

# Frisco RACCOONS

Frisco entered last season coming off four consecutive playoff appearances, including a share of the district championship.

The Raccoons put themselves in position to make it five in a row, finishing in a three-way tie for third place in 6-5A Division I, but were the odd man out in the tiebreaker scenarios.

This season, Frisco looks to start a new streak, but it will have to do so with several new faces, especially on the defensive side of the ball.

### KAM PENDERGRAPH RUNNING BACK

The Raccoons are unique in today's era of the pass-happy spread attack in that they employ the run-oriented Wing-T offense. In order to successfully run the Wing-T, the team needs a workhorse in the backfield and Pendergraph can fulfill that role. Despite not playing full-time, Pendergraph was named the 6-5A Division I offensive newcomer of the year last season, rushing for 446 yards, with an average of better than seven yards per attempt, with six touchdowns, and he also averaged 24 yards per reception.

junior Camren Gibson did get experience last season and sophomore Cobyn Harbert is also a candidate.

But the wing-T offense should be in good shape with the return of junior

running back Kam Pendergraph.

Last year's district offensive newcomer of the year, Pendergraph carried the ball 62 times for 446 yards, an average of better than 7 yards per attempt, with six touchdowns, and he also flashed ability catching the ball, averaging 24 yards per reception.

Senior Keane Ramos, who also plays linebacker, is also an option in the ground attack, as he averaged better than 4 yards per carry and had a pair of touchdowns last season.

Pendergraph will run behind a line that includes a trio of returning starters in senior Trent Roden, senior Stephen Wilson and senior Phoenix Taylor.

The defense was hit hard



by graduation, leaving it to replace several all-district performers.

The Raccoons do return all-district defensive back Jaylin Archibald, who ranked among the team leaders in several categories, recording 62 tackles, with four for loss, seven pass breakups and an interception.

Junior linebacker Mason Mitchell is another returning starter and Frisco will

then turn to a number of new faces, including junior defensive tackles Jomarye Tucker and Corey Bolds, junior defensive ends Isaiah Ivy and Xavier Jackson and junior safeties Nash Horton and Ian Staley.

Frisco also returns an all-district performer on special teams with four-year letterman Mason Stallons, who can handle kicking and punting duties.
