RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests Council approve a funding request from Downtown Partners in the amount of \$87,594.00 for wayfinding signs. This funding will allow Downtown Partners to complete the wayfinding project in downtown.

DISCUSSION:

During the Council capital budget process this year additional funding to complete the downtown wayfinding signs was requested by Downtown Partners. A grant application was also being submitted to the SIMPCO MPO for funding that would reduce the City's financial assistance to the project. Council directed City staff and Downtown Partners to wait for the award announcement on the grant application prior to requesting any additional City assistance.

The Iowa Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) funding application for downtown way-finding signs was approved by the City Council on February 3, 2020, pursuant to Resolution No. 2020-0101, and submitted to SIMPCO on February 7, 2020. Prior to the SIMPCO MPO Technical Committee and Policy Board meetings in the first week of March, it was determined by the Iowa Department of Transportation that the project was not eligible for TAP funding due to the vehicular signage components of the project. Therefore, Downtown Partners is now requesting City financial assistance in the amount of \$87,594.00 to complete the project.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The City of Sioux City has committed \$100,000.00 to the downtown wayfinding project. Additional financial partners include Downtown Partners (\$40,000.00), MRHD (\$40,000.00), Siouxland Chamber/TSI (\$40,000.00) and in-kind (\$50,000.00). After reducing the original 2018 project cost of \$606,984.00 by eliminating parking signs, receiving grants, removing professional fees, utilizing Parks & Recreation funding for gateway signs, and repurposing signal cabinets with wraps for pedestrian signs, the 2020 budget total is \$285,872.00. Downtown Partners is requesting \$87,594.00 to complete the project.

DISCUSSION:

The Federal Government has various regulations limiting the issuance of tax exempt debt. One of the regulations requires that an issuer who intends to reimburse a project with tax exempt bonds pass a resolution declaring that intent. There is no commitment to issue debt; the declaration documents the ability of the City to issue debt on a tax exempt basis.

The Capital Improvement Program (CIP) was approved on March 16, 2020 and includes capital improvement projects which will be funded with debt. This resolution separates the timing of the projects from the timing of the City's debt issuance.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The FY 2021 CIP Budget proposes the issuing of \$27,350,000 of general obligation bonds for various CIP projects in FY 2021.

RELATIONSHIP TO STRATEGIC PLAN:

The intent to reimburse with bond issuance shows the City's efforts to maintain our Operational Plans.

ALTERNATIVES:

The City Council could vote down the resolution and spending on capital projects for the FY 2021 CIP would have to wait until the issuance of the debt.

PURPOSE OF POSITION:

Under general direction of the labor supervisor, performs general manual work requiring no special training and minimal experience. Works with and around, and may operate various pieces of light automotive and mechanical equipment. May be responsible for leading the work of other seasonal employees. As work experience is gained, may be assigned to somewhat more difficult and responsible tasks. Work normally is performed under general supervision; does related work as required.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES OF POSITION (with or without accommodation):

The following duties are normal for this position. These are not to be construed as exclusive or all inclusive. Other duties may be assigned.

- Knowledge of types and use of hand tools and mowing equipment.
- Works as part of a right-of-way mowing crew and operates a mower, weed whip and pickup truck.
- Performs various street maintenance duties such as cleaning gutters, spreading sand and salt, shoveling snow, sweeping streets, sidewalks and alleys, and picking up refuse and brush on streets and park facilities.
- Grades and dresses street slopes, driveways, sidewalks and drainage ditches.
- Paints meters, valves, pipe fittings, guardrails, street lines and curbs.
- Digs and backfills trenches and assists in laying pipe and electrical conduit to grade.
- Breaks pavement, pours and shovels asphalt and concrete, raking, tamping and smoothing asphalt and operating a manual and automatic compactor.
- Digs out holes with automatic and manual digging tools, filling depressions with slag, gravel, asphalt or other materials.
- Builds forms and assists in pouring concrete for curb, sidewalk, street and gutter repair and construction projects.
- Assists in opening and closing graves and in digging for monument foundations.
- Waters, fertilizes, cultivates and trims lawns, shrubs, flowers and trees.

- Assists skilled crew members in maintenance and repair of buildings, grounds and equipment
- Maintains golf course operating aerifier, mowers and vertical cut units.
- Positions traffic cones and barricades.
- Assists in erecting street signs and meter posts.
- Assists in the installation of water services, mains and hydrants, and repairs of water mains.
- Assists in servicing emergency calls such as removing snow from streets, repairing broken water mains and sewer lines and similar situations.
- Cleans catch basins, manholes and storm, sanitary sewer lines, grounds, ponds, pools and playground equipment.
- Cleans and maintains public restrooms and shelter houses on weekends with little or no supervision.
- Inspects systems and support areas, reports any problems to supervisors.
- Completes daily assigned cleaning tasks of pool deck, locker room, and concession areas (garbage, blowing deck, picking up all leaves and debris).
- Reports any equipment or facility damaged, broken, or defaced.
- Maintain regular and punctual attendance at work.
- Regularly lifts up to 25 pounds and occasionally lifts up to 50 pounds overhead.
- Expected to temporarily perform duties outside of normal classification in the event of a
 declared emergency. In the event that an employee is excused from work other than
 being sick, they will be required to report to work in a state of declared emergency.

MINIMUM PHYSICAL AND MENTAL ABILITIES REQUIRED TO PERFORM ESSENTIAL JOB FUNCTIONS:

<u>Cognitive Demands, Skills and Abilities</u>: Ability to speak clearly so others can understand you, ability to see details at close range (within a few feet of the observer), ability to see details at a distance, ability to identify and understand the speech of another person, ability to listen to and understand information and ideas presented through spoken words and sentences.

Job Knowledge: Some knowledge of the types and uses of common hand tools and standard equipment used in construction and maintenance work particularly as applied to specialized work to which assigned; general mechanical ability and ability to perform unskilled to semiskilled tasks in construction and maintenance activities of a physically demanding nature; ability to understand and follow specific oral and written instructions; physical strength and agility sufficient to do strenuous manual labor for extended periods, under varying weather conditions.

<u>Language Ability and Interpersonal Communication</u>: Requires effective communication skills and the ability to provide assistance to customers both external and internal. Requires the ability to write and speak clearly, distinctly and effectively with fellow employees, contractors and regulatory officials; read in English and compare similarities and differences between words and series of numbers; apply common sense understanding to the work process, procedures, programs and services; and to provide and follow verbal and written instructions.

<u>Physical Requirements</u>: The employee frequently is required to use hands to finger, handle, or feel; reach with hands and arms; and taste or smell. Ability to quickly move hands, hands together with arms, or two hands to grasp, manipulate, or assemble objects, ability to exert muscle force repeatedly or continuously over time; this involves muscular endurance and resistance to muscle fatigue, ability to use abdominal and lower back muscles to support part of the body repeatedly or continuously over time without "giving out" or fatiguing, ability to quickly and repeatedly bend, stretch, twist, or reach out with your body, arms, and/or legs.

Regularly lifts up to 25 pounds and occasionally lifts up to 50 pounds overhead.

Work Environment: Five percent of work is performed in a normal inside office environment with appropriate heating and cooling and is not subject to significant occupational or environmental hazards other than those normally associated with general public contact, dust or odors. Field conditions outdoors are varying weather conditions, with varying low to high equipment noise; walking on grass, gravel, dirt, rock, asphalt, etc.; with normal outdoor to high outdoor dust levels. Ninety-five percent of work is outdoors.

Special Requirements: None.

REQUIRED QUALIFICATIONS AND ACCEPTABLE EXPERIENCE/ TRAINING:

Some experience in performing general manual work and preferably completion of eighth grade school courses; or any equivalent combination of experience and training which provides the required knowledge, skills and abilities.

Pre-employment screenings may include but are not limited to: criminal background search and drug and alcohol screen.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests Council approve the resolution accepting the work and authorizing final payment in the amount of \$0.00 now and \$17,850.16 in 30 days payable to Knife River, Midwest, LLC for the 2017 Annual Resurfacing Project (Project No. 6880-719-121).

DISCUSSION:

A contract was awarded to Knife River Midwest, LLC of Sioux City, Iowa on July 10, 2017 under Resolution No. 2017-0642 for \$841,852.24. The work has been completed and approved by City staff. Liquidated damages of \$30,000.00 are part of the final Change Order (No.6). Change Order 6 caused the final payment to run negative in the amount of -\$25,438.02. Total Retainage for the Project is \$43,288.18 less the negative final pay amount of -25,438.02 for total retainage due of \$17,850.16.

This project involved replacement of curb and gutter, replacement of sidewalks, and asphalt resurfacing of South Saint Aubin Street from Sergeant Road to Glenn Avenue, Glenn Avenue from South Saint Aubin Street to Morningside Avenue and the South Loop of South Fairmount Street from Lewis Boulevard to 4th Avenue.

Below is a summary of the project:

Original Contract Amount: \$841,852.24

Change Order No. 1 Summary: \$6,805.19

Change Order No. 1 was previously approved by Staff on September 13, 2017. This change order repaired a damage storm sewer intake at 4280 Sergeant Road.

Change Order No. 2 Summary: \$34,873.64

Change Order No. 2 was previously approved by Staff on September 17, 2017. This change order repaired the two eastern CN railroad crossings at 3rd Street which was outside of the scope of the original contract.

Change Order No. 3 Summary: \$14,748.00

Change Order No. 3 was previously approved by Staff on April 16, 2018. This change order altered an existing inlet to avoid a sanitary sewer that was directly adjacent to the inlet.

Change Order No. #4 Summary: \$0.00

Change Order No. 4 was previously approved by staff on May 15, 2018. This change order added additional working days to the contract to allow for the Contractor to make repairs to the asphalt that was installed so that no curb height for drainage was retained.

Change Order No. #5 Summary: \$4,050.00

Change Order No. 5 was previously approved by staff on August 24, 2019. This change order cleared and grubbed a tree that had roots exposed by the installation of sidewalk ramps at the corner of South Helen Street and Garretson Avenue.

Change Order No. 6 Summary: -\$62,003.40

Change Order No. 6 was previously approved by Staff on March 11, 2020. This change order adjusts the final project quantities and is an agreement between Staff and the Contractor to set the number of days subject to liquidated damages at 40, at a cost of \$750.00 per day for a total of \$30,000.00

Final Construction Cost: \$840,325.67

The final construction cost for this project is \$840,325.67 which is 0.18% below the original contract amount.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This project is funded using transfers in Water Funds, Sewer Funds, Sales Tax Infrastructure, and GO Bonds under CIP 719-121 "Annual Resurfacing/Panel Patch/Curb and Gutter". The project currently has an available balance of \$983,540.00.

