

The Girls Cross Country All-Stars

Rachel Akins, Bishop Feehan

The Sharmock senior capped her career with a strong showing in this season’s championship meets. Akins ran a personal best 19:56.40 at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational to take 15th place. She also placed seventh at the Catholic Central League Championship (20:24.00), 18th at the MIAA Division 1C Championship (20:09.70), and 63rd at the MIAA Meet of Champions (20:11.04). A three-season athlete, Akins closed out a steady campaign as one of Feehan’s most consistent seniors.

Quinn Kotch, Bishop Feehan

The freshman made a big impact in her debut high school season for the Shamrocks. Kotch posted a personal best 20:19.50 at the MIAA Division 1C Championship (22nd place) and placed 19th at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational (20:27.60). A Catholic Central League All-Star, Kotch finished ninth at the CCL Championship (20:40.00) and ran 20:34.77 for 88th at the MIAA Meet of Champions. She added a third-place 12:25.0 in the 3K at the Catholic Memorial Invitational, flashing potential across multiple distances.

Grace McGahan, Bishop Feehan

A junior three-season runner and two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, McGahan delivered a solid fall campaign. She ran a personal best 20:25 to take eighth place at the CCL Championship, placed 40th at the Catholic Memorial Invitational (20:37.6), and added a 21:05.00 at the MIAA Division 1C Championship (37th place). McGahan rounded out her postseason with a 20:56.90 at the Meet of Champions and was a Catholic Central League All-Star.

Ally Oram, Bishop Feehan

Oram is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star who wrapped up her Shamrocks career as a dependable senior leader. The Catholic Central League All-Star season-best 20:11.60 earned her 19th place at the MIAA Division 1C Championship. Oram had a sixth-place finish at the CCL Championship (20:14.00), clocked a 20:12.6 at the Catholic Memorial Invitational and ran 20:21.92 at the Meet of Champions (77th place).

Noelle Salwierz, Bishop Feehan

A junior and three-season competitor, Salwierz showed consistency through the postseason. She posted a personal best 20:18.00 to take 18th at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational, placed 10th at the CCL Championship (20:47.00), and ran a matching 20:47.3 at the Catholic Memorial Invitational. The Catholic Central League All-Star placed 29th at the MIAA Division 1C Championship and 124th at the Meet of

Sophie Shaw, Bishop Feehan

One of the region’s top junior distance runners, Shaw logged a standout campaign for the Shamrocks. She clocked an area-best 18:17.10 for second at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational and added runner-up honors at the CCL Championship (18:55.0). The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star placed sixth at the Division 1C Championship (19:12.0) and ran 19:04.16 at the Meet of Champions for 21st place. Shaw finished sixth at the Catholic Memorial Invitational (18:53.1), rounding out another stellar season as a three-season standout and a Catholic Central League All-Star.

Alyssa Daniels, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons freshman burst onto the scene as the South Coast Conference, winning a league title and turning in consistent postseason performances. Daniels won the SCC Championship with a personal best 19:52.8. She followed with a 20:22.5 for 27th at the MSTCA Twilight Meet and placed 12th at the Division 2C Championship (21:12.74). The SCC All-Star also raced to a 21:30.87 at the Meet of Champions and ran 12:02.2 in the 3K to place fourth at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational.

Emma Dorich, Foxboro

Dorich delivered a breakout junior season for the Warriors. She placed fourth at the MSTCA Twilight Meet with a personal best 19:38.5 and followed with a 20:06.1 for 26th at the Meet of Champions. She also placed 12th at the Hockomock League Meet (20:34) and 10th at the Division 2B Championship (21:15.6). Dorich added a fourth-place 11:34.3 in the 3K at the Frank Kelley Invitational. A Hockomock League All-Star and three-season runner, Dorich solidified herself among the area’s elite.



Ashley Cleverdon, King Philip

Cleverdon pieced together a strong junior campaign for the Warriors. She posted a personal best 20:09.4 at the Hockomock League Meet (7th place) and placed 31st at the MIAA Division 1B Championship (20:41.1). She also ran a 20:57.5 at the Meet of Champions and earned Hockomock League All-Star honors. A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Cleverdon also runs on the Warriors’ spring track and field team.

Riley DoRosario, King Philip

The senior Hockomock League All-Star led the way for the Warriors this fall. DoRosario won the MSTCA Twilight Meet with a personal best 19:58.3 and earned sixth place at the Hockomock League Meet (20:06.25). She added a 74th-place finish at the Division 1B Championship and ran 21:56.6 at the NXR Northeast & New York Regional. A three-season runner and league All-Star, DoRosario capped a consistent and competitive final year.

Ceecee Goodwin, Norton

Goodwin built on her success as a junior to become a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. She clocked a personal best 20:22.3 for 15th at the Tri-Valley League Championship and added a 20:24.2 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet (28th place). Goodwin placed 24th in the 3K at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational (21:08.1) and added a 19th-place 21:51.4 at the Division 2C Championship. The Tri-Valley League All-Star also competed at the Meet of Champions and contributes to the indoor track team.

Molly McIntyre, Norton

A senior leader for the Lancers, McIntyre turned in a superb campaign. The three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star posted a 19:12.4 personal best for 12th at the MSTCA Twilight Meet and placed sixth at the

Jaylyn Albano, Seekonk

Albano continued to shine as a sophomore, posting six quality postseason races. She ran a personal best 19:54.7 at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational (6th place), placed third at the South Coast Conference Championship (20:05.3), and logged a fifth-place 20:03.3 at the Twilight Meet. Albano added a 20:09.0 at the MSTCA Coaches Invitational (12th place), placed eighth at the Division 3A Championship (20:37.8), and finished 37th at the Meet of Champions (20:38.5). She is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and a South Coast Conference All-Star.
