

The Boys Lacrosse All-Stars

Chase Dreystadt, Bishop Feehan

“Chase was the best finisher on the team,” Shamrocks head coach Tom Sheerin said of the junior attackman. “When you needed a goal, Chase would be in the right place at the right time to get you one.” The three-sport athlete finished the season with 53 goals and 63 total points, netting his 100th career goal as part of a hat trick against Catholic Memorial in May.

Mikey Ferraro, Bishop Feehan

Although hindered in part by injuries, the junior attackman finished the season with 42 goals and 15 assists for the Shamrocks, with head coach Tom Sheerin calling him “a major producer on the team.” Ferraro has committed to play at Massachusetts Maritime Academy upon graduation next spring.

Adam Hertel, Bishop Feehan

The junior defenseman and UMass Amherst commit had nearly 30 forced turnovers on the season and rose to the challenge of containing the opposition’s best offensive players as the heart and soul of the Bishop Feehan defense.

Dexter Izzo, Bishop Feehan

The junior attackman/midfielder finished with 73 points on the season, scoring 42 goals and dishing out 31 assists while earning his second consecutive Sun Chronicle All-Star selection. “Dexter was the engine that ran the offense,” Shamrocks head coach Tom Sheerin said of the UMass Lowell commit. “If he wasn’t scoring, he was feeding.”

Keegan Masso, Bishop Feehan

The Shamrocks’ senior goalie and St. Anselm commit averaged 6.7 GAA for the season and held opponents to seven goals or fewer on 10 separate occasions. “Keegan was the backbone of our defense and kept us in many games throughout the season,” said head coach Tom Sheerin. Keegan is a two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star and part of a trio of Masso brothers who have come to define Bishop Feehan lacrosse in recent years.

Cullen Craffey, Dighton-Rehoboth

The Falcons’ senior capped the final season of his high school career with 29 goals, eight assists and 121 shots on goal.

Landon Lima, Dighton-Rehoboth

Lima appeared in 16 games during his senior season, scoring 30 goals to go along with 10 assists. He also led the team with 122 total shots on goal.

Bobby Hickox, Foxboro

A two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star, Hickox finished the season with an even 100 points on 65 goals and 35 assists as a sophomore attackman. “Bobby is arguably one of the most dangerous underclassmen in the area and our leading scorer,” Warriors head coach Jack Bugar said. “He brings an elite work ethic and a team-first mindset, consistently beating his man, excelling in transition, and creating offense both on and off the ball.”

Michael McCabe, Foxboro

The senior midfielder for the Warriors

finished with 39 goals and 23 assists for 62 points in his final season, including a goal and an assist in the postseason.

Brayden McKay, Foxboro

The Warriors’ junior was a game-changer in the face-off department, winning 237-of-332 contests during the regular season and 22-of-33 in the playoffs for an overall percentage of 71. “Brayden was our face-off specialist,” Foxboro head coach Jack Bugar said. “His consistency on the X gives our team valuable offensive possessions and extended time on attack.”

Finn Cunningham, King Philip

The senior goalkeeper finished his final season with 204 saves and 102 goals allowed for King Philip, giving him a save percentage of .667. With a total of 605 saves over the course of his career, Cunningham established himself as one of the premier shot-stoppers in the league. “His high level of play has kept KP in many games,” said Warrior head coach Hal Bean. Cunningham will attend Southern New Hampshire in the fall.

Maddock Henderson, King Philip

Henderson, a junior and Stony Brook University commit, amassed 85 points with

57 goals for the Warriors and 28 assists. “Maddock is a strong and forceful attackman who dodges well and can also shoot with great power,” said head coach Hal Bean. Henderson is a team captain-elect for next season.

Charles Parish, King Philip

The junior finished his season with 60 goals and 27 assists for 87 points, helping King Philip earn a share of the Kelly-Rex Division title He has been named one of the Warriors’ captains for the 2027 campaign. “Charles is a very talented and aware player who gets himself in the right place at the right time and shoots with power and accuracy,” King Philip head coach Hal Bean said.

Mason Thompson, King Philip

With 106 points on 56 goals and 50 assists in his senior season, Thompson became KP’s all-time points leader, amassing 323 points over his four-year career. “He plays a smart game of lacrosse and shoots with pinpoint accuracy,” Warriors coach Hal Bean said of the attacker and multi-time Sun Chronicle All-Star. “For four years, Mason has been a major part of the team’s success.” The Hockomock League All-Star is set to play at Post University in Waterbury, Conn., in the fall.

Our Selections

THE BOYS LACROSSE ALL-STAR TEAM was selected by staff writers with local coaches consulted for their recommendations.

Andrew Degirolamo, Mansfield

Degirolamo, who finished the regular season tied for the Hockomock League lead in scoring with teammate Cole Hogencamp, set career highs with 58 goals and 69 assists. The senior attacker and three-time Sun Chronicle All-Star finished his career as the program’s second all-time leading scorer and was a dominating force on the field for the Hornets en route to their first MIAA Division 2 finals appearance in school history. “Andrew has such a high lacrosse IQ and is one of the toughest players to come through the Mansfield program,” head coach Tim Frias said of the three-time league all-star and University of New Hampshire football commit. “(He) brought a toughness to the program and took pride with his other three attackmen for a tenacious ride and denying other team’s offenses the ball in transition.”

Thomas Donovan, Mansfield

The two-time Sun Chronicle All-Star capped his junior season with 53 goals and 42 assists for the Hornets, finishing in the top 10 in the league in scoring. “Thomas is a very consistent player with a high ability to finish around the crease,” Mansfield head coach Tim Frias said of the Hockomock League All-Star midfielder. “He was the quarterback on our man-up unit and provided a great tenacity when we were on the ride.” Donovan is an Assumption University commit.