- B. The City Council finds that the contractor completed the project 40 days late and that there should be assessed liquidated damages pursuant to the terms of the contract. The City Council finds that late completion caused additional time and effort by City staff in supervising this project; and that late completion caused intended inconvenience, time, and expense to the motoring public. Therefore, the City Council finds that liquidated damages in the amount of \$30,000.00 should be assessed to the contractor for late completion of the project.
- C. The Director of Finance be, and she is hereby authorized and directed to issue a check in the amount of \$0.00 now and \$17,850.16 in thirty days provided there are no liens or claims against retainage on file, payable from the appropriate fund in favor of Knife River Midwest, LLC for the construction of the project.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff respectfully requests the City Council approve the Resolution granting a permit to FiberComm of Sioux City, Iowa, to perform underground construction in the City's right-of-way for the installation of fiber optic network services commencing midblock in the west right-of-way on Nebraska Street between 5th Street and 6th Street, then east along the east/west alley and ending at 615-617 5th Street.

DISCUSSION:

The City has received a letter from FiberComm for a permit to install underground cable commencing at Nebraska Street, along the east/west alley between 5th Street and 6th Street and ending at 615-617 5th Street.

The fiber optic is being installed to serve the address of 615-617 5th Street.

This fiber permit approval is recommended by staff to continue to provide optical telecommunications services to the area.

Pursuant to municipal ordinance, permits are granted by the City Council to install underground cable to those companies not holding a franchise with the City. In the past, the Council has been concerned about exclusivity with respect to the granting of these permits. The City is prohibited from granting any type of exclusive rights to a cable company, a telecommunications company, a gas company or an electric company under the laws of the State of Iowa. Therefore, we cannot require anybody to use the facilities of FiberComm or any other telephone company.

The attached route has been reviewed by several City Departments.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

There are no budget implications for the City due to this project.

The applicant agrees that if grented a permit for obstruction/excavation in the public right-of-way as described in the permit application, the following stipulations shall govern in addition to those included in Chapter 12.05 of the Sioux City Municipal Code.

- No public right-of-way shall be closed without notice and consent of the Public Works Department, Notice shall be at least ten (10) days in advance of any closing. Applicant is responsible for notifying the properties adjacent to the closure via door hangers. Street Closures shall be at no expense to the City.
- The contractor must schedule a preconstruction meeting with City Engineering staff prior to construction to provide information concerning the construction methods, traffic control plan, construction schedule, and impacts to the City's right-of-way. The contractor must also provide City Engineering with a construction plan showing handholes, conduit locations, and other apportaneous that will be installed in the City's right-of-way.
- Applicant/contractor shall comply with all city ordinances regulating construction in the public right-of-ways during any
 maintenance activities on the buried utility system. Applicant agrees to comply with all other ordinances and any
 amendments thereto of the City regulating the use and occupancy of public right-of-way including, but not fimited to,

- No excavation in the traveled portion of the public right-of-way shall be left opened and with no work in progress for more than five (5) days. No excavation in the parkway shall be left opened and with no progress for more than ten (10) days.
- When an emergency excavation is necessary, a permit application shall be submitted at the earliest opportunity after the work has started, no later than the next business day.
- Contractor shall furnish, erect and maintain the necessary traffic controls such as signs, barricades, flaggers, etc. as required by the City. Traffic controls provided shall be in conformance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways (MUTCD) as adopted by the lowe Department of Transportation.
- A complete set of "as builf" construction plans in paper and electronic format shall be filed with the City's Engineering Division within fourteen (14) days after completion of the project.
- Applicant shall maintain with the City's Engineering Division a telephone number or numbers to call to locate buried cable and to receive emergency messages at any time.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE, AND IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIOUX CITY, IOWA:

- A. The total cost to be assessed against the benefited properties is \$214,155.77.
- B. The work was fully completed on the dates set forth in the attached schedule of assessments and is hereby accepted.
- C. The City Attorney is authorized to commence a civil action against the property owner(s) herein, at her discretion, for the collection of the costs of abating the public nuisance.
- D. That after full consideration of the schedule of assessments prepared by the Code Enforcement Manager showing the assessments proposed to be made for the work, which was filed in the office of the Clerk on the 6th day of April, 2020, the said schedule of assessments, be and the same are hereby approved and adopted.
- E. part and without interest within thirty days after the date of the first publication of the notice of filing of the schedule of assessments with the County Treasurer of Woodbury County, lowa.

G. The Clerk be and is hereby directed to certify said schedule of assessments to the County Treasurer of Woodbury County, Iowa, and to publish notice of said certification once each week for two consecutive weeks in the Sioux City Journal, a newspaper printed wholly in the English language, published in Sioux City, and of general circulation in Sioux City, Iowa, the first publication of said notice to be made within fifteen days from the date of the filing of said schedule of assessments with the County Treasurer. SUX Air Service Development Program Grant

In 2019-20 the Sloux Gateway Airport's primary mission in air service sustainment was customer awareness followed by advertising the convenience and ease of flying out of Sloux Gateway. This year the Airport utilized a digital advertising Expedia campaign, banners, and newspaper advertising to promote the four flights a day from SUX to Chicago and Dallas/Fort Worth offered by American Airlines. With IDOT assistance, SUX plans to continue aggressive marketing techniques using digital platforms.

Sioux Gateway Airport was awarded a Small Community Air Service Development Program Grant for procurement of service to Denver. If successful, we will utilize Air Service Development money to advertise this service via traditional methods and increase our social media presence via Facebook and other outlets. We are allotting \$10,000 for consulting fees anticipating data/analysis that may be required by potential airlines.

Ads will run in Sioux City area newspapers, billboards, and other digital platforms. We will continue to advertise American Airlines, and any additional carriers at Sioux Gateway Airport utilizing all marketing tools listed below. The Airport plans to continue sponsorships of various Sioux City events to promote the use of air service at SUX. Sponsorships for local events include advertising packages of various dollar amounts plus in-kind advertising that is equal to double the amount of the dollar value in the form of radio spots, to commercials, billboards, and print ads. Also included are Sioux Gateway and American Airlines banners, and t-shirts with American Airlines and Airport logos promoting our air service.

The Sioux Gateway Airport will continue to demonstrate the positive economics of using this airport for business and personal travel. This will include the convenience aspect and the amount of time and money saved not 'traveling somewhere else to travel.' If we secure service to Denver, we will market the 3 hubs available to travelers thus increasing the appeal of flying in and out of Sioux Gateway Airport.

DISCUSSION:

The City Engineering Division has completed plans and specifications for the FY21 Panel Patch Project Phase I. The Project has two sites, Wesley Parkway from 3rd Street to W. 7th Street, and the Heritage Ramp outdoor parking lot located at 312 Jackson Street. The project includes the replacement of damaged paving and reconstruction of sidewalk ramps at both sites.

Site 1: The joints on the paving on Wesley Parkway have severely deteriorated causing the City's Street Division to expend significant maintenance efforts and resources to maintain the street surface in order to keep it passable and prevent further damage to the street.

Site 2: The outdoor lot at the Heritage Parking Ramp has damaged pavement that requires replacement and sidewalk ramps that need reconstruction.

Staff is ready to publish the Notice of Public Hearing on April 11, 2020 and April 18, 2020 and advertise the Notice to Bidders on April 8, 2020. A public hearing will be held on April 20, 2020. Bids will be received on April 21, 2020.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

This project is funded using transfers in Water Funds, Sales Tax Infrastructure, and GO Bonds under CIP 719-121 Annual Resurfacing/Panel Patch/Curb and Gutter. The Engineer's opinion of probable construction cost for the work is \$1,175,042.00. The project currently has an available balance of \$983,540.00. Additional funds will be brought forward as part of the FY21 budget to cover the shortfall on this project.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CITY'S CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT

SECTION 1 CONSULTANT'S SERVICES

1.1. CONSULTANT'S SERVICES.

- 1.1.1. The Consultant's services consist only of those services performed by the Consultant, Consultant's employees and Consultant's consultants as enumerated in Exhibit "A" of this Agreement.
- 1.1.2. Consultant represents that the Services and all of its components; shall conform to the requirements of this Contract; shall be suitable for the purposes expressed in this Contract; and shall be performed in accordance with the professional standards of care, practiced by those in the same profession in performing services of a similar nature in existence at the time of performance of the Services in the same or similar location.

Consultant shall be responsible for the quality, technical accuracy, completeness and coordination of all reports, documents, data, information and other items and services under this Contract provided by the Consultant. Consultant shall, promptly and without charge, provide all corrective Services.

Consultant shall be responsible for any and all damages to property or persons as a result of Consultant's errors, omissions, negligent acts and for any losses or costs to repair or remedy any work undertaken by City based upon the Services as a result of any such errors, omissions, and negligent acts. Notwithstanding any other provision of this Contract, Consultant's obligations under this Section shall exist without regard to, and shall not be construed to be waived by, the availability or unavailability of any insurance, either of City or Consultant, to indemnify, hold harmless or reimburse Consultant for such damages, losses or costs.

- 1.1.3. Consultant shall advise the City of the need or advisability for City to obtain any additional tests or information or other consulting service if any are required to properly design the Project.
- 1.1.4. Consultant shall exercise usual and customary professional care in its efforts to ensure that the final construction drawings and specifications and other construction documents when submitted to the City or any bidder shall be complete and unambiguous and in compliance with applicable codes and statutes in effect as of the date of execution of this Agreement.
- 1.1.5. Consultant represents to City that Consultant has sufficient experience and financial resources to complete the services required by this Agreement; and, that the Consultant has visited the site of the Project and thoroughly familiarized itself with the local conditions under which the services required hereunder are to be performed.
- 1.1.6. The Consultant's services shall be performed as expeditiously as is consistent with professional skill and care and the orderly progress of the work. The Consultant shall at all times have access to the Project wherever it is in preparation or progress.
- 1.1.7. Upon request of the City, the Consultant shall submit for the City's approval a schedule for the performance of the Consultant's services which may be adjusted as the Project

proceeds, and shall include allowances for periods of time required for the City's review and for approval of submissions by authorities having jurisdiction over the Project. Time limits established by this schedule approved by the City shall not, except for reasonable cause, be exceeded by the Consultant or City. In the absence of an approved schedule the services shall be completed by the date set forth in Exhibit "A".

1.1.8. Unless specified otherwise in Exhibit "A", the Sioux City Design Standards Manual and Sioux City Standard Specifications for Public Improvements shall be used for any construction contract documents prepared hereunder.

1.2. ADDITIONAL SERVICES.

- 1.2.1. Service requested by the City which is not described on Exhibit "A" as part of the Consultant's services shall be considered as additional services of the Consultant for which Consultant may request additional compensation to be paid. The Consultant shall not perform additional services requiring additional compensation without a written order to do so signed by the Project Manager which contains a mutually agreeable amount of additional compensation for the work. Any work performed by the Consultant for which a written order with a stated amount of compensation has not been issued shall be conclusively presumed to be part of the Consultant's basic services as set forth in Exhibit "A".
- 1.2.2. If Exhibit "A" contains provisions for contingent basic services, such services shall not be performed without a written order to perform the work signed by the Project Manager.

