



Food trucks offer diverse, social, fun dining options

While food trucks are often associated with carnivals and festivals, they are becoming increasingly common across the United States in towns and cities as an alternative to fast food and dine-in settings.

The diversity they bring to the table, along with the nostalgic feeling one may get when ordering, allows them to be both a fun and tasty endeavor.

"I like food trucks because they're very unique a lot of the time in both their style and their menu options," said Ethan Autry, Tahlequah resident. "The food is somehow way better on top of being very well priced most of the time. I think it's cool that you get to see the cooks and workers preparing your food."

Others believe food trucks can bring a spice of life to their community that they

otherwise did not have. While Tahlequah is not an especially small community, some food trucks coming into town can often lead to a more diverse array of food while also bringing vendors from all over due to the mobility of the trucks.

Food trucks can also create an atmosphere of camaraderie between both the vendors and the customers. Being able to order and dine out in the open air and being able to see the world pass by allows the consumer to enjoy the world around them even more than usual.

"I think the biggest difference with our food truck versus a more traditional restaurant is that we bring quality food with a very laid-back environment," said Rachel Williams, chef at the Kagumi foot truck. "With our new seating area, people can just come and go, and no one is really being rushed."

Many food trucks pride themselves in their cooking. They typically specialize

in a certain culinary area. Kagumi, for instance, is a hibachi grill. Another food truck, Greengo Banditos, is a self-proclaimed Tex-Mex establishment.

"It's the same every time, and they can get so much more variety of street tacos than just beef, pork or chicken," said Aaron Pelquin, chef at Greengo Banditos in an interview with the Daily Press. "I get here early. We take time braising those meats and using techniques from Mexico that get those flavors out. We don't buy seasoning. The seasonings, the marinades, sauces and salsas are made fresh in small batches daily. So you're going to taste that freshness."

Within Tahlequah there are several stationary food trucks that have a somewhat permanent residence, but others come and go freely due to the food-on-wheel style they present. To NSU students, The Dogfather is a favorite of this kind. The gourmet hot dog stand shares time between Tulsa and Tahlequah, meaning students and residents only get a handful of opportunities to dine there each week.

"One of my favorites is The Dogfather food truck," said Justin Stephens, NSU student. "It's almost like a tradition at NSU to go see him on Monday and Thursdays in downtown Tahlequah. I usually go two or three times a semester to enjoy one of his gourmet hot dogs."

Another traveler is the Blue Greek

Food Truck. This truck travels all across Oklahoma and, each week, sets up shop in different towns. Because of the scarcity of availability, this makes the truck very sought after whenever it comes to town.



Muskogee offers array of palate-pleasing cuisine

MUSKOGEE — Muskogee has a varied cuisine to tempt any palate should folks decide to venture out instead of

staying home to eat.

One of the most popular places to dine at is China King Super Buffet, 231 W. Shawnee Bypass. A mainstay in Muskogee since 2003, the restaurant reopened in August for dine-in and callin orders after a fire in 2019 did an estimated \$400,000 worth of damage. They have plans to re-open the buffet soon.

General manager Priscilla Z said she didn't realize just how popular the restaurant was until the fire.

"We had about 250,000 hits on our Facebook page," she said. "And not just from Muskogee. We had well wishes from all around the state."

One of the most popular items on China King's menu is the butter shrimp.

"It's lightly battered, and it's quickly deep fried," Z said. "We don't use flour, we use something else — if you try to make it at home, the batter is different. Our chili chicken and crab meat are



A fairly new restaurant in town, but a name well-known in Muskogee, is Momma C's Soul Food Kitchen, 821 W. Broadway.

Opened in May 2018, the restaurant was started by Aanje Gaines Wilkerson

and daughter Dominique Embry, and is named after Wilkerson's mother, Cassandra Gaines, known by her family and friends as Momma C, who died in 2016.

"This is something we wanted to do to honor her memory," Wilkerson said.

Gaines gained a regional following that landed her national exposure on the television show "Modern Living with Kathy Ireland" for her efforts to

fine tune traditional soul food recipes into healthy versions.

Wilkerson said there are several items on the menu that are popular, and it's tough to pick just one as a favorite.

"Fried chicken, fried catfish, candied yams, meat loaf, greens, one-pot meal (cabbage, smoked sausage and potatoes), roast, wings and waffles, peach cobbler and cinnamon rolls," she said.

One of the biggest debates in Muskogee is about where to find the best barbecue. A popular restaurant is Runt's BBQ and Grill, 3003 W. Okmulgee Ave.


Opened in 2001, Runt's always seems to have a full parking lot no matter what time of day it is.

