**MONDAY, DECEMBER 2 – 12:00 NOON:** “Legacy Lecture Series” December’s speaker is **Lincoln D. Nadauld**, M.D., Ph.D., co-founder, President and CEO of Culmination Bio. Dr. Nadauld and team have built a novel multi-modal health technology platform and insights engine for medical research, health-related data, and healthcare services.
