























Easter to lead new CAR

hat do you do if you have a first-team all-region receiver returning who is a nightmare to guard? If you are Carroll County, the answer is move him to quarterback.

Yes, those yearning to see more jaw-dropping, athletic catches from rising senior Isaiah Easter in 2025 will be vastly disappointed as his 30 receptions for 556 yards and five touchdowns in 2024 will now be taking snaps behind center. Of course, that is a tradeoff head coach Seth Greer and his coaching staff are more than willing to make in an effort to get the ball in the hands of their best player on every snap.

"He's just an athlete. Isaiah is the kind of guy if you line him up at wide receiver, you can try throwing the ball a few times, but you look at a kid like that and you go, 'Man, we'd like to get him the ball 15 times a game," Greer said. "The easiest way is to make sure the ball is in his hands every play. It's really that simple. It made sense to us and he's a very smooth athlete, so he can do some things deception-wise in the backfield, and we think he will do well. He's a leader. What we like about him too is he is really good under pressure. Isaiah is a competitor but he's also the kind of competitor that doesn't get very rattled. He wants the pressure situations."

Easter's athleticism at receiver and prowess at defensive back (he led the team with six interceptions a year ago) has earned him multiple recruiting looks from colleges. Moving to quarterback should not slow that process down at all, Greer said.

"It doesn't matter to them. They have already seen what kinds of hands he has and his defensive film is just as good. We will still do some things where he can show off those talents, but they understand," Greer said. "They get guys like this all the time that play multiple positions in high school. They really don't care where you play in high school. They can tell where they want you, and Isaiah's intangibles kind of speak for himself."

With Easter behind center in Carroll's new Power-T offensive system, the Cavaliers will try to make the playoffs again in 2025 for the second year in a row. Prior to last season's appearance, Carroll had not been to the playoffs since 2010. Greer calls the Power-T both a running back-friendly and offensive linefriendly offense with a quarterback and three running backs in the backfield at the same time, lending itself to deception and similar elements of the single wing.

"It lets us distribute the ball. We will rotate those guys like crazy because we feel like we have a lot of running backs who can do some things with the ball, and they are physical," Greer said. "Ayden Dickerson had a tremendous offseason. We've got some young guys come up like Dane Leonard and Klay Dalton, and Sam McGrady is going to play some tailback for us. He likes to to get in there and get physical and thumn'

Greer said the Cavaliers will also have the advantage of having fullbacks that are speedy like Youseff Elaffy and Hunter Gravley.

"Elaffy is fast and physical. Hunter is a younger guy that is kind of sneaky in there, so we've got a lot of guys we will be rotating," Greer said. "It keeps our guys fresh and they're having fun with it because they carry fakes out every play."

Carroll will only start one senior on the offensive line this season in right tackle Tucker Hylton. Fisher Myers and Clay Quesinberry are both junior quards who Greer said can move. Center Kaden Delp is a strong kid, Greer said, and right tackle Foster Frazier is a 6-3, 320-pound sophomore "who is a big, strong guy who loves the weight room."

"Our kids just gel together," Greer said. "They understand what we are trying to do and they've embraced the physicality of what we are trying to do. That is what we are most excited about."

Carroll certainly has plans to put itself to the test in the early going. Greer said the team purposely set up scrimmages against Magna Vista and Bassett in order to see tough competition. The Cavaliers' opening game will continue that trend as Carroll travels Aug. 29 to open the season against former River Ridge and New River rival Christiansburg.

"We were tickled with how our kids competed in the first scrimmage. We wanted to see effort, guys getting to the football, playing physical. We saw that, so we are really happy with how physical our kids were and how they competed," Greer said. "We wanted to see really good football teams early, and that was part of the the intent of our scrimmages and playing Christiansburg, was to test ourselves and get better. We were happy with what we saw."

Defensively, seniors like Easter, Hylton, McGrady and Elaffy will carry the load. Both Ayden and Donovan Dickerson will be graduating early, Greer said, noting both are valuable contributors.

"We've got guys like Brady Ayers, a guy that works really hard to play multiple positions for us. Just one of those grinders and he will spell us in a lot of places. Austin Marshall, defensive linemen, he's a big senior, 300-pound guy. He plays hard and will probably anchor our defensive line," Greer said. "Ivan Garcia, he's another 300-pound senior nose and he plays hard. We are truly a mixture and we like that. We can play some young guys and I don't feel like the world is ending next season."

McGrady earned all-district honors in 2024 at linebacker. He will be back at mike linebacker to call the defense and get the defense lined up correctly.

"He has helped these young guys transitioning. He helps them learn. He is a big film guy, watching hours of film a week," Greer said. "He is also a physical presence. We are truly a team mindset. I don't know if we feel like we have many superstars, but we've got a lot of dudes. We know each other's strengths and weaknesses. I think our job is just playing to those strengths. But I can tell you our guys like competing in practice."

Elaffy and Klay Dalton are both powerful, explosive players as well, Greer said. E.J. Conner is back to handle kicking duties. Competition remains wide open for kick and punt returners.

Carroll's schedule will look quite a bit different in 2025. For starters, the two-game non-district series with Grundy has been replaced with Christiansburg. The Cavaliers will also take trade Wythe County opponents, moving Fort Chiswell onto the slate to replace George Wythe. Alleghany moved out of the Three Rivers District in favor of the Shenandoah, while Martinsville takes their place.

"Christiansburg, Week 1, we wanted to start against good competition and we are kind of excited about that," Greer said. "And the district move with Alleghany, but Martinsville is coming in and they are used to playing in a really athletic district. They won't have trouble transitioning to our district. I like this shakeup. We are excited about the schedule and we feel like we can compete. We are just excited about today. They see themselves get better and better on film and I think now they understand the emphasis is on we just need to be a better team tomorrow and keep working at it."

Nobody expected Carroll County to accomplish what it did a season ago, going 5-5 and reaching the playoffs. Greer credits much of that success on changing the culture. Now the goal is to continue building.

"Last year was the installation of culture and procedure of how we do things. Our kids do not have to learn how we operate, how we do things, what the expectations and behaviors are that we expect. They didn't have to learn that," Greer said. "So this off-season, I'm not joking, it was the day after, guys came back that Monday, they were ready. They want to work, so there was no acclamation to anything. We brought our younger kids in earlier. We got middle school kids in here much earlier, freshmen