"We are very laid back; we will treat you like family if you let us," said co-owner Russell Pratt. "Only difference — you still have to pay."

The menu is varied enough to satisfy the taste of any carnivore. The most popular items are ribs, fish, prime rib, grilled chicken and burnt ends.

"We are family-owned and run," Pratt said. "Most of our customers have watched our two children grow up in the business. They were 7 months and 7 years old and have always been a fixture here in the restaurant."



1. What's your most popular menu item?

Our No. 1-selling item is our fish and chips. It's battered cod. It's really good.

2. What's one item you know customers will love if they just give it a try?

Our chicken and cabbage. It's something they look at and may not seem interested, but it's served on a bed of mashed potatoes with a gravy-based topping, chicken, cabbage, bacon and sun-dried tomatoes. It's really a great item.

3. If you serve dessert, what are your specialties?

We have a homemade bread pud-

ding served with either a whiskey caramel sauce or a chocolate whiskey sauce. It's really good. We sell a pan of it for Thanksgiving and Christmas. We have people signing up for it to take it to their families.

We're named after Captain Jason Farley, who passed away. He was an active-duty firemen who lost his life in 2015 during a rescue incident here in town.

Drip The Beverage Lab's owner Al Soto talks about talks about some of the nuances of the new drink destination.

1. What's your most popular menu item?

Our most popular item would be our espresso-based drinks, like our lattes. We serve light- to medium-roast specialty coffee, roasted weekly from Topeca Coffee out of Tulsa, and Counter Culture, a roaster from North Carolina that has been roasting for over 25 years.

2. What's one item you know customers will love if they just give it a try?

Our crepes that we make fresh all day long. Our most popular crepe is the Nutella banana.

3. What are your specialties?

We are a coffeeshop first, so our specialty coffee drinks – like our lattes and frappes – are the most popular items. Most of our items are handmade from scratch. We usually have five different coffees on hand and over 20 different teas. And much of our food, like our baked goods and soups, are made in-house.

4. Tell us something fun or interesting about your business that most folks don't know.

Drip is a family business. I have five daughters, and four of them have worked for us; two of them still do. Our food menu is their own creation. We have one food item, O's Omelette, named after my eldest daughter, who is now a police officer.

1. What's your most popular menu item?

Our buttercream decorated cookies. We sell out almost immediately every time we put them in the case. The rolled sugar cookie is incredibly soft and flavorful, and our melt-in-your-mouth buttercream is vanilla almond flavor.

2. What's one item you know custom-

ers will love if they just give it a try?

Our floral cakes – rose, lavender, and orange blossom. Most customers are wary about eating something they've always known as a plant, but the flavor of floral cakes is light and refreshing. I think if more people tried it, they would be pleasantly surprised.

3. If you serve dessert, what are your specialties?

All we serve is dessert! But our specialty is buttercream frosting. It's what we receive the most compliments on, and we've converted many "buttercream haters" to buttercream lovers. I wanted to have the best around, so I spent dozens of hours doing research and practice until I found a recipe and technique and perfected it. It's not too sweet by buttercream standards, and it's also creamy, airy, and flavorful.

4. Tell us something fun or interesting about your business that most folks don't know.

I always thought it was self-explanatory, but I'm asked all the time why a cake artist named her business The Bookworm. I wanted to name my business after myself, and since Haylie's Cakes is rather boring, I chose the thing I love most: reading.

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




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
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

Rowan's also offers a full bakery.

"We keep our case stocked with homemade pies, cookies and all kinds of sweets and made-to-order cakes and desserts," Mullin said.

A variety of specialty coffees are available from the coffee bar.

An event room is available.

"At Christmas, the room was booked solid, and we've had birthday parties, and wedding and baby showers. You can get your cake here and just show up, or do it yourself," said Mullin.

The restaurant does carryout, but is closed on Sundays.

"Our community has been so good to us," Mullin said.

Regulars come from Tahlequah, Siloam Springs, Tenkiller, Sallisaw, Poteau, Arkansas and Noel, Missouri.

"We have really been blown away at the number of people who drive here, but it's our community support we really appreciate," Mullin said.

Outside seating will be available when the weather is nice.

"We'll be open for the Strawberry Festival and highlight strawberry dishes," said Mullin.

The Strawberry Festival is the always the second Saturday in May.

"My parents, Larry and Pam Rowan, are partners and run the day to day business," she said.

The bakery is her favorite part.

"I love the bakers. I'm very handson there. But my most favorite part of owning Rowan's is visiting with the customers," Mullin said.















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
