# "A Century of Simon" Events Coming up in Brenham Returning due to public accolades, A Century of Simon History Exhibit will reopoen for a month again this fall. November 27th is the actual 100th anni-

versary of The Barnhill Center at Historic Simon Theatre (TBC) which opened in 1925.

The exhibit will reopen with an evening reception on Friday October 24, to run from 4pm to 7pm. While touring the displays, guests will enjoy light re-

freshments and period music by Jack Carr.

With the exhibit reopening, a new book will be available covering the same history found in the exhibit itself. The author of both, Sharon Brass, will be onsite to sign books and answer questions about the Simon, along with other Simon experts and researchers.

A live stage show with music from early Simon eras will be performed onstage Saturday October 25th by international Swing and Jazz star, Gunhild Carling. The exhibit can be toured before and after the show.

"The Saturday live concert will be an exciting grand finale for the Simon's birthday year." said Alexandra Dill, TBC Manager. "Gunhild Carling is the very best artist to bring back the magic of Roaring 20's music (and beyond) on the old Simon stage.

"The Simon's history is so fun, and so important to our community!" said author Sharon Brass. "Its saga is an almost impossible success story, having endured 100 years of challenges that most American downtown theaters didn't survive. It's amazing that this beauty is still serving our community today."

A Century of Simon Exhibit takes visitors on an interactive journey starting in 1881 when the Simon family entered the entertainment business, which led them to build and operate the elegant Simon Theatre.

Visitors see and hear fun and informative content, including samples of early vaudeville shows and movies that were shown – including "The Merry Widow," the first movie to be seen on the Simon screen.

The history includes the Simon's early vaudeville days, Hollywood's Golden Era, movies and events over the decades, and its eventual decline long after most other American downtown theaters closed.

Finally, the Simon's great revival story is told, which restored the magnificent building and the robust operation.

Personal stories, in written and video formats, are shared from locals who attended during all eras.

This is the last show in the retro series celebrating the 100th birthday of the Simon Theatre.

that early Simon era, and she expertly bridges the gap to today's more modern

arrangements. "Part musical extravaganza, part Vaudevillian spectacle, Gunhild's live performance is guaranteed to be one of the most feel-good, toe-tapping, exhilarat-

ing shows you'll ever see." Carling's style takes you back to the era of Louis Armstrong and Billie Holi-

day. Some of her vintage songs are Minnie the Moocher, Sweet Georgia Brown, All of Me, It Had to Be You – all within a larger repertoire of old favorites.

Winner of many worldwide awards, Carling plays over 10 instruments in a single show, and three trumpets at the same time. She is often featured with big bands, symphony orchestras, chamber orchestras, and as a diva vocalist with Postmodern Jukebox. She has over 70 million online followers.
