THE GIRLS BASKETBALL ALL-STAR TEAM was selected with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Star grabbed 7.2 rebounds per game and was one of the best shot-blockers in the state, averaging 3.1 per game. Ruter was a key mismatch exploit for the Warriors down the stretch in their second consecutive state championship run.

Kailey Sullivan, Foxboro

A junior scorer who could pop for 20 points or more at any time, Sullivan's high IQ and end-to-end play fit well with Foxboro's system once again, making her a dominating force in blue and gold. Sullivan averaged 17.7 points, racking up 460 points through the season. A multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a Hockomock League All-Star, Sullivan hit from 3-point range 73 times and was a 73% free throw shooter, adding another layer to an already dangerous Foxboro lineup.

Madison Paschke, King Philip

Paschke stepped into the Warriors' role under the basket this season and shined, averaging 12 points and 10 rebounds in her senior season. A strong player who King Philip looked to often, Paschke was a controlling presence, both on offense and defense all season. The Hockomock League All-Star averaged two steals and a block per game as well, play ing a tough matchup with her strength and ability to drive and pass. Paschke will play college softball at Bowdoin College next spring.

A sharp-shooting guard who rises to the occasion whenever needed, Steel finished the year with 14.4 points per game and a 37% clip from 3-point range on 70 made shots. A multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Steel led the Shamrocks in scoring 11 times and averaged four rebounds and 1.3 steals per game as a player who typically was paired with the opponent's top player. Steel scored 369 points in her junior season, and elevated her career 3-pointers to 140.

Julia Webster, Bishop Feehan

Automatic from near the basket, shooting 68% from the field, Webster was a center-forward for the Shamrocks who reprised her role as one of the most important players on the court for Bishop Feehan. The senior averaged 14.6 points and six rebounds per game. She tied the single-game scoring high for Bishop Feehan in the Division 1 state semifinal with 34 points, averaging 23.4 points and 10 rebounds through the Shamrocks' state title run. Webster capped the season with 365 points to finish at 737 for her career.

rebounds, Latour averaged eight points and 8.1 rebounds per game as a senior, garnering South Coast Conference honorable mention status. Latour fractured her ankle during the vollevball season in the fall, but bounced back to be a central part of D-R's season, adding 14 steals and 17 blocked shots to her line in a Falcons uniform as a two-way forward.

Camryn Collins, Foxboro

Powerful, quick and smart, Collins has all the qualities of a high-level basketball player. The senior guard showed she can rebound as well as she can shoot, and helped bring Foxboro to the Division 3 state title. The Hockomock League MVP and league all-star scored 517 points, averaging 19.9 per game to finish with 1,296 career points. Collins, a multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, was a menace on defense, averaging 5.4 steals, 5.2 deflections and 6.3 rebounds per game. She was also efficient at distributing the ball, averaging 5.1 assists. Collins will go play NCAA Division 1 basketball at Rider College in the fall.

Addie Ruter, Foxboro

The tall, dominant junior center missed the early part of the season due to a knee injury, but Ruter finished strong, averaging 13.9 points to total 181 as a player who was back to full speed once the postseason hit. The multiple-time Sun Chronicle All-
