To: Bryan A. Faaborg, the above-named Respondent:

The above-entitled matter came before the undersigned judicial officer upon a motion of the county. The court, upon all the files, records, and proceedings herein, and being duly advised:

Hereby orders that you personally appear before the Honorable Kayla Johnson, District Court Judge, at 416 S Hiawatha Ave. Pipestone, MN on May 19th, at 9:30 A.M., or as soon thereafter as Bryan A. Faaborg can be heard, to attempt settlement or show cause as to why the court should not enter an order finding you in contempt of court; or to have the contempt action referred to district court for an evidentiary hearing on the relief demanded in the accompanied Motion for Contempt.

The county claims that you have failed to obey the court order dated February 27, 2025. The alleged failures to comply with the ordered provisions are set forth in the Supporting Affidavit which is included with the Motion for Contempt.

The Court ordered you to:

1. Provide the county child support agency with updated Medical Opinion Form every six months, to document any restrictions on his ability to work on or before June 1, 2025, and every six months after that for so long as doctors place restrictions on ability to work.
2. Provide regular, updated documentation as a basis for the county, or Lindsay Jo Saker, to bring a motion to modify support to reestablish support obligations for the children.
3. Provide a signed and dated written statement from a medical doctor regarding ability to work, and/or any restrictions on ability to work.
4. Inform the county of any application for and/or receipt of social security benefits.
5. Apply for derivative of benefits for the children if approved for social security benefits.

It is further ordered that you obtain and bring to the hearing the following:

1. A verified statement of your earnings for the past six (6) months.
2. Paycheck stubs for the past three (3) months.
3. A verified statement or copy of any benefits received under worker's compensation, unemployment insurance and social security for the past three (3) months.
4. A copy of your State and Federal Income Tax Returns and W2 or 1099 forms for the last three (3) years.
5. A verified statement or copy about any health care coverage that you now carry or which is available to you or your minor child(ren) through your employer or other group plan (such as through a union). You must bring the policy number, the name of the plan, and the cost of the plan.
6. Credit card statements in your name and any other joint owner and any business in which you may have an interest for the past six (6) months.

Notice: Your ability to pay is a crucial issue in the contempt hearing. A parenting/financial disclosure form is available at www.mncourts.gov. That form should be served and filed with the court before or at your contempt hearing.

Notice of time to respond: All responsive pleadings shall be served and mailed to or filed with the Court Administrator no later than seven (7) days prior to the scheduled hearing. The court may, in its discretion, disregard any responsive pleading served or filed with the Court Administrator less than seven (7) days prior to such hearing in ruling on the motion or matter in question.

Right to a lawyer: You have the right to a lawyer. If, in your opinion, you are financially unable to afford the services of a lawyer you can apply for a court appointed lawyer. To apply for a court appointed lawyer, contact the Court Administrator for an application. If you are at risk of being jailed for contempt, the court must appoint a lawyer to represent you upon application. If the court appoints a lawyer for you, you may be assessed a fee depending on your ability to pay.

If you fail to appear, a warrant for your arrest may be issued.
