

Undeterred by rain, crowds enjoy annual Budbreak Festival

MOUNT AIRY — The annual Budbreak Wine and Craft Beer Festival is a chance for area breweries and the many wineries of the area to share some of their offerings. Throw in some live music, food trucks, and a few craft vendors and it made for a pleasing way for folks to spend a Saturday afternoon all while raising money to aid the Rotary Club of Mount Airy in their community efforts. Rain showers that moved in and out during this year's festival, held on May 3, did little to deter the throng of visitors who came to to mix and mingle while sampling Yadkin Valley wines and brews.

From Oak Street down to Independence Boulevard, the event was lively throughout most of the day. Even when the rain came down, it did not seem to bring anyone's spirits down. A few amateur meteorologists were offering an opinion as to what the weather was going to do, based on their reading of a weather app of choice, beneath the awning of H&R Block as one heavier rain band moved through.

With their sampling glasses in hand, and wristbands firmly in place, festival goers took a walk through the event to see which vendors were offering what. For some of them that meant an array of traditional wines in various varietals. Other booths sampled beer, ale, mead, and a few booths were offering some sort of frozen drinks as well.

If someone tasted something they enjoyed, the hope for those doing the selling is that they would then buy a bottle or perhaps even a case of their preferred wine. For those who did not make a purchase, the goal was to familiarize a potential new customer to a brand or variety they may not have considered.

The parking lot between Brannock & Hiatt and The Angry Troll was a focal point of much of the activity for this festival. A large tent with several long tables and chairs underneath it became a welcome dry landing spot for those who came out for the earlier part of the event.

Some of those under-tent folks opted to hold on to their prized and valued dry real estate throughout the day and would hold court with whomever stopped by. B-Dazzle Productions oversaw the DJ responsibilities during the first segment of the event and helped set an upbeat tone even under dark skies.

Later in the afternoon, Tim Elliott took the stage and put

on show that had folks throwing hands in the air and dancing around the parking lot up well past the time that many of the vendors had stopped giving samples and were closing up their booths.

The two time winner of the Male Country Artist of the Year by the Carolina Music Awards showed he knew how to work a stage in a small town. The longer the band played and the nearer to the end of the festival, more people got up by themselves or in small groups to hit the dance floor.

The Rotarians, which hosts the festival, said Budbreak is their primary external fundraising event and through it they have been able to help local organizations with more than \$150,000 in support.

"The success of this event allows the club to support nonprofit organizations and projects in our community and around the world," organizers said.

Proceeds from the annual event support the Rotary Club's

efforts in aiding local school literacy programs, non-profit organizations, youth leadership programs, and more.





Sotrio Vineyards opened its tasting room in Ronda last spring but the story begins almost 30 years ago in the backyard of a Florida home. Vineyard owners Bill and Teresa Piastuch met at the Kennedy Space Center, both work for NASA.

In 1996, Teresa surprised Bill for his birthday by clearing a quarter acre plot behind their Florida home to plant their first grape vineyard. Grapes and wine have been an integral part of their life ever since. Together they have followed this passion for the past 25 years, culminating in the Sotrio Vineyard land purchase in 2015, in the Swan Creek and Yadkin Valley AVAs of the Piedmont area of western North Carolina. In 2019 they were able to build the future winery and office spaces to operate the business. In May of 2024, Sotrio officially opened its doors for tastings and even added a craft microbrewery inside, run by their daughter and brewer, Jamie.

Sotrio offers a selection of Italian-style wines along with eight rotating craft beers from its micro-brewery on premise to offer something for every palette. The relaxed and unhurried atmosphere encourages guests to unwind and enjoy meaningful conversations, ensuring that each visit is special.

"We truly value the relationships we've built with our customers who have played a vital role in helping us achieve our dream," said the couple.

At the winery, the couple said they hope to continue producing







In April Dale Neal visited Boonville to give a speech at Sanders Ridge Winery about his books and his career as an author and journalist. He talked about the book he wrote titled "The Woman with the Stone Knife." He also gave tips to the audience about the things that made his career a success. Neal's visit was part of the Northwest Regional Library's annual Writers Road Show event which brought several North Carolina authors to events in the region during the month of April.

"Reality is so much stranger than any fiction," said Neal. He explained that fiction has an ending, while reality is never-ending. When it comes to journalism and nonfiction, the drama is told instantly to let the audience know what is exactly happening. Fiction likes to keep the readers hooked for a while until a certain climax is reached.

He also explained to the librarians, writers, and aspiring writers in the audience that writing a book is a sign of optimism. Neal said he has read very sad books, and he believes the emotionally sad authors were optimistic despite their tough circumstances.

"If you are that depressed, you would be curled in a ball somewhere. You would not be writing a book," said Neal.

Neal's advice to those having a hard time creating ideas was to write, do not just stare at a blank paper. Just get started and put some words down, he advised. Many people want to know where writings originate, like where the poems they read came from, it had to get started sometime, he said.

"There is no writer's block," said Neal. You have to keep writing even if you do not believe you have anything to write or simply want to go back and correct mistakes in your writing, he suggested.
