

The Boys Cross Country All-Stars

Adrian Askew, Attleboro

The senior harrier capped his Bombardiers career with a personal best 17:09.6 at the Hockomock League Meet, placing 21st in a competitive field. He also clocked a 17:36.0 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet to finish 100th overall and placed 97th at the MIAA Division 1A Championship with an 18:07.6. Earlier in the season, he recorded a 10:38.1 personal best in the 3K at the MSTCA Frank Kelley Meet.

Owen Lacaille, Attleboro

A three-time Sun Chronicle and Hockomock League All-Star, Lacaille turned in one of the area's most consistent seasons as a junior, highlighted by his 16:27.4 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet (33rd place) and a 10th-place 16:33.3 finish at the Hockomock League Meet. He also clocked a 16:52.7 at the MIAA Division 1A Championship to place 39th and competed at the NXR Northeast & New York Regional (17:49.3).

Camden Martin, Attleboro

A reliable senior leader, Martin posted a 16:49.8 personal best at the MSTCA Twilight Meet (53rd place) and added a 16:52.7 at the MIAA Division 1A Championship (38th place). The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star also placed 19th at the Hockomock League Meet (17:03.0) and ran an 18:19.0 at the NXR Northeast and New York Regional.

Andrew Carchedi, Bishop Feehan

Carchedi was a junior three-season runner and repeat Sun Chronicle All-Star who led the Shamrocks with a 16:50.7 season best at the MIAA Division 1C Championship (23rd place). He also posted a 16:58.9 at the Catholic Memorial Invitational (4th place) and finished third at the Catholic Central League Championship (17:26.02) to be named a CCL All-Star.

Timmy Chase, Foxboro

Chase capped a strong final season as the Warriors' front-runner. The senior Hockomock League All-Star and two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star clocked a 16:24.5 personal best for 21st place at the MSTCA Twilight Meet and was the team's top finisher at the MIAA Meet of Champions (17:10.6, 42nd place). He also finished 15th at the MIAA Division 2B Championship (17:19.0) and placed 17th at the Hockomock League Meet (16:58.8).

Eamonn Kelly, Foxboro

The Warriors' senior three-season performer delivered steady results all spring. Kelly clocked a 16:54.2 season-best for 16th at the Hockomock League Meet, placed 36th at the MIAA Division 2B Championship (18:24.0), and logged a 17:49.2 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet. He also competed in the dual meet slate and provided veteran leadership as a Hockomock League All-Star.

Tommy Frazier, King Philip

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Frazier's top senior time came in a dual meet against Franklin (16:53.0), and he added a 17:00.0 at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational (25th place). He later ran a 17:31.9

at the MIAA Division 1B Championship and placed 34th at the Hockomock League Meet (17:37.7). Frazier, who was a Hockomock League All-Star, also competed at the MSTCA Twilight Meet, where he turned in a 17:34.1 to place 97th and cap a season of steady improvement.

Michael Joseph, King Philip

The junior Hockomock League All-Star was a reliable presence all season with a 16:40.9 personal best at the league meet (14th place) and a 16:54.3 for 33rd at the MIAA Division 1B Championship. He also clocked a 17:01.9 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet (63rd place) and helped lead the Warriors during the dual meet season with consistent performances.

Nikita Cherapukha, Mansfield

Despite only being a sophomore, Cherapukha emerged as one of the area's top underclassmen as a Hockomock League All-Star. He ran a 16:17.6 to place fourth at the Hockomock League Meet and followed it up with a 16:32.3 for ninth at the Bay State Invitational. He also placed 132nd at the MIAA Meet of Champions (17:32.7) and recorded a 9:34.8 in the 3K at the MSTCA Frank Kelley Invitational, good for second place.

Kieran Hoff, Mansfield

Hoff's senior campaign was anchored by a personal best 16:51.8 at the MSTCA Bay State Invitational (17th place). He also ran a 16:59.2 for 18th at the Hockomock League Meet and placed 50th at the MIAA Division 1C Championship (17:40.8). He capped his Hockomock League All-Star season with a 17:38.8 at the Meet of Champions.

THE BOYS CROSS COUNTRY ALL-STAR TEAM was selected with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Anthony Malakidis, North Attleboro

The Rocketeers' junior solidified his place as the area's top distance runner as a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. Malakidis clocked a 15:32.9 for second at the Hockomock League Meet and added a 15:58.3 for sixth at the MIAA Meet of Champions. His 15:40.0 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet earned him sixth place overall. The Hockomock League All-Star added a 16:09.6 for 31st place at the Brooks Northeast XC Championship.

Sean Parham, Norton

Parham is a three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and was again a model of consistency as a senior leader for the Lancers. The MVP of the Tri-Valley League, Parham posted a 16:35.7 at the MSTCA Twilight Meet (27th place), placed 14th at the Tri-Valley League Championship (16:58.7), and clocked a 17:09.5 for 41st place at the MIAA Meet of Champions. He also placed 67th at the Brooks Northeast XC Championship (17:08.4). He will run at Worcester State University next fall.
