Governments assist home owners in small ways

Home improvement work is an owner-driven initiative, but government assists homeowners in a

variety of ways.

One way local governments assist a homeowner is through tax abatements.

Family roofing owner Mark Hassett said his father, Joe, started the independent roofing work after he was approached by an insurance man while working on a house's roof Union Avenue.

The insurance man took a liking to Joe, Mark Hassett said.

"The insurance man asked my dad if he would

do storm damage and repairs for the insurance companies, so my dad agreed to his cousins, and was doing it," he said.

Hassett's father previously worked at the city docks at night.

Hassett said his father would load his tools into his several big roofing compa-Chevy and drive to small jobs on the side.

"In the 50s, it was a building boom," he said. "They were building all the houses in the 50s. He would stop and talk to builders and get the job of putting new roofs on houses being built."

Things moved quickly from there, Hassett said.

"He guit his job, hired in his brothers-in-law and roofs," he said.

of his life, having some of the tomatoes from his garden with him and other members of my family on his porch.


That porch had been a project of his and a good friend, who passed away shortly before him.



teenager, he said.

"When I was about 13 or 14. I was home on summer vacation, and I heard my mom and dad arguing one morning," he said. "What happened was two workers called off. and my dad had this big new house to do on Howard Road. What they were arguing about was my dad wanted me to come and help."

Mark Hassett said his father won the argument.

"I got dragged out of bed,

and went to work," he said. "We were doing this roof, and of course, we had it dried

in. My dad was shingling it. and the other worker fell off the roof. So, my dad had to rush him to the hospital."

Hassett said he was bored siting on the roof alone and got to work.

"I looked at the shingle wrapper instructions, picked up my dad's pouch and hammer, and started shingling," he said. "When my dad got back, I must've done a good job, because he didn't vell at

never got a day off."

Hassett worked for his father every summer, he said.

"One summer. I wanted to at least have a couple days off to have some fun with my friends," he said. "My dad told me 'If you work every day, you can buy a car when vou're 16."

Hassett said his father followed through on that promise.

"My dad paid me good, I guess because he didn't want to give me money, he wanted [me] to earn it," he said. "My dad was a man of his word. and — of course cars were cheap then — I was able to buy a brand new Mustang."

Hassett said his dad developed a reputation for honesty in the local community.

"He didn't charge elderly people, like for a repair," he said. "He fixed it for free."

Hassett said his father's reputation in the community

me. After that, it seems like I influenced his work long after he took it over.

Since taking over from his father. Hassett has tried to continue his father's work. he said.

"I could've moved the company to Lake County, and made a lot more money doing roofing, but because Ashtabula and the people, I've always stayed in Ashtabula," he said.

Hassett has seen the roofing market evolve over his

"We do a roof every day or two," he said. 'We've probably done 25,000 roofs. There's been houses we've done three times — same house, but for different owners."

Hassett said he has worked on many other buildings across the county, and made great memories.

"One time we were doing

this big high condo. They're like four stories high," he said. "We got this 40-foot ladder stretched all the way, and one of my workers goes 'Uh oh vou're in trouble.' My mother had heard I was on this dangerous job. You see this El Dorado pulling into the parking lot, and you see her screaming at me, because it's this dangerous

AUSTINBURG TOWN-SHIP — A small family business has been attending to the needs of home owners for more than 30 years.

Lake Erie Seamless Gutters has been in business for 34 years, tending to the needs of homeowners throughout the region.

"It is a family-run business," said Kim Rockwell, who owns the company with her husband, Chris.

She said Chris' parents, Joe and Nancy Rockwell, started the business 34 years ago. She and her husband took over and have continued to operate it.

"We have a strong work ethic," Kim Rockwell said of the company.

She said they prefer to keep the business small, and work hard to maintain customers.

"Most of our business is by reputation," Rockwell

She said they try to be

detail-oriented and highly professional.

"We are not the cheapest contractor," she said.

Rockwell said the gutters are manufactured on-site.

"We also have snow guards," Rockwell said of the products that can keep ice from rushing off a roof and damaging gutters. She said that has become an increasingly in-demand product the last four years, as more people install metal

The last five months have been especially interesting for Lake Erie Seamless Gutters, as the 2024 Thanksgiving weekend snowstorm changed the rhythm of the business. Rockwell said December and early winter is usually a slow time, but that was not the case following the storm.

"We've seen increase of calls around the storm," she said. "This year, there was no break."

Because of the continued cold weather, and more snow, it was difficult to complete the jobs.

"We couldn't get to the jobs," Rockwell said.

An additional problem was many people decided to wait for the weather to break to call in for assistance, creating another problem.

"We had a two-month waiting list," Rockwell said. She said the company presently has three employees, and that number can fluctuate, but never over

"We are a small company and we like it that way," Rockwell said.
