

Title V Operating Permit 17-00003

Under 25 Pa. Code § 127.521, the Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) intends to issue a Title V Operating Permit to Eastern Gas Transmission & Storage, Inc. for their Luther Transmission Station located in Brady Township, Clearfield County. The Eastern Gas Transmission & Storage, Inc representative to contact regarding the proposed operating permit is Sarah Crane Environmental Specialist 2, 10700 Energy Way, Glen Allen, VA 23060-9243.

The facility has potential annual emissions of 130.09 tons of carbon monoxide, 78.51 tons of nitrogen oxides, 0.02 tons of sulfur oxides, 0.42 tons of particulate matter including particulate matter less than 10 microns in size, 0.42 tons of particulate matter less than 2.5 microns in size, 8.82 tons of volatile organic compounds, 0.72 tons of formaldehyde, 2.52 tons of hazardous air pollutants, and 12,668 tons of greenhouse gases. The engines are subject to 40 CFR Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ - National Emission Standards for Hazardous Air Pollutants for Stationary Reciprocating Internal Combustion Engines. The emission limits, throughput limitations and work practice standards along with testing, monitoring, recordkeeping and reporting requirements have been included in the operating permit to ensure the facility complies with all applicable Federal and State air quality regulations. These operating permit conditions have been derived from the applicable requirements of 40 CFR Part 63 Subpart ZZZZ, and PA Code Title 25 Article III Chapters 121 through 145.

Any person(s) wishing to comment on the proposed permit which they believe should be considered prior to issuance of the revised permit, may submit comments to The Department of Environmental Protection, 208 West Third Street, Suite 101, Williamsport, PA 17701. A 21-day comment period from the date of this publication will exist for the submission of comments. Each written comment must contain the following: Name, address and telephone number of the person submitting the comments; Identification of the proposed permit (specify Permit No. TVOP 17-00003); Concise statements regarding the relevancy of the information or objections to issuance of the permit.

A public hearing may be held, if the Department of Environmental Protection, in its discretion, decides that such a hearing is warranted based on the information received. All persons submitting comments or requesting a hearing will be notified of the decision to hold a hearing by publication in the newspaper or by the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*, or by telephone, where the Department of Environmental Protection determines such notification is sufficient.
