keeping Horizon's menu intact, the Sioux City-based businessman is bringing many of Horizon's breakfast favorites to Sarg's Philly Time, the 4006 Morningside Ave. restaurant he runs with Carnes.

"Our customers had been clamoring for breakfast items and Horizon had the best breakfast menu in town," Carnes explained. "Now, you can get Horizon's breakfast specialties on the Westside of Sioux City as well as in Morningside."

Which is good news for Carnes, who has, literally, worked in restaurant for most of his life.

Beginning his career as a busboy at the iconic Harvey's, Carnes was eventually promoted to a line cook at the Riverside diner. After that, he helped open Greek to Me, which specialized in creative Grecian cuisine like gyros, pastichio and spicy Greek nachos.

Yet the ambitious Carnes always wanted to own his own restaurant.

Partnering with Sajid, an old family friend, he opened Sarg's Philly Time in 2023.

The restaurant is best

known for being the home of "Build Your Own Philly."

In case you didn't know, the classic Cheesesteak – chopped steak, cooked onions and plenty of gooey cheese – was immortalized by Italian immigrants in Philadelphia during the first half of the 20th century.

At Sarg's Philly Time, you can build your Philly with steak and chicken, along with a multitude of cheese and veggie options.

The restaurant also serves plenty of wraps, sandwiches and burgers in addition to Midwestern faves like chicken fried steak and pork tenderloin. Shortly after opening Philly Time, Carnes noticed regular customers considered the restaurant to be part of the neighborhood.

"Morningside has plenty of chain restaurants," he said. "But Philly Time was locallyowned and they liked it."

Carnes also discovered that his regular customers also liked his made-fromscratch meals.

Hawks Coffee Shop is a smoothie operator

ERGEANT BLUFF -When Cyndi Nelson decided to open Hawks Coffee Shop with her husband Matt Nelson, she wanted the space to become a hub for the community.

"I wanted to be used for small gatherings like a girl's night out or a wine sampling or, even, the site for a murder mystery party," she said. "I envisioned it as being as much of a community center as it was a coffee shop."

Luckily, Sergeant Bluff residents caught on to the concept of Hawks right away in spite of the fact that the 110 Gaul Drive business opened a few weeks before the COVID-19 pandemic.

"COVID could've killed us but, once the pandemic restrictions were loosened, customers started to come through our doors and that never stopped," Nelson, a former social worker and sociology professor, explained.

Now four year after its grand opening, Hawks Coffee Shop has earned a Siouxand's Choice firstplace finish. However, it wasn't in the category of coffee or for favorite party place.

Instead, Nelson's business was being honored for its smoothies.

"Well, not what I was expecting but I'll take it." Nelson said, noting that the shop makes mango, peach, strawberry, strawberry-banana, wildberry and healthy green smoothies."

That is in addition to the coffees, lattes, mochas, teas the bulk of Hawks' drinks menu.

"We even offer a flight. four drinks, hot or cold, on a flight border," Nelson said. "That way, a customer can choose the best of everything."





n case you've never had one, a smash burger is a burger that is made by smashing ground beef onto a grill or griddle with a spatula.

Smashing the patty locks in all of the juices and flavor while giving the meat a nice, crisp exterior.

Smash burgers are the star of the show at the Smash Food Truck. which is owned by veteran chef Clay Lillie.

A mainstay at the Sioux City Farmer's Market and Food Truck Friday, the food truck is becoming a ubiquitous site at many area community events and social gatherings.

So it shouldn't come as much of a surprise that Smash was named Siouxland's Choice for best burger and that the Smash Food Truck was selected as Siouxland's Choice for best food truck.

It is also a testament to Lillie, who uses the best and freshest ingredients for his burgers.

"You make think we're cutting corners when making burgers in a food truck," Lillie said, shaking his head. "Instead, we're giving customers a gourmet burger in the casual setting."

It all starts with the meat.

"I use ground chuck with 80 percent lean meat to 20 percent fat," Lillie said. "You need that fat to produce the taste of a smash burger."



If, for example, there might be another boy she would have at least some interest in, the two of you girls could help each other come up with ideas on how best to approach these boys and what topics you'd like to discuss with them to "break the ice" and get to know them a bit better. Once you do start having some proactive conversations with boys you find interesting, your odds of actually spending some time getting to know them better will increase. Proactivity in most cases is a superior strategy and operating method compared to inactivity.