SECTION 2 CITY'S RESPONSIBILITIES

- 2.1. The City shall provide full information regarding requirements for the Project, including a program which shall set forth the City's objectives, schedule, constraints and criteria, including any special requirements, any previous reports or data relative to the Project, flexibility, and expendability of the Project. The City may request the assistance of the Consultant to define the scope of information needed.
- 2.2. The City shall establish and update an overall budget for the Project, and the City's other costs and reasonable contingencies related to all of these costs. The City may request the assistance of the Consultant to estimate project costs.
- 2.3. The City shall designate a city representative as the "Project Manager" authorized to act on the City's behalf with respect to the Project. The City or such authorized city representative shall render decisions and inform the Consultant of the same in a timely manner pertaining to questions or documents submitted by the Consultant in order to avoid unreasonable delay in the orderly and sequential progress of the Consultant's services.
- 2.4. The City shall furnish the services of other consultants when such services are reasonably required by the scope of the Project and are requested by the Consultant if not a part of Consultant's basic services. The Consultant may rely upon the accuracy and completeness thereof, but shall immediately notify the City if it determines the information is inaccurate or inadequate.
- 2.5. The City shall furnish all legal, accounting and insurance counseling services as may be necessary at any time for the Project, including auditing services the City may require to verify

the Consultant's applications for payment.

- 2.6. Prompt written notice shall be given by the City to the Consultant if the City becomes aware of any fault or defect in the Project or nonconformance with the Contract Documents.
- 2.7. City may require and Consultant shall execute, as part of its basic services hereunder, any certificates or certifications customarily, commonly, or reasonably required on projects of this type. The proposed language of any certificates or certifications requested of the Consultant or Consultant's consultants shall be submitted to the Consultant for review and approval at least 14 days prior to execution. The City shall not request certifications beyond the scope of Consultant's services under this Agreement.
- 2.8 Notwithstanding anything to the contrary in this Article 2, the City shall be required to furnish information or services described in this Article 2 only to the extent that such information or service is both reasonably required and actually requested by Consultant in order to perform Consultant's services under this Agreement.

SECTION 3 OWNERSHIP AND USE OF DOCUMENTS

- 3.1. Drawings, plans, specifications, photos, reports, information, observations, calculations, notes and any other reports, documents, data or information, in any form, prepared, collected, or received by Consultant in connection with any or all of the Services are the property of the Consultant; however, the Project is the property of the City, and Consultant may not use the drawings and specifications therefore for any purpose not relating to the Project without City's consent. City shall be furnished with such reproductions of drawings, specifications, photos, reports, information, observations, calculations, notes and any other reports, documents, data or information and specifications as City may reasonably require. Upon completion of the work or any earlier termination of this Agreement under Article 5, if the Consultant has provided construction administration services, the Consultant will request from the Contractor, drawings to reflect changes made during construction and Consultant will promptly furnish the City with one complete set of reproducible record prints. Prints shall be furnished, as an additional service, at any other time required by City. All such reproductions shall be the property of the City who may use them without Consultant's permission for any proper purpose relating to the Project, including, but not limited to, additions to or completion of the Project. However, they are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by the City or others on any other Project. Any reuse without written verification or adaptation by Consultant for the specific purpose intended will be at the City's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Consultant. City shall indemnify and hold harmless Consultant from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorney's fees arising out of or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle Consultant to further compensation at rates to be agreed upon by City and Consultant.
- 3.2. Copies of City furnished data that may be relied upon by Consultant are limited to the printed copies (also known as hard copies) that are delivered to the Consultant. Files in electronic media format of text, data, graphics, or of other types that are furnished by City to Consultant are only for convenience of Consultant. Any conclusion or information obtained or derived from such electronic files will be at the user's sole risk.
- 3.3. Unless required otherwise in Exhibit "A", copies of documents that may be relied upon by City are limited to the printed copies (also known as hard copies) that are signed or sealed by the Consultant. Files in electronic media format of text, data, graphics, or of other types

that are furnished by Consultant to City are only for convenience of City. Any conclusion or information obtained or derived from such electronic files will be at the user's sole risk. The Consultant may rely on the existing building drawings, already provided digitally by the City to the Consultant.

SECTION 4 CONSULTANT'S CLAIMS

- 4.1. If any instruction or decision by the Project Manager gives rise to a claim by the Consultant for additional compensation or time to complete the Project, such claim shall be made in writing to the Project Manager. The claim shall state the amount of additional compensation or time requested and the reasons for the claim. The claim must be filed within ten days of the decision or instruction by the Project Manager giving rise to the claim or it shall be deemed waived by the Consultant and shall not be subject to any arbitration or litigation.
- 4.2. In the case of a claim made by the Consultant, the Project Manager shall confer with Consultant for the purpose of resolving the claim by mutual agreement. If the parties are able to agree the Project Manager shall reduce the agreement to writing and it must be signed by both parties to be effective. If the parties are unable to agree the Project Manager shall render a decision in writing. The Project Manager shall make his decision and provide a copy thereof to the Consultant within ten days of the filing of the claim.
- 4.3. The decision of the Project Manager shall be final and binding upon the Consultant unless the Consultant appeals the decision of the Project Manager to the City Council. Such appeal shall be taken within seven days from the Project Manager's decision by filing with the City Clerk a request for review of the Project Manager's decision and full statement of the facts surrounding the claim and the amount of the claim. The City Council shall fix a date, time and place to hear the matter, which date shall be not less than eleven days from receipt of the request for review. If the matter is not heard within eleven days or a decision not rendered by the City Council within seven days of the hearing, the claim shall automatically be deemed denied by the City Council.
- 4.4. The decision of the City Council shall be final and binding upon the Consultant unless within one month from the date of the decision of the City Council or such additional time as the City may agree upon, the City and the Consultant agree in writing to non-binding mediation the Consultant files suit in Woodbury County District Court.
- 4.5. All time limits herein may be extended or shortened by agreement between the City and the Consultant.
- Any other dispute not involving additional compensation or time to complete the Project shall be brought to the attention of the City or the Consultant in writing as soon as the party becomes aware a dispute exists. The Project Manager shall confer with the Consultant for the purpose of resolving the dispute by mutual agreement. If the parties are able to agree, the Project Manager shall reduce the agreement to writing and it must be signed by both parties to be effective. If the parties are unable to agree, the Project Manager shall render a decision in writing. The Project Manager shall make the decision and provide a copy thereof to the Consultant within ten days of the presentation of the dispute. Thereafter, the provisions of Sections 4.3 and 4.4. shall apply.
- 4.7. All claims, disputes and other matters in question between the City and the Consultant, arising out of or relating to this Agreement or the breach thereof, may be decided by non-

binding mediation, only if the City and the Consultant can mutually agree in writing upon the time, places, mediators or arbitrators, and various rules of mediation conduct, any other paragraph, law or rule to the contrary notwithstanding.

SECTION 5 TERMINATION, SUSPENSION OR ABANDONMENT

- 5.1. This Agreement may be terminated by either party upon not less than seven days' written notice should the other party fail substantially to perform in accordance with the terms of this Agreement through no fault of the party initiating the termination.
- 5.2. If the Project is suspended by the City for more than 30 consecutive days, the Consultant shall be compensated for services performed prior to notice of such suspension. When the Project is resumed, the Consultant's compensation shall be equitably adjusted to provide for expenses incurred in the interruption and resumption of the Consultant's services.
- 5.3. This Agreement may be terminated by the City upon not less than seven days' written notice to the Consultant in the event that the Project is permanently abandoned. If the Project is abandoned by the City for more than 90 consecutive days, the Consultant may terminate this Agreement by giving written notice.
- 5.4. Failure of the City to make payments to the Consultant in accordance with this Agreement shall be considered substantial nonperformance and cause for termination.
- 5.5. This Agreement may also be terminated by the City upon seven days written notice, without regard to any fault or failure to perform by any party, and solely for the City's convenience. In the event of such termination, the Consultant shall be paid compensation in the same manner as set out in Section 5.7, and City shall have no further liability for compensation expenses, or fees to Consultant hereunder except as set out under Section 5.8.
- 5.6. If the City fails to make payment when due the Consultant for services and expenses, the Consultant may, upon seven days' written notice to the City, suspend performance of services under this Agreement. Unless payment in full is received by the Consultant within seven days of the date of the notice, the suspension shall take effect without further notice. In the event of a suspension of services, the Consultant shall have no liability to the City for delay or damage caused the City because of such suspension of services.
- 5.7. In the event of termination not the fault of the Consultant, the Consultant shall be compensated for services performed prior to termination, together with reimbursable expenses incurred and due and termination expenses.
- 5.8. In the event of any termination under this Section 5, the Consultant consents to City's selection of another consultant of City's choice to assist the City in any way in completing the Project. Consultant further agrees to cooperate and provide any information requested by City in connection with the completion of the Project. Any services provided by Consultant which are requested by City after termination shall be fairly compensated by City.
- 5.9. In the event of termination due to the failure of the Consultant to abide by the provisions of this agreement, the City may at its option:
- 5.9.1. Compensate the Consultant for all services satisfactorily performed prior to date of termination plus all reimbursable expenses directly associated therewith, and proceed with

- the Project utilizing the services of other consultants, reserving unto itself the right to seek from the Consultant any damages it may be lawfully entitled to receive.
- 5.10. In the event of termination, regardless of cause, the Consultant shall deliver to the City all documents as specified in Section 3.1 for which the City has compensated the Consultant.
- 5.11. Termination expenses are in addition to compensation for basic and additional services, and include expenses which are directly attributable to termination. Termination expenses shall be actual out-of-pocket costs or expenses incurred by Consultant as a result of termination not the Consultant's fault.

SECTION 6 MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

- 6.1. This Agreement shall be governed by the laws of the State of Iowa.
- 6.2. The Woodbury County, Iowa, District Court shall have exclusive jurisdiction of all litigation between the Consultant and the City.
- 6.3. This is a contract for professional services. Therefore, the City shall not be bound to the successors, executors, administrators, assigns or legal representatives of the Consultant in respect to the covenants and obligations of this Agreement absent specific written agreement to be so bound.
- 6.4. Neither the City nor the Consultant shall assign or transfer any rights under or interest in (including, but without limitation, moneys that may become due or moneys that are due) this Agreement without the written consent of the other except to the extent that the effect of this limitation may be restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this paragraph shall prevent Consultant from employing such independent consultants, associates and subcontractors as he may deem appropriate to assist him in the performance of services hereunder.
- 6.5. This Agreement represents the entire and integrated agreement between the City and Consultant and supersedes all prior negotiations, representations or agreements, either written or oral. This Agreement may be amended only by written instrument signed by both the City and Consultant.
- 6.6. Nothing contained in this Agreement shall create a contractual relationship with or a cause of action in favor of a third party against either the City or Consultant.
- 6.7. The Consultant shall have the right to include representations of the Project, among the Consultant's promotional and professional materials. The Consultant's materials shall not include the City's confidential or proprietary information if the City has previously advised the Consultant in writing of the specific information considered by the City to be confidential or proprietary. The Consultant shall not use the design materials in any way which may jeopardize the City's entitlement to state or federal funds.
- 6.8. The Consultant agrees to assist and cooperate with the City in any arbitration or litigation involving another person and arising out of services performed by Consultant under this

Agreement. The City agrees to pay the Consultant for all services rendered in accordance with the provisions of Section 8.2.3.3. If, however, negligence by the Consultant is found to exist by the factfinder, the City shall have no obligation to reimburse the Consultant for services rendered in defending that allegation.

