

AFFIDAVIT FOR ARREST WARRANT

COUNTY OF DALLAS }

BEFORE ME, the undersigned authority, on this day personally appeared the undersigned affiant who, after being duly sworn by me, on oath stated:

My name is Kenneth Cochran, and I am a peace officer of the City of Coppel, Dallas County, Texas.

I have good reason to believe that on or about the 13th day of February, 2015, one

Corey Lee Caldwell

did then and there in the City of Coppel, Dallas County, Texas, commit the offense of :

Burglary of a Habitation

a violation of Section 30.02, Texas Penal Code, a Felony 2.

My belief is based upon the following facts and information: Walter Largent, Peace Officer of the Coppel Police Department, who participated in the investigation of the alleged offense, furnished to me, the Affiant, on February 2/14, 2015, the following information:

On Friday, 2-13-15, officers from the Dallas Police Department and the Plano Police Department were conducting surveillance on Corey Caldwell and Winston Riden, who were burglary suspects in multiple offenses in both cities. Riden and Caldwell were driving a Black 2010 Lincoln MKZ bearing Texas license plate DHK1928. Officers followed the suspects to Ole's restaurant at 600 E Sandy Lake Rd in Coppel at approximately 6 p.m.

A DPS helicopter piloted by R. Ragan and co-piloted by S. Emery, had arrived by this time and picked up the surveillance on the suspect's vehicle as they left the restaurant at approximately 6:40 p.m. The suspects left the restaurant and proceeded to the neighborhood directly south of the restaurant. DPS stated that they observed a suspect, later identified as Caldwell, exit the vehicle at approximately 6:45 p.m, into the south alley of 7█ Hawk. The other suspect, Riden, who was driving the vehicle, returned to the parking lot in front of Ole's at 600 E Sandy Lake Rd.

The DPS helicopter, which is equipped with Forward Looking Infrared (FLIR), observed Caldwell attempt to gain access to multiple houses. At approximately 7:20 p.m., DPS observed Caldwell jump the fence into the backyard of 7█ Meadowlark Ln. Caldwell appeared to be attempting to gain access to the residence by the back door and back windows. DPS could not see if Caldwell made entry due to the angles and line of sight during their surveillance orbit.

After leaving the 7█ Meadowlark address, Caldwell jumped into the backyard of the residence next door, 7█ Meadowlark Ln, at approximately 7:30 p.m. DPS observed Caldwell

attempting to gain access to the residence at this address also but due to the line of sight during surveillance orbit they could not see Caldwell make entry.

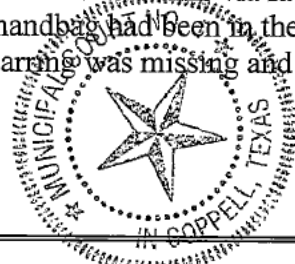
After leaving the 7█ Meadowlark address, Caldwell was observed going to multiple addresses, but it did not seem any offense was attempted. At approximately 7:45 p.m., Caldwell went to 7█ Villawood Ln and jumped the fence into the backyard of the residence. DPS observed Caldwell break the glass backdoor and enter the residence. While Caldwell was in the residence, Dallas, Plano, and Coppell Officers setup a perimeter around the residence. Dallas PD Officers Childers and D. Baker and Plano Officer Krantz were in the back of the location. Caldwell attempted to exit the residence through the garage. As the garage door was raising Officer Childers yelled, "Police, Corey get on the ground". Caldwell fled the garage through a side door into the backyard at which time he was taken into custody by Plano officer Krantz and Dallas Officer Childers. After AP Caldwell was taken into custody he made the res gestae statement to Officer Childers stating, "The guy that with me is up at the.." Officer Childers could not understand the location that Caldwell stated. Riden was taken into custody at the parking lot of 600 E Sandy Lake Rd. by Dallas PD officers S. Baker, Massey, and Coppell PD.

A search incident to arrest of Caldwell's person revealed flashlight, gloves, flat screwdriver, ski mask, a cellular phone, numerous pieces of assorted jewelry, and a black Polo sock that had contained jewelry.

