Aaron Martin, Attleboro

A senior leader for the Bombardiers, Martin excelled in the 300 meters this season. His personal best of 35.81 at the Hockomock League Championship earned him second place. He also secured strong finishes at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational (36.14) and MIAA Division 1 Championship (36.95). The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a key member of the 4x400 relay team, which won the league title and performed well at division, state and New England meets.

Camden Martin, Attleboro

The Bombardiers' standout junior had a remarkable season in both the mile and two-mile. Martin posted a personal best 4:37.60 in the mile at the MIAA Division 1 Championship, finishing 21st, and placed fourth at the Hockomock League Championship with a time of 4:38.37. In the two-mile, he set a PR of 10:30.06 during the dual meet season and was a valuable contributor on the 4x800 relay team.

Jaylen Outland, Attleboro

Outland made his mark in both the long jump and the 300 meters as a senior. He achieved a PR of 20 feet, 10.5 inches at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational, placing 13th. Martin jumped 20-5.5 at the Hockomock League Championship for third place. Outland further contributed in the 300 meters, posting a PR of 36.27, and helped the 4x400 relay team claim a league title and multiple high regional finishes.

Noah Williams, Attleboro

Williams had a stellar junior season in the shot put for the Bombardiers. His personal best of 55 feet, 5.25 inches at the MIAA Division 1 Championship earned him second place. Williams also took first at the Hockomock League Championship and posted a solid 53-11.5 at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational. He capped off his season with an eighth-place finish at the New Balance Nationals.

Matthew Shaw, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrocks' senior sprinter impressed in the 300 meters with a personal best of 36.04 at the MIAA Division 2 Championship for eighth place. Shaw, a multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, also claimed first at the MAC League Championship with a time of 36.48 and placed 11th at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational. As a member of the MAC runner-up 4x200 relay team, Shaw helped contribute to Bishop Feehan's success.

Timmy Chase, Foxboro

Chase turned in notable achievements in the mile, two-mile, and 1,000 meters for the Warriors. The versatile junior set a PR of 4:32.53 in the mile, claiming first place at the Hockomock League Championship. In the two-mile, Chase ran a PR of 10:24.93, and in the 1,000 meters, he posted a 2:51.07 at the MSTCA Boston Holiday Challenge. Chase was also instrumental in leading the 4x400 relay team to victory at the Mercury Indoor Games.

Eamonn Kelly, Foxboro

A key member of Foxboro's distance squad, Kelly showed significant growth in his junior season. His personal best in the 1,000 meters, 2:42.53, earned him fifth place at the MIAA Division 4 Championship. Kelly also ran a 4:46.79 PR in the mile at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational. He also ran for the 4x800 relay team at Nike Indoor Nationals, showcasing his versatility and strong contributions to the Warriors' success.

Nick Gallagher, King Philip

Gallagher made waves in the shot put, achieving a personal best of 52 feet, 7.5 inches at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational to place third. The Warriors' senior also had strong showings at the Hockomock League Championship, where he finished second, and the MIAA Division 2 Championship, placing fifth. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Gallagher's versatility also extended to the weight throw, where he logged a personal best of 50-7, rounding out a solid season for the senior.

Myles Brown, Mansfield

Brown was a key contributor for the Hornets, excelling in both the 55 dash and the 300 meters. The Mansfield senior posted a personal best of 6.64 in the 55 dash

at the MIAA Division 3 Championship, finishing fourth. Brown, a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, also set a 36.32 PR in the 300 meters during the dual meet season and helped the Hornets in the 4x200 relay as an essential part of the team's depth.

Joey Federline Jr., Mansfield

Federline had a strong season for the Hornets, excelling in the two-mile, mile and 1,000 meters. The junior's personal best in the two-mile was a 9:57.26 at the MIAA Division 3 Championship, where he finished sixth. Federline also ran a season best of 4:42.12 in the mile during the dual meet season. He was a consistent force in the distance events and helped the Hornets in several relays.

Marco Geminiani, Mansfield

A senior standout for the Hornets, Geminiani made his mark in the 600 meters. He set a PR of 1:24.39 at the MIAA Division 3 Championship, finishing fourth, and claimed the Hockomock League title with a 1:24.50 time. The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star also contributed as a member of the 4x800 relay team, which posted top-10 finishes at the league, division, state and New England meets before competing at New Balance Nationals.

Walter Stock, Mansfield

Stock impressed in both the 1,000 meters and as part of the 4x800 relay team for the Hornets. The sophomore's 2:38.82 PR in the 1,000 meters earned him second place at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational. Stock also placed first in the 1,000 meters at the Hockomock League Championship, contributing significantly to the Hornets' success. He logged personal bests in the mile and 600 meters.

Abraham Guir, North Attleboro

The Rocketeer runner had an impressive senior season in both the 55 dash and 300 meters. He set a personal best of 6.60 in the 55 dash, winning the Hockomock League Championship. Guir also ran a PR of 35.97 in the 300 meters to finish third at the league meet. He was a vital member of the 4x200 and 4x400 relay squads, contributing to the Rocketeers' strong performances.

Adam Ferriera, Norton

A key member of Norton's sprint and relay teams, Adam Ferriera showed great potential in the 55 dash and 55 hurdles. He posted a personal best of 6.65 in the 55 dash at the Tri-Valley League Championship to earn second place. Ferriera also finished sixth at the MIAA Division 4 championship and ran a PR of 9.11 in the 55 hurdles. Ferriera also contributed to the Lancers' 4x200 and sprint medley relay teams.

Sean Parham, Norton

ham came up big in the 600 meters, where he posted a personal best of 1:23.13 to win the Tri-Valley League title. Parham, two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, also competed in the 1,000 meters, posting a season-best mark of 2:43.94, and recorded a PR of 19 feet, 10.25 inches in the long jump.

Andrew Strojny, Norton

Strojny stood out in the high jump and long jump. The junior's 6-foot, 2-inch personal best in the high jump helped him secure multiple top finishes. He also logged a 6-0 leap to secure a second-place finish at the Tri-Valley League Championship. Strojny set a long jump PR of 21-3.25 and placed third at the MIAA Division 4 Championship (20-10.75).

Eddie Hindle, Seekonk

The Seekonk senior capped his Warriors' career with a strong season in the 55 hurdles and dash. Hindle set a personal best of 8.21 in the 55 hurdles at the MSTCA Winter Festival, claiming first place. Hindle also posted competitive times of 8.39 and 8.55 at the MSTCA Qualifier Meet. He ran a season-best time of 7.00 in the 55 dash and was an important member of the Warriors' 4x200 relay team.