- 6.9. Records of the Consultant's direct personnel costs, contracted professional services from special consultant, reimbursable expenses pertaining to the Project, and records of accounts between the Consultant and others, shall be kept on a generally recognized accounting basis and shall be available to the City or its authorized representative, at mutually convenient times.
- 6.10. Neither the Project Manager nor the City's review, approval or acceptance of, nor payment for, any of the services required under this contract shall be construed to operate as a waiver of any rights under this contract or of any cause of action arising out of the performance of this contract, and the Consultant shall be and remain liable to the City in accordance with applicable law for all damages to the City caused by the Consultant's negligent performance of any of the services furnished under this Contract.
- 6.11. The rights and remedies of the City provided for under this contract are in addition to any other rights and remedies provided by law.
- 6.12. Both parties shall be absolved from liability for any act, omission, or circumstances occasioned by any cause whatsoever not within the control of the party affected thereby and which such party could not, by reasonable diligence, have avoided. Such acts, omissions, or circumstances, however, shall not relieve such party of liability in the event of its failure to use reasonable diligence to remedy the situation and remove the cause in an adequate manner and with all reasonable dispatch and to give notice and full particulars of the same in writing to the other party as soon as possible after the occurrence of the caused relied on. The requirement that any force majeure be remedied with all reasonable dispatch shall not require the settlement of strikes or labor controversies by acceding to the demands of the opposing party or parties.
- 6.13. All services described on Exhibit "A" under basic services shall be completed by the time specified in Exhibit "A". If construction administration is a part of basic services, Consultant's obligation under basic services terminates upon the final completion date of construction contract. If the construction is not completed by the scheduled date, the Consultant must continue to provide contract administration but may request additional compensation. Contingent basic services shall be completed within the time specified on Exhibit B-1, the Consultant's Project budget for contingent basic services. If additional services are requested which delay the Consultant in meeting any of these dates, the Consultant shall be entitled to more time to complete the services specified.
- 6.14. The Consultant shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of the City, the City's other consultant's, the contractor, and subcontractors, any of their agents or employees, or any other persons performing any of the work other than those parties identified in Section 1.1.1. above.
- 6.15. The Consultant shall not have control or charge of, and shall not be responsible for, construction means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures, for safety precautions and programs in connection with the construction of the project, for the acts or omissions of the City, the contractor, subcontractors, or any other persons performing any of the work on the project, other than the parties identified in Section 1.1.1. above, or for the failure of any

of them to carry out the construction of the project in accordance with the contract documents.

6.16. It is recognized that neither the Consultant nor the City has control over the cost of labor materials or equipment, over the Contractor's methods of determining bid prices, or over competitive bidding, market or negotiation conditions. Accordingly, the Consultant cannot and does not warrant or represent that bids or negotiated prices will not vary from the project budget proposed, established or approved by the City, if any, or from any other cost estimate prepared by the Consultant. However, if the Consultant's services require the project to be designed within a set budget, Consultant shall be required to re-design the project to bring the cost within the budget at no additional expense to the City.

SECTION 7 INSURANCE AND INDEMNIFICATION

- 7.1. The Consultant shall procure and maintain during the term of this Agreement and subject to availability and at a comparable price for two years thereafter professional liability [errors and omissions] insurance in the amount of \$1,000,000.00.
- 7.2. The Consultant shall secure and maintain such insurance policies as will protect Consultant from claims for bodily injuries, death or property damage which may arise from the performance of any work under this Agreement. The following insurance policies are required. Policies must be issued by companies rated "A" or better by "Best's Policyholders Ratings Guide." The following insurance policies are required:
 - (1) Workers Compensation A standard Workers Compensation policy approved for use in the State of lowa shall be issued with the following coverages:
 - (a) Statutory Benefits covering all employees injured on the job by accident or disease as prescribed by Iowa Code Chapter 85.
 - (b) Employer's Liability Insurance with the following limits:

 Bodily injury by accident\$500,000 each accident

 Bodily injury by disease\$500,000 policy limit
 - (2)Comprehensive General Liability (a) Each Occurrence \$1,000,000 \$2,000,000 (b) Aggregate (c) Personal and Advertising Injury Limit \$1,000,000 (d) Products Completed Operations Aggregate Limit \$2,000,000 (e) Fire Damage Limit (any one fire) \$50,000 (f) Medical Damage Limit (any one person) \$5,000 (3)Automobile Public Liability and Property Damage -Combined Single Limit \$1,000,000
 - (4) Umbrella Policy \$2,000,000
- 7.3. Certificates of Insurance acceptable to the City indicating insurance required by this Article in force shall be filed with the City prior to commencing any work hereunder. These certificates shall contain a provision that coverage under these policies shall not be canceled until at least thirty days' prior written notice has been given to the City. The City shall be named an additional insured on the Certificate of Insurance for the Comprehensive General

Liability and Automobile coverage and Umbrella Liability. All policies will be primary and noncontributory.

- 7.4. Consultant shall indemnify and save City harmless from liability for damages resulting from the negligent act, error or omission of the Consultant under the terms of this Agreement for the alleged or actual infringement of any patent resulting from the use of apparatus or equipment designed by Consultant or from the use of any process designed by Consultant or effected by said apparatus or equipment, and Consultant shall indemnify and save City harmless from and against all costs, counsel fees, expenses and liabilities incurred in or about any claim of or action for such infringement.
- 7.5. Consultant shall indemnify and save City harmless from all liability for personal injury, death or property damage resulting from the negligent performance of any of the work required by this Agreement by the Consultant, its officers, employees, or agents (including special consultants) and Consultant shall indemnify and save City harmless from and against all costs, counsel fees, expenses and liabilities incurred in or about any claim of or action for such negligent act.
- 7.6 The Consultant agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by law, to indemnify and hold harmless the City, its elected officials, officers, employees and agents (collectively, the "City") against all damages, liabilities or costs, to the extent caused by the Consultant's negligent performance of professional services under this Agreement and that of its subconsultants, if any, or anyone for whom the Consultant is legally liable.
- 7.7 The City agrees, to the fullest extent permitted by the law, to indemnify and hold harmless the Consultant, its officers, directors and employees (collectively, the "Consultant") against all damages, liabilities or costs to the extent caused by the City's negligent acts in connection with the Project and the acts of its contractors, subcontractors, consultants or anyone for whom the City is legally liable.
- 7.8 Neither the City nor the Consultant shall be obligated to indemnify the other party in any manner whatsoever for the other party's negligence.

SECTION 8 PAYMENTS TO THE CONSULTANT

- 8.1. REIMBURSABLE EXPENSES.
- 8.1.1. Reimbursable expenses are actual expenses incurred by the Consultant and Consultant's employees and consultants in the interests of the Project, as identified in Exhibit "B" "Consultant's Project Budget" or as agreed for additional services. If reimbursable expenses are not itemized on Exhibit "B", no charge for reimbursable expenses may be made by the Consultant for basic services.
- 8.2. METHOD OF PAYMENTS FOR SERVICES AND EXPENSES OF CONSULTANT.
- 8.2.1. City shall pay Consultant for basic services performed as described on Exhibit "A", under the heading of "Consultant's Services" a maximum amount as set forth on Exhibit "B". Exhibit "B", "Consultant's Project Budget" attached hereto, which is a part of this Agreement, sets forth the costs of services, special consultants, a reimbursable expenses budget, and a grand total. Billings for services shall be on the basis of the charges set forth therein. The absolute

- maximum amount payable to the Consultant for the basic services contemplated by the Agreement is the total sum stated on Exhibit "B". Consultant assumes complete responsibility for the accuracy of the budget. City is entitled to any savings in the budgeted figures realized during the course of the Project.
- 8.2.2. City shall pay Consultant for contingent basic services performed as described on Exhibit "A", under the heading of "Description of Contingent Basic Services", if any, a maximum amount as set forth on Exhibit "B". Exhibit "B", "Consultant's Project Budget" under the heading "Contingent Basic Services Fee" attached hereto, which is a part of this Agreement, and which sets forth the costs of services, special consultants, a reimbursable expenses budget and a grand total. If reimbursable expenses are not itemized on Exhibit "B" no charge for reimbursable expenses may be made by the Consultant for contingent basic services. Billings for services shall be on the basis of the charges set forth therein. The absolute maximum amount payable to the Consultant for the contingent basic services contemplated by the Agreement is the total sum stated on Exhibit "B". Consultant assumes complete responsibility for the accuracy of the budget. City is entitled to any savings in the budgeted figures realized during the course of the Project.
- 8.2.3. Additional Services. In the event additional services are desired by the City, the same shall be requested by written order which shall specify the additional services and maximum charge therefore including any special consultants and reimbursable expenses and shall be signed by the Consultant and Project Manager. City shall pay Consultant for additional services rendered under Section 1 as follows:
- 8.2.3.1. For additional services rendered by Consultant, the charges set forth in Exhibit "B" for basic services shall be the basis for determining the charges for additional services plus agreed upon reimbursable expenses.
- 8.2.3.2. For additional services and reimbursable expenses of a special consultant employed by Consultant as part of additional services, the amount billed to Consultant therefor.
- 8.2.3.3. For the services rendered by principals and employees as consultants or witnesses in any litigation, hearing or proceedings in accordance with Section 6.8, at a rate to be negotiated.
- 8.3. Consultant shall submit monthly statements for basic and additional services rendered and for allowable reimbursable expenses incurred to the Project Manager based upon actual work completed during the billing period. City shall make prompt monthly payments in response to Consultant's monthly statements.
- 8.4. If City fails to make any payment due Consultant for services and expenses within thirty days after receipt of Consultant's bill therefor, the amounts due Consultant shall include a charge at the rate of 1% per month from said thirtieth day, and in addition, Consultant may, after giving seven days' written notice to City, suspend services under this Agreement until he has been paid in full all amounts due the Consultant for services and expenses.

