19th Annual Cops Cycling For Survivors Begins Sat., Sept. 5th

Saturday, September 5, 2020, ors Chief David Hewitt, Rising Sun Police Department, who gave the ultimate sacrifice on February 13, 2019 and Trooper Peter "Bo" Stephan, Indiana State sacrifice on October 11, 2019.

The Cops Cycling for Survivors Foundation, Inc. annual bike ride consists of active and retired police officers, law enforcement survivors, law enforcement family members and friends of law enforcement riding their bicycles to raise funds and awareness of the sacrifices made by Hoosier law enforcement families. Funds raised from this event are used to perpetuate the memories of officers killed in the line-of-duty and to aid surviving family members and co-workers of officers killed in the line-ofduty. Previously raised funds have been directly donated to foundations, scholarships, and camps started in memory of fallen officers or by Indiana survivors in honor of their fallen heroes. In addition, Project Blue Light at the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy has been supported.

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, this year's ride is significantly different than past years when cyclists rode nearly 1,000 miles over a 13-day period. On September 5th, Cops Cycling for Survivors will host a public bike ride at the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy, in Plainfield, Indiana. The opening ceremony with guest speaker Indiana State Police Superintendent Doug Carter will begin at 8:30 a.m. and French Lick Resort. riders will begin pedaling on the **Emergency Vehicle Operations** track immediately following.