A canvass of the area confirmed that burglaries had occurred at: 7█ Villawood Lane, Coppell, Dallas County, Texas 75019; 7█ Meadowlark Lane, Coppell, Dallas County, Texas 75019; and 7█ Meadowlark Lane, Coppell, Dallas County, Texas 75019.

At 7█ Meadowlark Lane, the back door to the master bedroom was kicked in. Detectives observed a place on the fence, by the garage, where the wood was disturbed and it appeared Caldwell jumped the fence to gain access to the backyard. The only places it appeared that Caldwell went through were the master bedroom and bathroom. Drawers were opened and items were found to be disturbed, indicating that Caldwell was searching for property to steal. The victim, █ did not immediately notice any items missing. Detectives observed another place on the wooden fence where the fence appeared to be freshly disturbed, indicating an area where Caldwell jumped the fence into the backyard of 7█ Meadowlark Ln.

At 7█ Meadowlark Lane, the back door to the garage, facing to the west, had a fresh pry mark next to the door knob that was consistent with the use of a screwdriver. Inside the residence, detectives noticed a Fossil watch laying on the floor next to the stairs and two bracelets laying on the ground near the dining table. On the dining table was a jewelry box that was open and had jewelry laying on the table next to the box that had obviously been removed from the drawers and top of the jewelry box. There was a black Tory Burch handbag in the hallway leading to the backdoor to the garage. Inside the Tory Burch handbag was one square diamond earring and one earring with a black ball on the end. There was a single black Polo sock laying on the floor of the garage a couple feet from the backdoor to the garage. Due to the victims being out of town, detectives spoke with the victims via facetime on a cellular phone. The victims advised the black Tory Burch handbag had been in the master bedroom closet. The victims advised the other square diamond earring was missing and the other earring with a black

ball was missing. The husband, Thomas [REDACTED], advised the black Polo sock located on the garage floor belonged to him and was from the bedroom.

Detectives learned that while Caldwell was inside of 7 [REDACTED] Meadowlark Lane, the surveillance officers advised sirens started to be heard in the area and Caldwell came outside in a hurry. Officers advised Caldwell looked around and saw a fire truck go by and then went back inside the residence. This explains the watch, bracelets, and Tory Burch handbag laying on the floor in different places, because it appeared that Caldwell had left in a hurry at one point. Furthermore, when Caldwell was arrested, he was in possession of the following items that were stolen from 7 [REDACTED] Meadowlark Lane; the matching black Polo sock belonging to [REDACTED], the other stolen square diamond earring; and the other stolen earring with a black ball. Lastly, the screwdriver in Caldwell's pocket at the time of his arrest, is consistent with the pry mark on the exterior door, on the west side, to the garage.

At 7 [REDACTED] Villawood Lane, the rear door to the sunroom had a small glass window broken out in order to gain access to the house by reaching inside and unlocking the door. The broken glass square had a pry mark on the wooden frame that appeared to be consistent with the use of a screwdriver by Caldwell. Caldwell entered the sunroom and then straight into the master bedroom and bathroom, where drawers were opened and jewelry was missing. Caldwell was apprehended trying to escape from the Villawood residence. The screwdriver in Caldwell's possession is also consistent with the pry mark on the back door, next to the broken glass window square.

Based on the totality of the circumstances described above, Caldwell entered the above described three residences with the intent to commit a theft and was successful on at least two of the three attempts. Thus, Caldwell will be charged accordingly with three counts of Burglary of a Habitation, one count for each of the three residences described above.

I believe this information furnished by a fellow Peace Officer is credible.

WHEREFORE, Affiant requests that an arrest warrant be issued for the above accused individual in accordance with law.

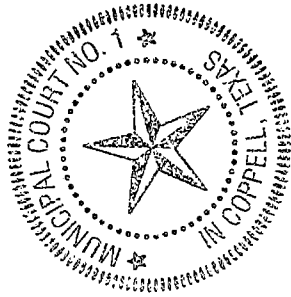