SECTION 9 HAZARDOUS ENVIRONMENT

9.1. The City has disclosed to the best of its knowledge to the Consultant the existence of all asbestos, PCBs, petroleum, hazardous waste, or radioactive material located at, on, or near the site, including type, quantity and location. No additional compensation to perform the services shall be allowed to the Consultant based upon all disclosed hazardous materials.

- Consultant warrants that the Consultant has given due consideration to the disclosure in preparing Exhibit "B".
- 9.2. If there has been no disclosure prior to the date of this agreement, the City represents to the Consultant that to the best of its knowledge a hazardous environmental condition does not exist.
- 9.3. If a hazardous environmental condition is encountered or alleged, Consultant shall have the obligation to notify City and, to the extent of applicable Laws and Regulations, appropriate governmental officials.
- 9.4. If there has been no disclosure of a known hazardous environmental condition, the Consultant's scope of service does not include any services related to a hazardous environmental condition. In the event Consultant or any other party encounters a hazardous environmental condition, Consultant may, at its option and without liability for consequential or any other damages, suspend performance of services on the portion of the Project affected thereby until City: (i) retains appropriate specialist consultant(s) or contractor(s) to identify and, as appropriate, abate, remediate, or remove the hazardous environmental condition; and (ii) warrants that the site is in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations.
- 9.5. If Consultant's services under this agreement cannot be performed because of a hazard environmental condition, the existence of the condition shall justify Consultant terminating this agreement for cause on 30 days' notice. The provisions of paragraph 5.7 shall apply.

Exhibit A: Consultant's Services

Basic Services (Included):

The Architect will provide basic services for the design of the Riverside Family Aquatic Center Pool House Renovation. The scope of the project consists of the following:

- 1. Aesthetic updates to the Admission Control Desk area.
- 2. Updating paint in areas for both the Bath House and the Pump House at the exterior.
- 3. Create an addition of approximately 60 SF (about 4LF extension) to the Concessions area and provide aesthetic updates to the existing Concessions interior space.
- Create a small storage addition (a separate adjacent structure) to the south end of the Bath House. The storage addition is envisioned to be approximately 300 square feet in size and have an OH door.
- Mechanically, we're assuming we are not adding any cooling and that the buildings will continue to be winterized.
- The scope does not include improvements to the restroom and bathing areas of the building other than Alteration Level 1 updates in finishes only. ADA review and upgrades in the bathing and toilet areas of the building are not included in the scope of work.
- 7. The Architect will provide 4 printed sets of plans and specifications.
- 8. The Architect will review the existing restroom facilities in terms of ADA compliance to help identify non-compliance. This does not include design for these areas.

During the Design Phase, the Architect shall review the Owner's scope of work, budget and schedule and reach an understanding with the Owner of the Project requirements. Based on the approved Project requirements, the Architect shall develop a design. Upon the Owner's approval of the design, the Architect shall prepare Construction Documents indicating requirements for construction of the Project and shall coordinate its services with any consulting services the Owner provides. The Architect shall assist the Owner in filing documents required for the approval of governmental authorities, in obtaining proposals and in awarding contracts for construction.

During the Bidding Phase the City will publish notices hold and disseminate the bidding and construction documents to bidders. The Architect will develop addenda for the bidding documents during this phase.

During the Construction Phase, the Architect's services during construction include interpreting the Contract Documents, reviewing the Contractor's submittals, visiting the site, reviewing and certifying payments, and rejecting nonconforming Work.

The Architect will retain the following sub-consultants:

Structural Engineering consultant and Mechanical and Electrical engineering consultant and a Civil Engineering Consultant.

Notes:

- 1. The City will provide IT services and any data design. Raceways for Low-voltage can be provided but the City's IT will pull wires and provide terminations.
- The Architect and the sub-consultants do not provide testing. We will require testing of the concrete to be done by the General Contractor as will be recommended by the Structural Engineer. We will need a soils report information from the City's selected consultant.
- 3. The Architect will be able to rely on the existing building drawings provided.

Change Order No. 2 (TW F Repair): \$160,007.34

On June 13, 2018 the Airport Board approved repairs to Taxiway A North at the intersection of Taxiway A and Taxiway F to be made from a previous project. The repairs will be funded using settlement dollars from the previous project. Thirty (30) Calendar Days were added to complete these repairs.

Change Order No. 3: \$179,798.19

On March 19, 2020 the Airport Board approved the recommendation to the City Council for this change order. The Taxiway A shoulders are deemed a necessary addition and were requested by the FAA to prevent the need for additional Runway 18-36 (previously called 17-35) closers on future projects. This Change Order includes 20' of bituminous shoulders to be added to Taxiway A between Runway 18-36 and Taxiway C.

The contract time will be increased from 310 Calendar Days to 350 Calendar Days.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The FAA will fund this at 90%. The Airport contribution will be approximately \$1,387,259.26 and was programmed in FY2019 under CIP No. 749-114.

WITNESSETH, that

 In accordance with the provisions of lowa Code Sections 313.2 and / or 308.42, the LPA hereby agrees to transfer jurisdiction of the following public road segment(s), including all structures and right-of-way, to the STATE:

That portion of Virginia Street from Gordon Drive south to the I-29 northbound frontage road a length of approximately 0.08 miles, as shown on Exhibit A attached. The transfer portion is intended to become part of lowa 12.

- The STATE agrees to accept the road segment(s) described in this Agreement into its road system and maintain them in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations and administrative rules.
- The LPA and the STATE have examined the physical condition of the public road segment(s) described in this Agreement and have agreed that:
 - The road segment(s) shall be transferred in its(their) present condition.
 - No access points will be allowed in this section of roadway to be transferred as it is to be classified as a Priority 1 access controlled highway.
- The STATE shall assume its share of concurrent jurisdiction including maintenance of said public road segment;
 - i. At a time and date specified by the LPA and acceptable to the STATE.

The LPA shall provide copies to the STATE of construction or as-built plans, right-of-way information, local traffic operations ordinances such as speed limits and parking restrictions, etc., and public or private utility plans and agreements or permits for the portions of said public road segment,

2. The STATE has inspected the public road segment(s) described in this Agreement and agrees to accept said road subject to the conditions set forth herein. In accordance with lowa Code Section 306.42(6), nether the LPA nor the STATE shall be held liable for any claim for damage for any act or omission relating to the design, construction, or maintenance of the public road segment(s) described in this Agreement that occurred prior to the effective date of the transfer.

- The LPA shall transfer to the STATE by quit claim deed all its legal or equitable title or interest in the right-of-way of said public road segment. 

Originally the 10% required match was to be split between BNSF Railway Company and the City of Sioux City. However, since the time of application, BNSF Railway Company has informed the City of Sioux City that they will no longer be providing the 5% match. City staff are recommending that the project still move forward with the City covering the full 10% match as these improvements are necessary in order to qualify for a train horn quiet zone in the future. If the project does not move forward at this time, it could be years before this funding is available again.

Staff respectfully requests Council approve a contract with Mark Albenesius Inc. of South Sioux City, Nebraska in the amount of \$179,961.50 for the construction of the 2020 Phase III Emergency Utility Pavement Repair Project - Grandview Blvd. and 32nd St. (Project No. 7112-519-127).

DISCUSSION:

This project is located at the intersection of 32nd Street and Grandview Boulevard. There was a water main break in the intersection which may have caused the pavement failure north of the intersection. The project will replace the water main, some storm sewer infrastructure and the street.

DISCUSSION:

Paul Koskovich and Ben Murphy have partnered together to form Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC, with a focus on developing commercial real estate in the Siouxland area. The developers have identified a demand for commercial warehouse space in this market and have designed plans for a spec building with flex contractor space to help fulfill this demand. The developers purchased 2.07 acres of land in the Yards at the end of 2019 with plans to construct two new spec buildings on the site, each consisting of 9,600 square feet. The flex spaces allow for a business to lease a minimum of 2,400 square feet, with the capability of leasing up to 9,600 square feet. The space is being built out as lease agreements are signed with tenants based on their needs. Construction of the spec buildings is underway and will be completed in the summer of 2020.

Proposal

City staff has finalized a development agreement and minimum assessment agreement with Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC to provide assistance for the project.

As part of the agreement Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC will:

- Commit to constructing two (2) new 9,600 square foot spec buildings on the property.
- Enter into a minimum assessment agreement of \$1.2 million.
- Complete construction of the new buildings no later than December 31, 2020.

As part of the agreement the City will:

Provide financial assistance in the form of 75% property tax rebate for five years.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The City will benefit from increased property taxes resulting from the minimum assessment agreement. The City's financial commitment to this project will be in the form of partial property tax rebates.

To expand development opportunities, develop the resources to support economic growth, and develop new business sites.

Staff respectfully requests Council approve Addendum No. 3 to the Collection System Odor Control Services Contract with US Peroxide, LLC dba USP Technologies for additional dosing funding due to a milder, drier winter, additional dosing during special events, an exposed manhole at Riverside Lift Station, increased dosing at WWTP headworks due to construction and increased dosing at Darling Ingredients, Inc. for response to citizen complaints at York Lift Station running through June 30, 2020 in an amount not to exceed \$55,000.00.

Staff respectfully requests Council approve Amendment No. 3 to the Collection System Odor Control Services Contract with US Peroxide, LLC d.b.a. USP Technologies of Atlanta, Georgia to extend services for one (1) year beginning July 1, 2020 and ending June 30, 2021 and in an amount not to exceed \$370,000.00.

DISCUSSION:

The City Council approved a contract with US Peroxide, LLC d.b.a. USP Technologies on April 2, 2012 for Collection System Odor Control Services pursuant to Resolution No. 2012-0217. The initial term of the contract was from May 1, 2012 through April 30, 2013 with the contract being extended for up to a total of four (4) renewals, each for a period of one (1) year upon mutual agreement of the parties. The City Council approved Amendment No. 2 to the contract on March 20, 2017, pursuant to Resolution No. 2017-0256, to extend services for an additional 3 years. The current contract will expire June 30, 2020. In response to an increase in odor complaints near Riverside and York Lift Stations and the WWTP, increased chemical dosage treatment has created a shortfall in the odor control budget for the current year. Staff requests the City Council authorize execution of Addendum No. 3 in an amount not to exceed \$55,000.00.

The increased demand has resulted from: a collapsed manhole on Florence Avenue that allows odors to escape; greater need for odor control at Darling Ingredients; and various construction activities at the WWTP.

The aforementioned contract extension included a stipulation that the amount per year not to exceed \$370,000.00 per fiscal year the first year, with a maximum increase of 4.5% annually thereafter. To date, the WWTP has been under budget since 2016 in a total amount of \$70,076.00 (2016-2017 - \$24,336.00; 2017-2018 - \$29,667.00; 2018-2019 - \$16,073.00).

