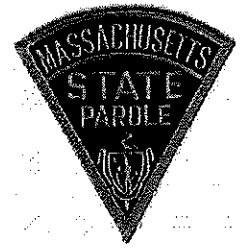


DECISION OF THE BOARD: Reserve on or after May 15, 2025 to CRJ

Board Member 1: Reserve on or after 5/15/25 to CRJ. Subject is currently serving a sentence for Assault w/int to Rob, Firearm, Assault by means DW, 2nd Offense, Poss lg capacity (feeding device), A&B by means of DW, and Intimidation of a Witness. Subject has completed Violence Reduction, Criminal Thinking and in Bachelors Program at Tufts University. Subject is a medium LSCMI. Subject suffers from MH disorder w/ PTSD, Depression and Anxiety and taking medications on a daily basis. Subject was smoking THC while in community as a tool to increase his appetite. Subject is remorseful about the part he played in the offense and realizes that this offense could have worked out.

Board Member 2: Concur with final vote.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS: Waive work for school; Electronic Monitoring (ELMO) for first 90 days after release; must take prescribed medication; supervise for drugs, testing in accordance with agency policy; supervise for liquor abstinence, testing in accordance with agency policy; report to parole office on day of release; report to probation office in Suffolk Superior Court; no contact with victim(s); no contact with victim's family; mental health counseling for PTSD, Anxiety, Depression; Home Plan: CRJ; Mandatory: Tufts University Program
