

The Girls Outdoor Track All-Stars

Keilona Kennedy-Latham, Attleboro

Kennedy-Latham was a multi-sport star for the Bombardiers for her work in the jumping events. The sophomore placed sixth in the long jump at the MIAA Division 1 Meet with a personal best of 17-9.75 and was ninth in the triple jump (33-9.5). Kennedy-Latham was 21st in the triple jump at the Meet of Champions. Throughout the season, the Hockomock League All-Star was a regular at the top of the leaderboard for the Bombardiers.

Michaela Poidomani, Bishop Feehan

Poidomani was strong for Bishop Feehan in her junior season, scoring in multiple events for the Shamrocks. At the Division 2 Meet, Poidomani took fourth in the triple jump, clearing 35-8. She also had multiple high jump wins, and wins in both the 200 meters and 100-meter hurdles through the spring.

Faith Bober, Foxboro

Bober was a key contributor in the hurdles, field events and the heptathlon for the Warriors. The senior had a ninth-place finish in the heptathlon at the MSTCA Multi-Championships. A Hockomock League All-Star, Bober was fifth in the 100 hurdles and ran the opening leg of Foxboro’s third-place 4x100 relay at the Hockomock League Meet. She also placed sixth in league competition in the shot put.

Lauren Bober, Foxboro

The Warriors’ senior sprinter shined in short distances and in the relays for Foxboro, placing third in the 100 (12.22) and fourth in the 200 (24.82) at the Meet of Champions. The Hockomock League All-Star leaves Foxboro as one of the program’s most decorated stars, owning school records in the 55 meters and 60 meters, along with the outdoor long jump school mark. Bober is second all-time among the Warriors’ top times in the 100, 200, 300 and 600 meters and ranks third in school history in the pentathlon. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star was a seven-time national qualifier in six events.

Lauren Share, Foxboro

Share was a junior sprinter and mid-distance runner for the Warriors, mainly competing in the 400 and 800 meters. Share took fourth in the 800 (2:19.75) and was ninth in the 400 with a season-best 59.50 at the Division 4 Meet. Share was third in the 800 in the Hockomock League Meet where she was also a major contributor in the relays, helping Foxboro to a third-place finish in the 4x100 and a fourth-place finish in the 4x400. Share was a Hockomock League All-Star.

Rory Bresson, King Philip

Bresson thrived in the field events, taking fifth in the high jump at the MIAA Division 3 Meet and fifth in the javelin. The Hockomock League All-Star was also fifth in the javelin at the league championships where she tied for fourth in the high jump. The standout Hockomock League All-Star also competed at the Meet of Champions,

finishing 10th in the high jump and eighth in the javelin to cap a strong senior campaign with the Warriors.

Alex D’Amadio, King Philip

D’Amadio was one of the most dominant multi-event athletes the area has ever seen in her senior season, breaking close to a dozen records that ranged from the 55-meter dash to the long jump. The Hockomock League Kelley-Rex Division MVP won multiple events, including the 400 (57.75) and the triple jump (36-10 ¼) at the Hockomock League Championships. At the Division 3 Meet, D’Amadio was second in the 100 and second in the long jump. The multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star led King Philip to an 11th-place finish at the Division 3 Meet and a second-place finish in the Hockomock League Championships.

Ava Quintin, King Philip

Despite only being a sophomore, Quintin was a strong hurdler for the Warriors, placing second in the 100 hurdles (16.27) at the Hockomock League Championships. She finished as one of the best hurdlers in the area, with her consistent ability to score for King Philip and established herself as a Warrior to watch as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Sarah Jones, Mansfield

Jones competed across multiple events for the Hornets as a sophomore, taking fifth in the mile at the Division 3 Meet in 5:16.37. Jones was also seventh 800 (2:21.11) at the Division 3 Meet and fifth in the mile (5:16.37). The Hockomock League All-Star ran the anchor leg of Mansfield’s fourth-place 4x800 meter relay team at the Division 3 Meet. At the Meet of Champions, Jones anchored the 4x800 relay to a finish of 20th.

Lily Roche, Mansfield

Roche posted a memorable senior season as a premier thrower for the Hornets. The Hockomock League All-Star placed third in the discus at the Meet of Champions with a heave of 124-8. She also took 22nd in the shot put at the Meet of Champions, throwing 30-11 ½. Prior to that, Roche was second in the discus (116-8) and sixth in the shot put (34-0) at the Division 3 Meet. At the Hockomock League Championships, she was third in the discus and eighth in the shot put.

Molly Galgoczy, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers’ perennial top distance runner, Galgoczy thrived once again in the mile and two-mile as a junior multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star following a strong indoor season. At the Division 3 Meet, Galgoczy took third in the two-mile with a time of 11:23.49. At the Hockomock League, she was sixth in the mile and in the Meet of Champions, took 17th in the two-mile (11:27.94).

Isabella Houghton, North Attleboro

Houghton competed in the javelin and the shot put for the Rocketeers. The sophomore was second in the shot put at the Hockomock League Championships and took third in the MIAA Division 3 Meet at 35-1 and seventh in the javelin (104-8). Houghton placed sixth in the the shot put at the Meet of Champions at 38-35 and seventh in the javelin at 114-7. At New Englands, she was eighth in the javelin to cap her standout season.