Staff also requests the City Council extend the contract with USP for one (1) year. With warm weather approaching discontinuation of the contract without a new contract in place is not recommended by staff as it would eliminate all forms of odor and corrosion control and could result in numerous odor complaints. Staff feels that continuity in the odor control program is extremely important. USP has been responsive to the City's needs and has demonstrated that the system currently in place is effective. The contract extension would be in an amount not to exceed \$370,000.00.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

These charges will be paid for out of the Sewer fund # 520-2301-452.30-12.

As USP Technologies approaches the odor control budget limit for the contract year, it was determined that additional funding would be necessary to continue to maintain odor targets. As such, USP is requesting an additional \$55,000 of funding. The breakdown for this is as follows:

1. Four additional deliveries of ferrous chloride to Riverside LS for an average dosage rate of 180 gallons/day through June 30, 2020

1. Call to Order

Michelle Bostinelos, Chair, called the meeting to order at approximately 4:05 p.m.

2. Approval of Minutes from the December 18, 2019 Meeting

Staff provided copies of minutes from the December 18, 2019 meeting. DeSmidt (Drent) moved to approve the minutes. Motion carried. (4-0-0).

3. New Business

a) Mission Statement Draft

Staff developed a draft mission statement based on discussion from the November 20, 2019 meeting. The group perfected the draft to reflect the overall vision of what the group wishes to accomplish and intend to post the mission statement on all agendas to stay focused on the end goals and why this group was formed. The final mission statement reads as follows: "The Mission of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee is to transform our city into a bicycle/pedestrian-friendly community for future generations by: 1.) ensuring that bicycle and pedestrian facilities are included in both private and public development plans submitted to or by the city, 2.) identifying existing locations where current infrastructure hinders bicycle/pedestrian use and propose improvements to make such locations more bicycle/pedestrian-friendly, and 3.) advocating and educating for active transportation." Drent (Smith) moved to approve the mission statement as amended by the Committee. Motion carried. (4-0-0).

b) Overview of Known Potential Funding Sources for Bike/Ped Projects

Using existing grant information gathered from the SIMPCO website as a starting point, staff compiled a draft list of grants that would apply to active transportation projects. The grant that may apply the most for bike/ped projects in the future is the Transportation Alternative Program (TAP) administrated by SIMPCO. This program awards federal funding for projects such as bike/ped facilities, trails, and safe routes to schools projects. This funding source is programmed four years in advance. Other alternatives include Wellmark, Gilchrist, MRHD, REAP, and Recreational Trails Programs. Smith also has several ideas on grants from companies related to cycling including QBP (Quality Bicycle Products) Grant, the UP (Union Pacific) Foundation, and Kiewitt Foundation. A grant application schedule can be incorporated into the Bike/Ped/Trail Master Plan to coordinate the timing of projects. There are not many funding sources available for planning documents. SIMPCO has funds available for planning documents and setting the master plan as a priority for the city applications needs to be discussed with City management staff. Active Transportation has an item in the Capital Improvement Plan Public Works section that has

a balance of \$400,000. The funds are currently not programmed into the next four budget years, but a portion of those funds should be requested to move into the next fiscal cycle to use as city match to hire a consultant to complete the master plan. The remaining balance can be used for implementation.

4. Old Business

a) Long Term Projects and 2020 Quick Wins

Staff began a working document based on the 2019 Annual Report Goals, outlining long term, short term, and quick wins under each goal. DeSmidt suggested adding the sidewalk crossing signs added to the South Lakeport/Southern Hills Drive, alerting for pedestrians crossing especially from the Arena building to the Casey's/Hotels across the street. After discussion with Dave Carney and Pete Groetken, a pedestrian pedestal button will be added to that intersection in the future. As part of this discussion, the group would like to meet with the new Council member, Julie Schoenherr, to orientate her with the group and vision. Julie has shown great enthusiasm for bike/ped issues in the SIMPCO MPO group and introducing her to current projects and goals would be beneficial. The Community Development Department will have a meeting with Julie in the coming weeks and staff will see if some time can be devoted to current activities of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee and general bike/ped projects in the area.

b) <u>Bike / Ped Master Plan Update</u> No update to this project at this time.

5. Staff Site Plan Reviews for Sidewalk Connections (12/19/19 - 01/09/20)

Staff attends Development Review Committee (DRC) meetings to review site plans for side-walk connections and other active transportation items as staff liaison of the Active Transportation Advisory Committee. Only one applicable item was presented; the Riverfront infrastructure plan and the District 42 apartment plan final plan came forward again. One trail will remain open at all times during the Riverfront construction process, which was a group concern. The sidewalk connections in the District 42 development remain installed as intended and the ADA paths were shown on the new plan set.

6. Roundtable / Future Agenda Items / Other Business

Drent provided a photo of a newer bus stop on W 3rd St / Market St that is not ADA compliant due to passable sidewalk width. Staff forwarded the photo and request to fix to Dave Carney 1/16/20.

Agenda Item 2020-0018: Requested site plan approval for the property located at 4111 Floyd Boulevard. (Petitioner: Bacon Creek Design)

Madsen presented the requested site plan approval for the property located at 4111 Floyd Boulevard. The Petitioner is planning on adding an approximate 345 square foot addition to the rear of the building. This was heard by the Design Review Committee on February 9, 2020 and denied due to multiple issues. Madsen went over the setbacks, lot coverage, parking, and design standards. Geary asked for clarification on if the designs still need to be reviewed before a permit is issued. Madsen stated no waiver needs to be granted at this point. Petitioner, Rob Porter, 4111 Floyd Boulevard appeared. Stewart questioned the parking and where the employees park. Porter stated they park at Select Marts spots.

BACKGROUND REPORT:

The City has received a request from Todd Harlow, petitioner, to vacate approximately 17,640 square feet tract of Thirty-third Street adjacent to 3215 and 3221 Talbot Road. The petitioner intends to add the right of way to his property at 3215 Talbot Road. A general area map is enclosed for your review.

ANALYSIS:

As stated, the petitioner is requesting to vacate Thirty-third Street adjacent to his property at 3215 Talbot Road. The right of way was originally platted as part of Spring Hill Addition in 1888 with a 28 foot wide right of way, with the expectation that the property to the south would develop with the remaining width of the right of way included. No additional platting ever occurred.

The following criteria are used to determine whether to vacate rights-of-way:

- Cities may vacate streets and alleys but must consider the interests of the public.
 Public notice was mailed to properties within 200 feet, excluding rights-of-way. One response was received from the property owner to the north with interest in purchasing half of the right of way.
- Streets and alleys should not be vacated for the benefit of private persons if it will probably seriously inconvenience the public.

The property has been platted as right of way since 1888. No evidence can be found that any street improvements were ever made to Thirty-third Street.

 The vacation of a street or alley should not deprive the complaining property owner of convenient and reasonable access to or from his property to a substantial degree.

One phone response has been received in favor of the request from the adjacent property owner to the north. That property is in the process of selling the property, and the new owners may have an interest in purchasing half of the right of way.

 The City Council must determine whether the street or alley is necessary for public use and convenience and whether they are sufficiently traveled to justify maintenance at public expense.

The vacation will not impact the transportation system.

 The right to reasonable ingress and egress to abutting properties may not be totally destroyed; however, as long as one reasonable means of ingress and egress to a lot remains it is not so adversely affected.

No ingress or egress will be impacted. All properties adjacent have access to Talbot Road.

• Non-abutting owners have far less standing to challenge a vacation.

No responses from non-abutting property owners have been received.

Staff respectfully requests City Council approve the requested vacations and rezoning, subject to the following findings.

Planning and Zoning Commission:

Agenda Item 2020-0022: Requested vacation of 2nd Street, Walnut Avenue, 3rd Street, and the north/south alleys adjacent to 130 Hidden View Drive and 120 and 210 Cornelia Street. (Petitioner: Hands Property of Siouxland - Sam Moos)

Agenda Item 2020-0023: Requested rezoning of 100-140 Hidden View Drive and 120 and 210 Cornelia Street from NC.4 and NC.5 to UR. (Petitioner: Hands Property of Siouxland - Sam Moos)

Madsen presented the requested vacation of 2nd Street, Walnut Avenue, 3rd Street, and the north/south alleys adjacent to 130 Hidden View Drive and 120 and 210 Cornelia Street and the rezoning of 100-140 Hidden View Drive and 120 and 210 Cornelia Street together. Madsen stated the rezoning will allow for an additional 52 units in the Hidden View Acres development. The petitioner is requesting the zone change to Urban Residential (UR) to allow for the town-

house/apartment style house. Madsen noted the units do not meet the City's definition of apartment due to the lack of shared hallways, but the units are being treated as such. Madsen shared the petitioner's preliminary plat with a brief overview noting that the plat has not yet been approved at staff level.

Madsen stated it is the City's policy to vacate and dispose of unneeded rights-of-way. Madsen stated that the City Engineering staff had a concern regarding the proposed vacation of 3rd Street. When the property to the east develops, 3rd Street would be the most ideal for looping a street and necessary utilities. Staff would recommend approval with the condition of removing 3rd Street from the request to allow for future street and utility connections.

O'Neill asked if the petitioner had been informed of the removal of 3rd Street and if the petitioner was agreeable to that removal. Madsen stated the Petitioner was informed, but the petitioner would have to answer as to his feelings on the removal. Geary questioned if an easement could be granted if 3rd Street was still vacated. Madsen stated that is an option, but it would have to be put as a condition of approval. Geary also needed clarification on why we are rezoning the current units. Madsen stated if the development came forward today it would need to be Urban Residential and for consistency staff is recommending rezoning of the entire development. There was general discussion between Commission members about an easement.

Sam Moos, petitioner, 3225 46th Street, Sioux City, Iowa, stated that he was okay with the removal of 3rd Street from the application. O'Neill asked why he had originally requested 3rd Street. Moos stated that it would have given him more room to work with, but he can make it work without 3rd Street.

O'Neill (Glisar) moved to approve item 2020-0022 with the removal of 3rd Street from the application request. Motion carried. 7-0-0 (Yes: Bostinelos, Geary, Ross, Glisar, O'Neill, Anderson, Stewart, No 0: Abstain: 0).

BACKGROUND REPORT:

The City has received a request from Hands Property of Siouxland – Sam Moos, petitioner, to vacate approximately 2.7 acres of right of way and rezone property from NC.4 (Neighborhood Conservation) and NC.5 (Neighborhood Conservation) to UR (Urban Residential) in the area generally bounded by 1st Street, 3rd Street, Cornelia Street, and the Hidden View Acres development. The petitioner is proposing to expand the existing Hidden View apartment / townhouse development. A general area map is enclosed for your review.

