

What is your title? Environmental Compliance and Grants in the Ecosystems and Watershed Management Department

What do you do there or what does that title mean? My title doesn't accurately reflect what I do on a day-to-day basis. I provide environmental education for people of all ages. I work to help them understand their impact on water quality and how simple changes can make a difference. I also oversee special projects. One of the big projects that I am proud to have helped start is a statewide program to replace failing septic systems near waterbodies. We have helped replace over 30 failing septic systems in 19 counties. This not only improves water quality but has helped people with limited income stay in their homes. I have also conducted training for contractors and municipal stormwater staff to help them understand erosion and sediment control permit requirements. As for the grants part of my title, I helped write and implement one successful

EPA grant on environmental education and implemented a second grant to develop a working group to pull together a watershed plan for Grand Lake. Additionally, I work with communities like Tahlequah to find grant opportunities for a variety of projects. Specifically in Tahlequah, we worked with the parks department and two nonprofits to get a U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service grant to help pay for a rain garden at Mission Park to reduce flooding and attract pollinators.

Normally, environmental compliance would involve ensuring the company is following all regulatory guidelines, and I do that to a limited extent, but have been able to craft my job to fit my experience, expertise and passion.

How many years have you been with the company or when did you start your company? I have worked for GRDA for four years but have been working in the environmental field for about 20 years. Prior to working with several environmental agencies and two universities, I co-owned a veterinary clinic in my hometown.