ANALYSIS:

As stated, the petitioner is requesting vacation and rezoning approval to expand the Hidden View Acres development in the Greenville neighborhood. The City Council approved vacation of right of ways (Ordinance No. 2012-0865) and rezoning (Ordinance No. 2012-0866) on December 17, 2012. The petitioner built sixteen units in the development. The petitioner is requesting to further the development with an additional 52 apartment / townhouse units on the property to the north and west of the existing Hidden View Acres development. The petitioner is requesting rezoning to Urban Residential (UR) to allow the development of townhouses with more than 4 units on a single lot. The property would operate similar to an apartment complex. A preliminary site plan can be found in Attachment D.

City Engineering has noted a concern with the vacation of 3rd Street, stating that when the property to the east were to develop, 3rd Street would be ideal for a looping street and utility connection. Staff visited the site, and noted a significant grade change on 3rd Street, being approximately 70' in elevation change over roughly 300 feet, or a 25% slope. Engineering would still prefer 3rd Street remain open to allow for future utility connections as there is a watermain in 3rd Street. Staff did receive one phone response from the property owner to the north that he would be in favor of vacating 3rd Street if he can purchase half.

The petitioner will bring forward a final plat at a later date to combine all of their property and acquired right of way into a single lot. As stated earlier, the development would operate as an apartment complex and each unit could not be parceled and sold individually.

EXISTING ZONING AND LAND USE:

NC.4 and NC.5; Hidden View Development and Vacant Land

EXISTING ZONING REQUIREMENTS:

The NC.4 district is meant for a variety of housing types in a mixed housing neighborhood.

The NC.5 district is meant for a variety of housing types and other allowed uses in a mixed-use environment, with improved standards for compatibility through conditional use approval.

PROPOSED ZONING REQUIREMENTS:

The UR district developed as the Cottage type is meant for a variety of single-family detached and attached developments on small lots, with either street or, in a traditional neighborhood development, alley access.

North: NC.4; Single Family Residential South: NC.4; Single Family Residential

East: AG; Vacant

West: PI; Iglesia Bautista Hispana Monte Sinai

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

City Engineering: Engineering objects to the right-of-way vacation of 3rd Street east of the existing S. Glass St. Vacation of this portion of 3rd Street will inhibit traffic flow in the development of the property to the east of this location.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The 2005 Comprehensive Plan indicates this area as "Urban Residential". "Urban Residential" is defined as older areas of higher density where infill and redevelopment are in forms and densities similar to existing urban development types and densities within these areas.

URBAN RENEWAL / URBAN REVITALIZATION / TIF:

Portions of the subject property are located in the Greenville Urban Renewal Area.

SUBAREA / CORRIDOR PLAN:

The subject property is not located in a subarea / corridor plan.

FLOOD PLAIN:

The subject property is not located in a flood plain.

CITIZEN RESPONSE:

Twenty-three (23) notices were sent within the required timeframe. Three phone responses and one mail response were received to the notification.

The property owner at 3307 4th Street is in favor of vacating 3rd Street if they can purchase the portion adjacent to their property.

The property owner at 3300 3rd Street is in opposition to vacating Walnut Street. This property has frontage on 3rd Street.

The property owner at 3409 1st Street is in favor of the vacations if they can purchase the alley that bisects their property. They are the only adjacent owners and would be able to purchase the entire alley adjacent to their property.



BACKGROUND REPORT:

The City has received a request from Lakeport View LLC, petitioner, to rezone and replat seven lots in the 4200 block of Fremar Drive. The property had a preliminary plat and rezoning approved on June 11, 2012 pursuant to Motion No. 2012-0398 and Ordinance No. 2012-0399. The final plat was approved on October 14, 2013 pursuant to Resolution No. 2013-0778. The rezoning of Lot 9 and final plat of Lots 9-17 were approved by City Council on June 6, 2016 pursuant to Ordinance No. 2016-0508 and Resolution No. 2016-0509. These last items allowed for an additional townhouse unit from the original plat and for up to 3-unit attached townhouse units to be built.

ANALYSIS:

As stated, the petitioner is requesting rezoning and final plat to property in the 4200 block of Fremar Drive. The petitioner would like to construct twin-home and 3-unit townhouse units on the property. This is an extension of the approvals in 2016 that allowed the same type of development adjacent on Fremar Drive. The petitioner is proposing five twin-homes and one 3-unit townhome for a total of 13 units in the proposal. This would be an increase of six units from the current zoning and lot arrangement.

City Engineering did note that the petitioner will need to add new service lines to the additional units being proposed, as only one service line was originally installed to each lot. The petitioner will need to replace entire street panels, similar to the Eagle Ridge developments recently approved that also increased density from the original lot configurations.

City Staff would recommend approval of the rezoning and final plat, as it is consistent with the approvals in the development, and the "100" no build zone" is being maintained on the north lots to the existing development north of the development.

EXISTING ZONING AND LAND USE:

NC.2 and NC.3; vacant land

EXISTING ZONING REQUIREMENTS:

NC.2: Single-family detached dwellings: low density, single-family detached neighborhoods on moderate sized lots.

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS

MidAmerican Energy: There are existing facilities in the area. Any relocation of those facilities would be at the cost of the developer.

Engineering Department: Engineering would like it noted to the developer the lot splits on Country Club View will require new sewer service laterals to be installed for each lot. These new service lateral lines are required to be installed to the sewer main and not the existing manholes.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The 2005 Comprehensive Plan indicates this area as "Mixed Use Neighborhood". "Mixed-Use Neighborhood" is defined as areas that consist of a small commercial/retail center providing locally focused services that may include a residential component. The primary commodities and services that are provided within neighborhood centers are convenience goods, such as grocery stores, personal services (dry cleaning, beauty salon, bank), restaurants, gas stations, and small office uses.

URBAN RENEWAL / URBAN REVITALIZATION / TIF:

The subject property is not located in an urban renewal or TIF District.

SUBAREA / CORRIDOR PLAN:

The subject property is not located in a subarea or corridor plan.

FLOOD PLAIN:

The subject property is not located in a flood plain.

We purchased our home on Lot 6 in May 2017. Although the duplexes and triplexes on the cul-de-sac were under construction at that time, we were hopeful other single family homes (not attached units) would be built around the home we purchased in order to develop a neighborhood of like structures.

We recognize that lots 7 and 8 most likely require joint development (due to the needed dirt work and retaining wall), but not necessarily rezoning. However, if rezoning does occur, it would seem that two duplexes on those lots, instead of five units, would provide some transition to the greater density around the cul-de-sac. It would also help retain the value of our investment as well as encouraging additional single family homes on lots 5, 4, 3, etc.

It is not surprising that duplexes are proposed to continue westward from the cul-de-sac on the south side of Fremar Dr as those lots lose elevation at their rear. However, we object to lot 26 being included in this proposed rezoning. Ending with lot 25 would make the transition more consistent with the north side of the street. Perhaps a triplex across from the triplex already built on the north side of the street would promote consistency and lessen the economic impact on the project if lot 26 is not rezoned. We assume lots 20 and 21 are included in the development although not included in this rezoning.







Planning and Zoning Commission:

Agenda Item 2020-0019: Requested vacation of the alleys adjacent to 705 Douglas Street. (Petitioner: HarKay Development)

Madsen presented the requested vacation of the alleys adjacent to 705 Douglas Street. Madsen stated it is in the City's policy to vacate and dispose of unneeded rights-of- way. The Petitioner would like only these portions of the alley vacated as part of the Benson Building rehabilitation and to add access for underground parking. Madsen stated he received one comment from MidAmerican stating they have utilities at this location. Madsen stated staff would recommend approval.

Susan McGuire, Center for Siouxland, 715 Douglas Street, had general concerns and questions regarding the east/west alley. McGuire's main concerns were about the ability to purchase their half, who would maintain the alley if the Petitioner owned the abutting alley and concerns about garbage pickup. Madsen explained the sale process on the vacated alley. Ross confirmed that there would still be access for garbage pickup. Madsen confirmed the item will be going to the City Council on March 23, 2020 at 4:00pm.

Bostinelos (O'Neill) moved to approve item 2020-0019. Motion carried. 6-0-0 (Yes: Bostinelos, Stewart, Ross, Glisar, Anderson, O'Neill, No 0: Abstain: 0).

BACKGROUND REPORT:

The City has received a request from HarKay Development, petitioner, to vacate approximately 4,800 square feet adjacent to 705 Douglas Street. The petitioner intends to add the right of way to their property as part of the Benson Building rehabilitation. A general area map is enclosed for your review.

ANALYSIS:

As stated, the petitioner, Harkay Development, is requesting to vacate the alleys adjacent to 705 Douglas Street. The petitioner intends to rehabilitate the Benson Building on the property and is requesting the vacation of the abutting alleys as part of that rehab work. The petitioner is proposing to develop the Benson Building for mixed use commercial and residential.

The east/west alley, lying on the north side of 705 Douglas Street, is needed for environmental air exhausts to the exterior of the building per the 2015 International Mechanical Code. The Code requires that these exhaust outlets be located: "For all environmental air exhaust: 3 feet from property lines; 3 feet from operable openings into buildings for all occupancies."

The north/south alley, located to the west of the property at 705 Douglas Street, is being requested for vacation to allow for a ramp that would lead to underground parking to the building.

The following criteria are used to determine whether to vacate rights-of-way:

• Cities may vacate streets and alleys but must consider the interests of the public.

Public notice was mailed to properties within 200 feet, excluding rights-of-way. No responses were received, and the property is not needed in the transportation system.

 Streets and alleys should not be vacated for the benefit of private persons if it will probably seriously inconvenience the public.

The alleys are not used as part of the transportation system.

 The vacation of a street or alley should not deprive the complaining property owner of convenient and reasonable access to or from his property to a substantial degree.

MidAmerican Energy Company and CenturyLink responded to the PreAgenda with comments that there are underground utilities in the alleys. The petitioner will need to work with MidAmerican Energy regarding any possible relocation of the utilities. All sales of City right-of-way include easement rights for existing utilities.

 The City Council must determine whether the street or alley is necessary for public use and convenience and whether they are sufficiently traveled to justify maintenance at public expense.

The vacation will not impact the transportation system.

• The right to reasonable ingress and egress to abutting properties may not be totally destroyed; however, as long as one reasonable means of ingress and egress to a lot remains it is not so adversely affected.

The subject vacation does not eliminate access to any abutting properties.

Non-abutting owners have far less standing to challenge a vacation.

No responses were received from non-abutting property owners.

EXISTING ZONING AND LAND USE:

DC; Benson Building

EXISTING ZONING REQUIREMENTS:

The DC district is meant for an urban setting of a traditional (and historical) downtown with vertically mixed use buildings that are built to the street and where parking is provided mostly onstreet or in structured parking garages, with surface parking for multiple uses.

North: GC; Center for Siouxland

CenturyLink: CenturyLink does have facilities in this location.

Under Iowa Code section 306.22 and Sioux City's municipal code section 12.03.060, vacation of a right-of-way requires the City to grant CenturyLink a utility easement to allow for continued use of the right-of-way. If relocation of CenturyLink's facilities from that easement is required, the party requesting the relocation will be required to reimburse the relocation expense.)

MidAmerican Energy Electric: There are existing underground lines in the alley MidAmerican will require that an easement is maintained. Any required relocations of our facilities would be subject to reimbursement.

COMPREHENSIVE PLAN:

The 2005 Comprehensive Plan indicates this area as "Downtown". "Downtown" is an example of a true "mixed-use center". It contains a mix of cultural, financial, governmental, institutional, entertainment, residential, and recreational uses. Continued growth of all types of land uses is appropriate.



Paul Koskovich and Ben Murphy have partnered together to form Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC, with a focus on developing commercial real estate in the Siouxland area. The developers have identified a demand for commercial warehouse space in this market and have designed plans for a spec building with flex contractor space to help fulfill this demand. The developers have considered several locations in the Siouxland area to construct spec buildings and have identified 2.15 acres of city-owned land along Al Haynes Drive in Expedition Business Park as an ideal location.

The developers plan to construct two new spec buildings on the site, each consisting of 12,000 square feet. The flex spaces will allow for a business to lease a minimum of 2,400 square feet, with the capability of leasing up to 12,000 square feet. The space will be built out as lease agreements are signed with tenants based on their needs. Construction of the spec buildings is anticipated to begin in the spring of 2020 and be completed in the fall of 2020.

Proposal

City staff has finalized a development agreement and minimum assessment agreement with Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC to provide assistance for the project.

As part of the agreement Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC will:

- Purchase the city-owned property for a price of \$15,000 per acre, or total price of \$32,250.
- Commit to constructing two (2) new 12,000 square foot spec buildings on the property.
- Enter into a minimum assessment agreement of \$1.2 million.
- Complete construction of the new buildings no later than December 31, 2020.

As part of the agreement the City will:

- Sell the city-owned property to Koskovich & Murphy Developments, LLC for a price of \$15,000 per acre in exchange for the improvements made to the property.
- Provide financial assistance in the form of 50% property tax rebate for five years.

The initial step to start the 30-day notice period and set a date for final Council consideration of the development and minimum assessment agreements and sale of land was approved by Council on March 2, 2020.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The City will benefit from increased property taxes resulting from the minimum assessment agreement. The City's financial commitment to this project will be in the form of partial property tax rebates.

To expand development opportunities, develop the resources to support economic growth, and develop new business sites.



DISCUSSION:

The Public Housing Reform Act requires the submission of a 5-Year Plan and Annual Plan by every Housing Authority across the nation. The Public Housing Authority (PHA) Plan is a comprehensive guide to PHA policies, programs, and strategies for meeting local housing needs. There are two parts to the Public Housing Authority Plan: the 5-Year Plan, which each Public Housing Authority submits to HUD once every 5th fiscal year, and the Annual Plan, which is submitted every year to HUD.

The 5-Year Plan and Annual Plan being submitted to HUD this year states the PHA's mission and strategy for serving the needs of low-income, very low-income, and extremely low-income families in the Sioux City Housing Authority's jurisdiction for the next five years. The Plan identifies SCHA's goals and objectives that will enable the PHA to serve the needs of families over the next 5 years, as well as progress made in meeting the goals and objectives described in the previous 5-Year Plan.

The Sioux City Housing Authority is required to hold a public hearing to discuss the Plan and receive comments on the Public Housing Authority Plan each year. The Public Housing Authority's board of commissioners, which in Sioux City is the City Council, must conduct this public hearing in a location that is accessible to residents served by Sioux City Housing Authority. The Sioux City Housing Authority will incorporate pertinent public comments from the hearing into the Public Housing Authority Plan. Sioux City Housing Authority may also receive written comments from the Resident Advisory Board (RAB) on the plan. Sioux City Housing Authority will then use the public comments and RAB recommendations to revise the plan as necessary.

After revisions, if any, are completed, the completed Public Housing Authority Plan template is electronically submitted to HUD by the Sioux City Housing Authority. HUD will review the plan and may request additional information or a revision to the Public Housing Authority Plan from the Housing Authority. HUD will inform the Public Housing Authority when the plan is approved.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

Future funding is subject to timely submission of the 5-Year Plan and Annual Plan.

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ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 1.01 ENTITLED "CODE ADOPTION" OF THE SIOUX CITY MUNICIPAL CODE TO PROVIDE FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SIOUX CITY, IOWA1:

Section 1: Section 1.01.010 of the Sioux City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

1.01.010 Adoption of the Municipal Code. The ordinances of the city, up through Ordinance 2019-0264 2020-0270 as amended which are codified in this volume entitled "Municipal Code of Sioux City, Iowa", shall constitute the Municipal Code of Sioux City, Iowa. Pursuant to Iowa Code Section 380.5, grade ordinances, bond ordinances, zoning map ordinances, ordinances vacating public rights of way and ordinances containing legal descriptions of urban revitalization areas and urban renewal areas are excluded from this code. Ordinances and amendments which become effective after the effective date of this ordinance shall be compiled as supplements to the Code and upon adoption of the supplement by resolution become a part of this code.

Section 2: Section 1.01.030 of the Sioux City Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

1.01.030 Effect of code on past actions and obligations. The adoption of the updated Municipal Code provided for in Section 1.01.010 shall not affect any offense or act committed or done, or any penalty or forfeiture incurred, on any contract, or right established or accruing before the 6^{th} 11^{th} day of April, 2019 2020, nor shall such appeal affect any ordinances, or portions thereof, not heretofore specifically repealed, it being the intention of the city council that all ordinances or provisions thereof, heretofore enacted and not contained or included in this code shall remain in full force and effect, any statements in Chapter 1.01 of the Municipal Code of Sioux City, Iowa, to the contrary notwithstanding.

<u>Section 3:</u> Severability Clause: If any of the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

<u>Section 4:</u> Repealer: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. These are: Ordinance No. 2019-0290 of the Sioux City Municipal Code.

<u>Section 5:</u> Effective Date: This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its final passage and publication as by law provided.

The fifth member may be a qualified resident elector of either Sioux City, Iowa, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa, North Sioux City, South Dakota or South Sioux City, Nebraska. To be eligible to be appointed a member of the board, the appointee must be a qualified resident elector of Sioux City. Before assuming the duties of office, each member shall file with the city clerk an oath for the faithful performance of the member's duties, and a disclosure of his ownership or control or prior ownership and control within the preceding two years of any interest, direct or indirect, in any property included or planned to be included in an urban renewal project.

Section 2: Severability Clause. If any of the provisions of this ordinance are for any reason illegal or void, then the lawful provisions of this ordinance, which are separable from said unlawful provisions shall be and remain in full force and effect, the same as if the ordinance contained no illegal or void provisions.

Section 3: Repealer. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed. These are: Section 2.28.020 of the Sioux City Municipal Code.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Owner is the owner of <u>1711 W. 3rd Street</u> which has been red-tagged by the City of Sioux City, Iowa, and is more particularly described as <u>Lot 10</u>, <u>Block 14</u>, <u>Hornicks Addition, Sioux City, Woodbury County, Iowa;</u> and

WHEREAS, on January 16, 2020, pursuant to Resolution No. 2020-0058, said structure was declared a dangerous or dilapidated structure as defined in the Municipal Code and ordered demolished; and

WHEREAS, since January 16, 2020, owner has provided the required documentation and a cashier's check in the amount of \$10,000.00; and

WHEREAS, the Owner has requested additional time to bring said structure up to city code; and

WHEREAS, the City is willing to amend said Resolution No. 2020-0058 to grant the additional time to repair and rehabilitate the structure under the following terms and conditions:

AGREEMENT

- 1. The Owner agrees to make all necessary repairs to the above described premises within 90 days of April 6, 2020. The repairs required are set forth on the attached document labeled Exhibit "A".
- 2. The Owner, by this document, does hereby authorize and permit the City to enter onto the premises described above and demolish the structure without further notice or further hearing being granted to the Owner in the event the repairs that are required to be made as set forth on Exhibit "A" are not completed within the said 90 days or if, in the opinion of the City, substantial progress towards the completion of the repairs have not been achieved in the 90 days that have been granted herein by the City to complete repairs and rehabilitation. The Owner agrees to reimburse the City for all expenses incurred in the demolition of the above described property.
- 3. The Owner agrees to pay the City the sum of \$25.00 for each day the repairs take beyond 90 days to compensate the City for additional administration and inspection work incurred in connection with the repair and rehabilitation of the above described property. This paragraph will only be in effect if the City determines that substantial progress has been made towards the repairs and rehabilitation of the property and that said repairs and rehabilitation can be completed within a reason time after the 90 days that have been granted herein. This paragraph does not prohibit the City from proceeding under paragraph 2 above in the event the City determines in its sole discretion that there has been insufficient progress made in completing the necessary repairs and rehabilitation of the above described property and that the same cannot be completed within a reasonable period of time after the expiration of the 90 days herein granted.
- 4. The Owner hereby agrees to file with the City a performance bond with such sureties, terms and conditions as are satisfactory to the City in the amount of \$10,000.00 to be used

by the City to reimburse the costs of demolition of the above described property in the event the Owner does not pay the costs of demolition to the City. The bond may also be used to pay the per diem cost incurred, if any, should the Owner fail or refuse to reimburse the City for the additional administrative costs incurred because the repairs were not completed within 90 days as allowed above. If the bond is not presented to the City by the close of business on April 15, 2020, the City shall have the right to proceed with demolition of the above described structure without any further notice, hearing or consent of the Owner and shall be permitted to come on the above described premises with City employees or agents of the City to demolition said structure.

5. Owner by this Agreement gives the City the full access to the property described above at all reasonable times and place with or without notice to monitor the repair and rehabilitation of the structure.

^{*}This amount is based on set unit cost and an estimate of the number of units the City will need during the term of the agreement.

In order to be in conformance with Federal law, the City implemented a drug and alcohol testing program in 1995. The City is mandated to comply with Federal law for controlled substances and alcohol testing. The City is required to perform drug and alcohol testing of (over 190) employees who are required to have a Commercial Driver's License (CDL). The required tests include preemployment, random alcohol, random drugs, return to duty and follow-up, post—accident and reasonable suspicion.

Drug and alcohol abuse in the workplace has been shown to have a significant effect on organizational productivity. Safety can be seriously compromised by workplace drug abuse.

We appreciate the Mayor and Council's recommendation and on-going dedication to our employees.

FINANCIAL IMPACT:

The amount of \$24,000.00 or \$6,000.00 per year will be satisfied by the operating budget in 605-0620-482.20-02, Professional & Technical / Professional Services over the course of the 4-year agreement. The remaining \$56,958.00 will be paid by each department over the course of the 4-year agreement dependent on the department's need for the service provided. This agreement is effective from July 1, 2020 – June 30, 2024.


